MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF YOUNGSTOWN STATE UNIVERSITY

Tod Administration Building Friday, March 27, 1992

Pursuant to Notice duly given, a Regular Meeting (the one hundred and fifty-second) of the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University convened at 3:00 P.M., Friday, March 27, 1992, in the Board Room in Tod Administration Building.

All nine Trustees were present at the meeting, to-wit: Dr. John F. Geletka, Chairperson of the Board, who presided, Dr. Earnest Perry, Mr. Michael I. Monus, Mrs. Elizabeth DeLuca, Mr. Martin J. O'Connell, Mr. Richard P. McLaughlin, Mr. Edward A. Flask, Mr. Mark E. Lyden, and Dr. Y. T. Chiu. Also present was Student Trustee Scott P. Smith. Student Trustee James Dull was absent.

Also present were Dr. Neil D. Humphrey, President; Dr. Sally M. Hotchkiss, Acting Provost; Dr. Lawrence E. Looby, Vice President - Institutional Advancement; Dr. Charles A. McBriarty, Vice President - Student Services; Ms. Shirley A. Carpenter, Executive Director of Personnel Services; Mr. Rocco Mediate, Acting Executive Director of Facilities; Mr. Richard L. Glunt, Executive Director of Finance; Mr. James D. Miller, Executive Director of Administrative Services; Dr. G. L. Mears, Executive Director of Budget and Institutional Studies; Mr. Dennis A. Clouse, Director of Classified Personnel; Mr. James E. McCollum, Assistant to the President for Legal Services; Atty. Alan R. Kretzer, Deputy Attorney General and University Legal Counsel, and Franklin S. Bennett, Jr., Secretary to the Board of Trustees. Also present were approximately 100 persons, including deans, members of the faculty, students, and members of the news media.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairperson.

ITEM I: PROOF OF NOTICE OF MEETING.

Evidence was available to establish that on February 28, 1992, the Secretary duly mailed Notice of the Meeting to each of the nine Trustees, the two student Trustees, and to the President. Copies of the Notice were also mailed to the Presidents of the YSU-OEA and YSU-ACE, to the Director of the YSU Alumni Association, and to Atty. Alan R. Kretzer, Deputy Attorney General and Legal Counsel to the University.

ITEM II: DISPOSITION OF MINUTES FOR MEETING HELD JANUARY 17, 1992.

Copies of the draft of the Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees held on January 17, 1992, had been mailed to each Trustee, the two Student Trustees, and to the President. Upon motion made by Dr. Perry, seconded by Mr. O'Connell, the Board unanimously adopted the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of January 17, 1992, as mailed.

ITEM III: INTRODUCTION OF PRESIDENT-DESIGNATE LESLIE H. COCHRAN.

Dr. Geletka introduced the newly-designated President of Youngstown State University, Dr. Leslie H. Cochran, who was seated in the audience along with his wife, Dr. Linda Cochran. Dr. Geletka welcomed the Cochrans to Youngstown State University and the community, and stated that the Cochrans would be available for a press conference following the Board meeting.

ITEM IV: RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY.

Dr. Humphrey recommended that one Resolution be adopted by the Trustees. After a motion made by Dr. Perry, seconded by Mr. Lyden, had received the unanimous vote of each Trustee present, the Chairperson declared the following Resolution duly adopted:

Resolution Accepting Gifts

YR 1992-44

WHEREAS, Resolution YR 1980-34 provides that the President shall compile a list of gifts to the University for each meeting of the Board of Trustees and present the list accompanied by his recommendation for action by the Board; and

WHEREAS, the President has reported that the gifts as listed in Exhibit A attached hereto are being held pending acceptance and he recommends their acceptance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby accept these gifts on behalf of Youngstown State University and instructs the President to acknowledge such acceptance to the donors and to express our gratitude for their generosity to the University.

ITEM V: REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY.

A. Staff Reports.

1. Dr. Hotchkiss, Acting Provost, reported on the following matters:

a. Ohio Board of Regents Action on Ed.D. Degree.

Dr. Hotchkiss read the Resolution adopted by the Ohio Board of Regents on March 13, 1992, permanently authorizing Youngstown State University to offer a degree program leading to the Ed.D. in Educational Leadership.

2. Dr. Mears, Executive Director of Budgets and Institutional Studies reported on the following matters:

a. State Budgetary Crisis.

Dr. Mears provided a summary of current information on the budgetary crisis confronted by the State of Ohio and the projected impact of the crisis on the University's FY 1992-93 budget. Present estimations place the state's budget deficit between \$576,000,000 and \$743,000,000. As the Constitution of the State of Ohio requires that the state budget be balanced, substantial reductions in state spending will be required. Dr. Mears reported that Governor George V. Voinovich has publicly stated that grades Kindergarten through Twelve will be held harmless from reduction in subsidies in the upcoming budget. Dr. Mears stated that given the Governor's position, and the fact that funding levels for most other significant budget areas are largely determined by law, the only large block of state funds available for budget reduction is the higher education subsidy.

If the state budget deficit were to be \$743,000,000, Dr. Mears stated that Youngstown State University's state subsidy would likely be reduced by approximately 23%, resulting in a loss of approximately \$9,800,000 from the current budget. In response to a question from Mr. O'Connell, Dr. Mears stated that the amount of the reduction in the state subsidy is not calculable at this point, and that there are no clear-cut indications when a definitive answer will be forthcoming. The administration will continue to monitor closely these matters.

ITEM VI - EXECUTIVE SESSION.

The Chairperson recognized Mr. McLaughlin who made the following motion:

I move that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University vote by roll call to hold an Executive Session

to consider the employment and/or compensation of one or more University employees.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Flask. Thereupon, the Chairperson requested the Secretary to conduct a roll call vote upon the motion, the results of which are as follows ("Yes" being in favor of the motion):

The motion having carried unanimously, the Trustees then adjourned to Executive Session in the Manchester Room at 3:15 P.M. for approximately forty minutes. Accompanying the Trustees into Executive Session were President Humphrey, President-designate Cochran, Dr. Hotchkiss, Dr. Mears, Atty. Kretzer, and the Secretary to the Board of Trustees.

During the Executive Session the Trustees considered matters pertaining to the budget crisis and the effects of same on the employment and compensation of University personnel. The Trustees adjourned from Executive Session at 3:55 P.M., and returned to the Board Room wherein the public meeting was resumed.

ITEM VII - REPORTS OF THE COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

1. Personnel Relations

Mr. Monus stated that the Personnel Relations Committee was recommending three Resolutions for adoption by the Board. Dr. Perry then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Ratify Faculty/Staff Appointments

YR 1992-45

WHEREAS, the <u>Policies of the Board of Trustees</u> direct the President to appoint such employees as are necessary to effectively carry out the operation of the University; and

WHEREAS, new appointments have been made subsequent to the January 17, 1992, meeting of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, such appointments are in accordance with the 1991-92 Budget and with the University policy on Equal Employment Opportunity;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby ratify and confirm the appointments as listed in Exhibit B attached hereto.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Lyden, and after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. Monus then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution Concerning Early Retirement Incentive Program Addendum

YR 1992-46

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University passed a resolution on January 17, 1992, extending the ERIP benefit to include three eligible faculty and staff who applied; and

WHEREAS, this action makes a total of 53 faculty and staff who applied and are eligible for STRS service retirement under ORC Sec. 3307.38, or who will become eligible for STRS service retirement under that section as a result of receiving additional service credit under the ERIP; and

WHEREAS, another faculty member did make application to participate in the ERIP in a timely manner, but was rejected on the basis of his seniority, and the combination of his length of service with the University and his age to meet the eligibility criteria; and

WHEREAS, this faculty member has presented to the University additional information and documentation, to which it did not have access, confirming that he does meet the requirements for retiring under an ERIP;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby approve and direct that the ERIP benefit for 1992 be extended to include one additional eligible faculty member; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be an addendum to the one passed on January 17, 1992.

The motion was seconded by Mrs. DeLuca, and after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Thereupon, Mr. Monus requested that Dr. Humphrey address the Board regarding the substance of the next recommended Resolution. The Chairperson then recognized Dr. Humphrey who addressed the Board stating that the current state budget crisis requires the University to position itself to meet a possible traumatic event. Although such an event is difficult to contemplate, a state subsidy reduction as large as 23% cannot be accommodated by the University without layoffs and program changes. Dr. Humphrey stated that the administration believes that the following three resolutions are necessary in order to maintain flexibility essential to considering alternatives in responding to the budget crisis. Dr. Humphrey stated that the resolutions are not intended to evoke a confrontation with any of the University's labor unions.

Mr. Monus then read and moved for adoption the following resolutions, which were read together as one Resolution:

Resolution Concerning Existing Union Agreements

YR 1992-47

WHEREAS, the information provided by the Chancellor of the Ohio Board of Regents, the Office of Budget and Management, and Legislative Budget Office all indicates that the appropriation for instructional subsidy of higher education for 1992-93 will be cut not less than nine percent and may be as drastic as twenty percent; and

WHEREAS, the extent of this reduction is not expected to be known until June and perhaps as late as November; and

WHEREAS, the severity of this potential revenue loss is so great as to devastate the University's ability to operate under existing union contracts and still provide the service to students which is the essence of the University's reason for existence; and

WHEREAS, the YSU-YSU/OEA Agreement for 1991--93, which expires September 25, 1993, provides that "On or before April 25, 1993, either party may notify the other that it wishes to renew or modify this Agreement."; and

WHEREAS, the YSU-YSU/ACE <u>Agreement</u> for 1991-93, which expires September 15, 1993, provides that "Either party may notify the other not later than 90 days prior to the expiration of this Agreement that it desires to terminate or modify the Agreement.";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby notify the Youngstown State University Chapter of the Ohio Education Association and the Youngstown State University Association of Classified Employees that it wishes to modify the existing Agreements and invites these unions to the bargaining table in mid-April.

Resolution Concerning Faculty Leaves

WHEREAS, the YSU-YSU/OEA Agreement provides for the granting of faculty improvement leaves (one academic quarter) and sabbatical leaves (three academic quarters); and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the current Agreement sixteen such leaves have been granted for the 1992-93 academic year; and

WHEREAS, the budget situation for 1992-93 is so restricted as to make it infeasible to grant such leaves and yet it is recognized that the <u>Agreement</u> calls for the leaves and there is a legal entitlement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby direct the University administration to take the necessary steps to request the sixteen faculty members who have received these leaves for 1992-93 to relinquish them voluntarily and remain at the University to teach in order that the anticipated severe cuts of the state subsidy may be accommodated.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees pledges that faculty members honoring this request shall, without further review, be granted the leave relinquished as soon as the budget improves sufficiently and the present emergency is past.

Resolution Concerning Retrenchment of Professional Staff

WHEREAS, there is a high probability of institutions of higher education in Ohio receiving a cut in the 1992-93 instructional subsidy of major proportions, perhaps as high as 23 percent according to Legislative Budget Office estimates received March 25 and verified March 26 by the Vice Chancellor of the Ohio Board of Regents; and

WHEREAS, this crisis must be dealt with in conformity with existing collectively bargained contracts which have different layoff and retrenchment provisions; and

WHEREAS, the current <u>Agreement</u> between YSU and the Youngstown State University Association of Professional/Administrative Staff requires in Article 9C, Retrenchment, that: "In the event of a reduction of work force involving full-time positions within the bargaining unit, the University will provide written notice to any individual who is to be retrenched no later than ninety (90) days prior to the expiration of his or her annual contract for employment."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University that the administration is directed to notify in writing not later than March 31, 1992, all full-time and part-time professional/administrative staff covered by the terms of the above referenced <u>Agreement</u> that they are to be retrenched as of midnight June 30, 1992.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees takes this action with the deepest of regret, recognizing that these are valued and productive employees of the University, and directs the administration to carefully review all positions affected and include a recommendation in the 1992-93 budget as to

which positions should be reinstated in the 1992-93 fiscal year.

The motion was seconded by Mr. McLaughlin, and after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

2. Building and Property

Mr. Flask stated that the Building and Property Committee had no report.

3. Budget and Finance Committee

Mr. O'Connell stated that the Budget and Finance Committee was recommending four Resolutions for adoption by the Board. He then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolutions Concerning Tuition and other Student Fees and Charges

YR 1992-48

WHEREAS, Ohio law provides that Boards of Trustees of state-assisted institutions of higher education shall supplement state subsidies by income from charges to students, including an "instructional fee" for educational and associated operational support of the institution, and a "general fee" for noninstructional services, and that these two fees shall encompass all charges for services assessed uniformly to all enrolled students and shall be identified as "tuition"; and

WHEREAS, the law also provides that each Board may establish special purpose fees, service charges, and fines and that a tuition surcharge shall be paid by all students who are not residents of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the current appropriation act for higher education, Amended Substitute House Bill 208, provides that the University shall separately identify the Instructional Fee, the General Fee, the Tuition Charge, and the Nonresident Tuition Surcharge.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State Univer-

sity does hereby declare the "tuition charge" shall be the sum of the Instructional Fee and the General Fee and does hereby establish the tuition and other fees included in Exhibit C to become effective Summer Term, 1992, except as specifically noted otherwise and to remain in effect until changed by the Board of Trustees; and

BE, IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the President of Youngstown State University or his designee shall have the authority to approve:

- fees of noncredit courses, institutes, and workshops offered or coordinated through the Department of Continuing Education;
- ticket prices for admission of the public to intercollegiate athletic games and to student music or dramatic productions;
- service charges for loans to students;
- 4. a special fee for 1) a "Mall Management Institute"; 2) International student training programs under contract; 3) an "Executive Sequence-Masters of Business Administration" program. It shall be understood that such special fees, if authorized, which shall provide for all related costs of the program and that the budget for such a program shall be subject to approval in the same manner as are other University operating budgets.

In all cases, the revenue generated by such fees and charges shall be expended in conformity with appropriately approved budgets. It shall be understood that: (a) prices of books and other items for sale in the Bookstore, Kilcawley Center, and through vending machines shall be established in conformity with good business practices by the managers of those units; (b) charges for unreturned or damaged equipment checked out to a student shall be established by the cognizant charge to cover processing costs; (c) for such charges as noted in (a) and (b) above, the

approval of neither the President nor the Board of Trustees shall be required; and (d) the President or his designees shall have the authority to designate parking facilities by location or by time which may be utilized either without charge or for a reduced charge.

Fines which are authorized in this resolution may be assessed against nonstudents who are authorized to use University services as well as against students; and, the rates detailed in this resolution shall replace the rates adopted in Resolution YR 1991-43 and in any other resolution in conflict, and it shall continue to be the policy of this Board to review and adopt all fees, service charges, and fines annually, usually in the winter, in order that students and others are informed as to rates for the coming year and budgets may be finalized.

It is understood that charges, fines, penalties, and assessments to students and non-students will not be waived except as specifically authorized by proper authority.

If a student is permitted to withdraw from the University or if a student reduces his or her academic load, a refund of the tuition (i.e., the instructional fee and the general fee), of the nonresident tuition surcharge, where applicable, shall be made in conformity with the following schedule; however, for those withdrawing from the university, the withdrawal fee shall be assessed if the withdrawal is within the time limits as prescribed below. If the withdrawal is after the prescribed time limits, all fees are forfeited but no withdrawal fee will be assessed. All applicable fees, fines and penalties due must be paid and the student identification card surrendered before the refund is paid.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Flask, and after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. O'Connell then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Amend the Forensics
Research Laboratory Budget

YR 1992-49

WHEREAS, the FY 1991-92 budget adopted by the Board of Trustees requires that all amendments to budgets be approved by the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, the Forensics Research Laboratory has a demonstrated need for limited service faculty and additional supplies; and

WHEREAS, sufficient resources are available within the Forensics Research Laboratory to support the additional expenditures.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees does hereby approve an increase of \$2,950 in the Forensics Research Laboratory budget as shown on the attached Exhibit D.

The motion was seconded by Mrs. DeLuca, and after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. O'Connell then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Adjust Housing Services Budget Fiscal Year 1992-92 .

YR 1992-50

WHEREAS, the Housing Services budget was prepared with an assumption of occupancy rates that were higher than have been realized; and

WHEREAS, the lower occupancy rates have resulted in significantly lower earned income than was projected; and

WHEREAS, expenditures have been significantly reduced but cannot be reduced sufficiently to offset the reduced income.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby approve the adjusted Housing Services budget as shown on the attached Exhibit E and does authorize and direct non-mandatory transfers to the Housing Services budget as follows:

- \$ 86,000 from the Housing Services Contingency Reserve
- \$ 44,000 from the Non-Instructional Services Contingency Reserve
- \$100,000 from the General Fee Unallocated Reserve

The motion was seconded by Mr. Flask, and after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

 $$\operatorname{Mr.}$ O'Connell then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution Concerning Records Management

YR 1992-51

WHEREAS, the General Assembly has, through the passage of amended Substitute House Bill 298, removed the records of state colleges and universities from the oversight of the Department of Administrative Services; and WHEREAS, the Inter-University Council of Ohio (IUC), through an Ad Hoc Committee on Records Retention has created a Records Retention for Public Colleges and Universities in Ohio Manual to provide guidelines for the minimum retention of records common to the colleges and universities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby adopt the Records Retention Schedules contained in that Manual, incorporated by reference herein, and directs the administration to create a Records Retention Committee with a representative from Student Data Services, Financial Services, and Internal Audit, and that this Committee, with the assistance of Legal Services in an ex-officio capacity, implement these new retention schedules by July 1, 1993; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that until implementation of the new retention schedules that the existing Records Retention Schedules remain in force, and that the new schedules may be modified from time to time as the Manual is updated by the IUC.
