Monday, December 21, 1992

Pursuant to notice duly given, a regular meeting (the one hundred and fifty-eighth) of the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University convened at 3:00 P.M., Monday, December 21, 1992, in the Board Room in Tod Administration Building. Originally called for Friday, December 18, 1992, the meeting was postponed with the unanimous consent of the Trustees due to YSU's participation in the NCAA Division I-AA National Championship Football Game on Saturday, December 19, 1992.

Eight Trustees were present at the meeting, to-wit: Mr. Mark E. Lyden, Chairperson of the Board, who presided, Dr. Earnest Perry, Mrs. Elizabeth DeLuca, Mr. Martin J. O'Connell, Mr. Richard P. McLaughlin, Mr. Edward A. Flask, Mr. Bruce R. Beeghly and Mrs. Eugenia Atkinson. Absent was Dr. Y. T. Chiu. Also present was Student Trustee Phillippe Sebastian.

Also present were: Dr. Leslie H. Cochran, President; Dr. Sally M. Hotchkiss, Acting Provost; Dr. Lawrence E. Looby, Vice President for Institutional Advancement; Dr. Charles A. McBriarty, Vice President - Student Services; Dr. G. L. Mears, Executive Director of Budget and Institutional Studies; Ms. Shirley A. Carpenter, Executive Director of Personnel Services; Mr. Rocco Mediate, Acting Executive Director of Facilities; Mr. Richard L. Glunt, Executive Director of Finance; Mr. James D. Miller, Executive Director of Administrative Services; Mr. Dennis A. Clouse, Director of Classified Personnel; Mr. James E. McCollum, Director - University Relations; and Franklin S. Bennett, Jr., Secretary to the Board of Trustees. Also present were approximately 55 persons, including deans, members of the faculty, students, and members of the news media.

The Chairperson called the meeting to order.

ITEM I: PROOF OF NOTICE OF MEETING.

Evidence was available to establish that on November 16, 1992, the Secretary mailed notice of the December 18, 1992, meeting date to each of the nine Trustees, the Student Trustee, and to the President. The Secretary also mailed copies of the notice to the presidents of the YSU-OEA, YSU-ACE, and YSU-APAS, to the Director of the YSU Alumni Association, and to Atty. Alan R. Kretzer, Deputy Attorney General and Legal Counsel to the University.

On December 14, 1992, the Secretary hand delivered notice of the December 21, 1992, revised meeting date to each of the nine Trustees, the Student Trustee, and to the President. The Secretary also mailed copies of the notice to the presidents of the YSU-OEA, YSU-ACE, and YSU-APAS, to the Director of the YSU Alumni Association, and to Atty. Alan R. Kretzer, Deputy Attorney General and Legal Counsel to the University.

ITEM II: DISPOSITION OF MINUTES FOR REGULAR MEETING HELD OCTOBER 2, 1992.

Prior to the meeting, the Secretary had mailed draft copies of the minutes of the Board's October 2, 1992, regular meeting to each Trustee, the Student Trustee, and to the President. Upon motion made by Mr. McLaughlin, seconded by Mr. Beeghly, the Board unanimously adopted the minutes of the Regular Meeting of October 2, 1992, as mailed.

ITEM III: RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY.

Dr. Cochran provided a report concerning gifts received by the University since the last regular meeting of the Board of Trustees. After a motion made by Dr. Perry, seconded by Mr. O'Connell, had received the unanimous vote of each Trustee present, the Chairperson declared the following Resolution duly adopted:

Resolution Accepting Gifts

YR 1993-15

WHEREAS, Resolution YR 1980-34 provides that the President shall compile a list of gifts to the University for each meeting of the Board of Trustees and present the list accompanied by his recommendation for action by the Board; and

WHEREAS, the President has reported that the gifts as listed in Exhibit A attached hereto are being held pending acceptance and he recommends their acceptance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby accept these gifts on behalf of Youngstown State University and instructs the President to acknowledge such acceptance to the donors and to express our gratitude for their generosity to the University.

Dr. Cochran reported that two senior administrative officials were attending their last Board meeting. Dr. Cochran

recognized Dr. Sally Hotchkiss, Associate Provost and Dean of Graduate Studies and requested that Mrs. DeLuca, Chairperson of the Academic Affairs Committee, read the Resolution of Appreciation prepared in honor of Dr. Hotchkiss. Thereupon, Mrs. DeLuca read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution of Appreciation

YR 1993-16

WHEREAS, Dr. Sally Hotchkiss began her career at Youngstown State University in 1968 as an Assistant Professor in the Psychology Department and was subsequently promoted to Associate Professor and later Professor; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Sally Hotchkiss was appointed Associate Provost and Dean of Graduate Studies in 1982 and continues to serve in that capacity, along with assuming the duties of Acting Provost since 1992; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Sally Hotchkiss has served this University for nearly a quarter of a century with distinction and care, devoting her time, talent, skills, and efforts to advance the best interests of the University, and its students, faculty and staff.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the members of the Board of Trustees express their sincere appreciation to Dr. Sally Hotchkiss for her dedicated service, and extend their best wishes to her upon her retirement, effective December 31, 1992.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be furnished to Dr. Sally Hotchkiss.

Dr. Perry seconded the motion. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Dr. Cochran then recognized Dr. Lawrence E. Looby, Vice President for Institutional Advancement, and requested that Mr. Beeghly, Chairperson of the Public Services Committee, read the Resolution of Appreciation prepared in honor of Dr. Looby. Thereupon, Mr. Beeghly read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution of Appreciation

YR 1993-17

WHEREAS, Dr. Lawrence E. Looby began his career at Youngstown State University in 1969 as Chairperson of the Department of Continuing Education, and has served the University in progressively responsible positions since that time as Special Assistant to the President, Associate Vice President - Public Services, and since 1984 as Vice President - Institutional Advancement; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Looby has provided effective leadership in the University's fundraising activities, in University Relations, and with the Public Service Institute and WYSU-FM, devoting his time, talent, skills, and efforts to advance the best interests of the University.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the members of the Board of Trustees express their sincere appreciation to Dr. Lawrence E. Looby for his more than twenty years of dedicated service to the University, and extend their best wishes to him upon his retirement, effective December 31, 1992.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be furnished to Dr. Looby.

The motion was seconded by Mrs. Atkinson. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Dr. Cochran then introduced Football Coach James Tressel, and senior football players Chris Vecchione and Nick Cochran. Dr. Cochran then requested that Dr. Perry, Chairperson of the Athletics Committee, read the Resolution of Appreciation prepared congratulating the 1992 Youngstown State University football team. Thereupon, Dr. Perry read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution of Appreciation

YR 1993-18

WHEREAS, the YSU football team achieved the ultimate honor of earning the 1991 Division I-

AA national championship by defeating Marshall University on Saturday, December 21, 1991 by a score of 25 to 17; and

WHEREAS, most preseason polls picked Marshall and YSU to finish in the top ten Division I-AA teams in 1992; and

WHEREAS, the Penguin football team dug deep within themselves and found ways to overcome injuries to starting players and to rebound from several losses; and

WHEREAS, the YSU football team enjoyed the strong support of the Penguin Club, the cheerleaders, the band, their loyal fans, and a President and his wife sporting a red fedora and red hat throughout the season; and

WHEREAS, the Penguins entered each round of this year's playoffs in many outsider's minds as underdogs, but who, never doubting their own abilities, eliminated Villanova, The Citadel, and Northern Iowa to earn the chance to repeat as Division I-AA national champions; and

WHEREAS, the Penguins had to travel to Marshall Stadium in Huntington, West Virginia, to play Marshall University on their home field; and

WHEREAS, during the 1992 Division I-AA football championship game the YSU football team fell behind by the score of 28-0, but always believing in themselves, individually and as a team, never gave up and fought back to tie the score near the end of the fourth quarter; and

WHEREAS, in spite of the fact that Marshall University kicked the winning field goal in the final seconds of the game, let us not forget that our football team finished the season as Division I-AA runner-up--finishing first in our hearts; demonstrating, in view of a national television audience, what is possible when a group of dedicated and cooperative human beings give selflessly of themselves to the same common goal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University

congratulates the entire YSU football family as runner-up for the Division I-AA Championship; noting for the record the credit and honor that attaches to the University because of their efforts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that individual copies of this Resolution be presented to Head Coach Jim Tressel, his coaching staff, and the players.

The motion was seconded by Mrs. Atkinson. Thereupon, Dr. Perry requested Mr. Tressel to briefly address the audience. Speaking on behalf of the YSU football family, Mr. Tressel stated that the proposed Resolution was most appreciated, and that those associated with the football program would continue their efforts to be positive representatives of the University. Thereafter, the motion received affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

ITEM IV: REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY.

Dr. Cochran provided the following informational reports:

1. Provost-designee. Dr. Cochran introduced Dr. James Scanlon, Provost-designee. Dr. Scanlon will become Provost effective January 1, 1993.

2. Acting Dean of Graduate Studies. Dr. Cochran reported that he had appointed Dr. Barbara Brothers, Professor and Chairperson of the Department of English, as Acting Dean of Graduate Studies. Dr. Brothers's appointment will be effective January 1, 1993, and continue until the position is filled.

3. Executive Director of University Development. Dr. Cochran reported that he had appointed Mr. Vern Snyder to the position of Executive Director of University Development, effective January 1, 1993. Dr. Cochran distributed copies of Mr. Snyder's curriculum vitae to the Trustees.

4. Director of Grants. Dr. Cochran reported that the search for a Director of Grants had been narrowed to three candidates. Dr. Cochran anticipates that an appointment to the position will be made in February of 1993.

5. Director of Governmental Relations. Dr. Cochran reported that the search for a Director of Governmental Relations had been narrowed to six candidates. When further narrowed, the candidates will be brought to campus for interviews.

The Personnel Relations Committee will be involved in the interview process.

6. Other search processes. Dr. Cochran reported that search processes will soon be underway for the Dean of Graduate Studies and the Dean of the College of Arts & Sciences. Dr. Cochran announced that Dr. Charles McBriarty will become a Special Advisor to the President, and that a new Vice President for Student Affairs should be in place by the beginning of the 1993-94 Academic Year.

7. Resignation of Student Trustee. Dr. Cochran reported that Mr. Scott Smith had submitted his resignation as a Student Trustee, which resignation has been forwarded to the Governor's office. Upon motion made by Mr. O'Connell, seconded by Mr. Flask, the Board unanimously accepted Mr. Smith's resignation.

8. Recruitment status. Dr. Cochran reported that YSU has distributed approximately 8,000 videotapes among area high school superintendents, principals, and to all high school students in western Pennsylvania and eastern Ohio who had achieved an ACT test score of 24 or greater. Dr. Cochran reported that while enrollment at most institutions is in decline, YSU's enrollment has been stable, and that the number of inquiries has increased.

9. University Scholars. Dr. Cochran reported that twenty-two high school students have accepted admittance to YSU as University Scholars for the 1993-94 Academic Year. Dr. Cochran stated that ten freshmen possessing ACT scores of 30 or higher had enrolled at YSU for the 1992-93 Academic Year. Dr. Cochran stated that he expects that at least forty freshmen possessing such scores will enroll at YSU for the 1993-94 Academic Year.

10. Recruiting Material. Dr. Cochran reported that the University has received several positive responses regarding recently updated recruiting materials. Dr. Cochran shared with the Trustees a complimentary letter regarding YSU's recruiting materials.

11. Administrative Reporting Channels. Dr. Cochran briefly discussed efforts toward revision of the University's administrative organizational structure.

12. Renaming of Colleges. Dr. Cochran briefly discussed matters pertaining to the renaming of colleges within the University as part of the reorganization effort.

13. "An Education Portfolio." Dr. Cochran distributed to the Trustees a document entitled "An Education Portfolio" containing an economic impact study of higher education in Ohio.

At the request of Dr. Cochran, Dr. Hotchkiss provided the following informational reports:

1. Honorary Degrees. Dr. Hotchkiss reported that the Academic Affairs Committee would present a Resolution authorizing the conferral of honorary degrees to Dr. George Ayers, Dr. Charles Ping, and Mr. Ray Travaglini.

2. Restructuring of Academic Areas. Dr. Hotchkiss reported that in culmination of a great deal of work performed by numerous members of the University academic community, the Academic Affairs Committee would present a Resolution authorizing and directing the restructuring of the University's academic areas.

3. Proposed Program in Physical Therapy. Dr. Hotchkiss reported that the President and she have authorized Dean Yemma to identify a consultant and develop a proposal for a baccalaureate program in Physical Therapy. Although the Ohio Board of Regents has imposed a moratorium on new programs, it is believed that future demand for such a program will be high, and that a framework for such a program should be developed at this time. The Board of Trustees will be kept fully informed regarding this proposed program.

4. Self-study Review of Graduate Programs. Dr. Hotchkiss reported that the Self-Study Subcommittee recently completed review of self-study reports submitted by the graduate programs in Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering, English, Secondary Education, and Special Education. The Subcommittee recommended that all five programs be continued for the standard five-year period, but that Electrical Engineering submit an interim report during Fall Quarter, 1995, indicating the progress made toward increasing the amount of faculty research and scholarship. The Graduate Council and the Acting Provost have ratified the Subcommittee's recommendations.

5. Investigation into Prison-related Instructional Programs. Dr. Hotchkiss reported that Dr. John Loch, Director, University Outreach, is investigating the feasibility of instructional opportunities presented by the newly-constructed and planned area state and federal prisons. Any future recommendations will be brought before the Board of Trustees.

ITEM V - REPORTS OF THE COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

1. Personnel Relations

Mr. Flask stated that the Personnel Relations Committee was recommending three Resolutions for adoption by the Board. Mr. Flask then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Ratify Faculty/Staff Appointments

YR 1993-19

WHEREAS, the Policies of the Board of Trustees direct the President to appoint such employees as are necessary to effectively carry out the operation of the University; and

WHEREAS, new appointments have been made subsequent to the October 2, 1992 meeting of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, such appointments are in accordance with the 1992-93 Budget and with the University policy on Equal Employment Opportunity;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby ratify and confirm the appointments as listed in Exhibit B attached hereto.

The motion was seconded by Mrs. Atkinson. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. Flask then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution Concerning the
University Administrative Structure

YR 1993-20

WHEREAS, the FY 1992-93 budget adopted by the Board of Trustees requires that changes in positions reporting to the President shall require the approval of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, the President has proposed a reorganization of positions reporting to the President; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Relations has assumed significant duties formerly performed by the Vice President for Institutional Advancement; and

WHEREAS, the proposed reorganization has been reviewed by the Administrative Advisory Coun-

cil and the University community has had opportunities to offer recommendations and counsel.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does authorize a change of title from the Director of Public Relations to Executive Director of University Relations; and

BE, IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby approve the organizational chart as shown on the attached Exhibit C to be effective immediately.

The motion was seconded by Mr. O'Connell. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

2. Building and Property

Mr. McLaughlin stated that the Building and Property Committee was recommending two Resolutions for adoption by the Board. Mr. McLaughlin then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution Concerning Campus 2000

YR 1993-21

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has previously authorized the President to engage in a review of campus planning documents and to prepare a revised campus facilities statement; and

WHEREAS, a broad based joint campus/community committee (Campus 2000 Task Force) has considered the future facilities design of the University and the immediate surrounding community; and

WHEREAS, the Campus 2000 Task Force has reached consensus on a vision statement to guide future development of the campus and the surrounding community;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby approve the Campus 2000 vision

statement attached hereto as Exhibit D as the guiding principles for campus physical development; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does authorize the development of a model embodying the principles of the Campus 2000 vision statement.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Beeghly. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. McLaughlin then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Amend Physical Priorities List

YR 1993-22

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees adopted Resolution YR 1991-54 to establish the priority for the development of physical facilities; and

WHEREAS, a review of enrollment growth and facilities needs has indicated a pressing need for a change in the priorities for physical facilities; and

WHEREAS, it is expected that the Ohio General Assembly will concur in a request for a change in priorities.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby change the priorities for the development of physical facilities by substituting the construction of a College of Education Building for the improvements to Beeghly Center and Bliss Hall, subject to enactment by the General Assembly and approval by the Governor.

The motion was seconded by Mr. O'Connell. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

3. Budget and Finance Committee

Mr. O'Connell stated that the Budget and Finance Committee was recommending one Resolution for adoption by the Board. He then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Authorize the Establishment of Clerical Positions

YR 1993-23

WHEREAS, the FY 1992-93 budget Resolution adopted by the Board of Trustees provides that absolute position control shall be in effect; and

WHEREAS, the reorganization of various departments of the University has resulted in the need for additional clerical positions.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize the establishment of one FTE clerical position in the Department of Social Work and one FTE clerical position in the Office of the President; and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize the transfer of \$16,720 from the Unallocated Reserve, Educational and Associated Operations (Fund One) as follows :

\$16,720 to the Department of Social Work for compensation expenses.

The motion was seconded by Mr. McLaughlin. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

4. Academic Affairs

Mrs. DeLuca reported that the Academic Affairs Committee was recommending two Resolutions for adoption by the Board. She then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Authorize Conferral of Honorary Degrees

YR 1993-24

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize the conferral of a Doctor of Humane Letters (L.H.D.) degree, honoris causa, upon Dr. George Ayers (Winter), Dr. Charles Ping (Spring), and Mr. Ray Travaglini (Summer), with all the rights and privileges attendant thereto.

The motion was seconded by Mrs. Atkinson. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mrs. DeLuca then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Authorize Restructuring of the Academic Area

YR 1993-25

WHEREAS, the names of the schools and colleges of Youngstown State University are subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, the reorganization of the instructional division of the University has made it desirable to change the names of certain schools and colleges.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby approve the following names of schools and colleges to be effective January 1, 1993:

College of Arts & Sciences

Warren P. Williamson
College of Business Administration

College of Education

William Rayen
College of Engineering & Technology

College of Fine & Performing Arts

College of Health & Human Services

School of Graduate Studies

The motion was seconded by Dr. Perry. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

5. Student Services

Dr. Chiu stated that the Student Services Committee had no report.

6. Public Services

Mr. Beeghly stated that the Public Services Committee had no report.

7. Athletics Committee

Dr. Perry stated that the Athletics Committee had no report.

8. Executive Committee

Mr. Lyden stated that the Executive Committee had no report.

9. Nominating Committee

Mr. Lyden stated that the Nominating Committee had no report.

ITEM VI - COMMUNICATIONS, MEMORIALS

There were no communications or memorials.

ITEM VII - UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no unfinished business considered by the Board.

ITEM VIII - NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business considered by the Board.

ITEM IX - TIME AND PLACE OF NEXT REGULAR MEETING

Upon motion made by Mrs. DeLuca, seconded by Mr. Flask, which received the affirmative vote of each Trustee present, the Chairperson declared the following Resolution adopted:

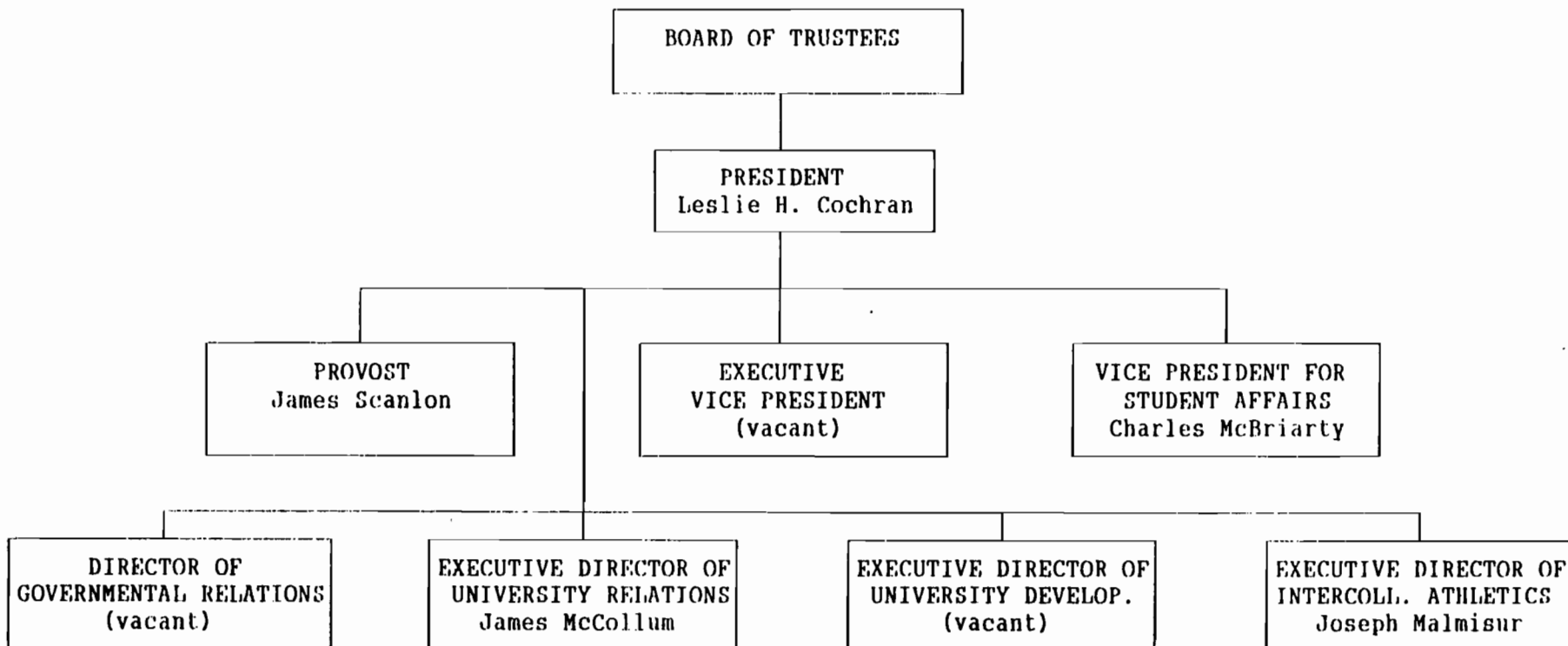

Concepts, Ideas, and Suggestions to Shape the Future

December 1, 1992

The University of the future must be a dynamic, interactive force in the community it serves. The full realization of this ideal suggests that the University must do more than simply respond to local needs or concerns. To be a dynamic institution, the University must stimulate change and provide leadership that moves the community forward in a positive, constructive manner. The implementation of this ideal requires more than bringing research capabilities to bear on community problems, extending services to individuals and groups in the community, and interfacing academic programs with those being served.

The University campus itself must be viewed as an integral part of the Community. Within this context, the YSU campus cannot be conceived nor projected as an "intellectual island" within the surrounding area. This perception is prevalent among many individuals, particularly those who live outside the immediate campus area. If YSU is to effectively achieve some of its enrollment goals and enhance the quality of its living/learning environment, specific action needs to be taken.

The needed actions are complex and long term. History suggests that mutual goals cannot be achieved by following the urban renewal models of the past. As good corporate citizens, the University and community groups must work together to enhance the quality of life in the areas of mutual interest. Through such efforts, the University should foster the development of economically stable areas, safe environments, quality neighborhoods, and partnerships that promote ongoing dialogue. The overall goals should be to create ongoing processes that promote community interaction, and that foster the use of national, state, local, and private resources to address identified concerns. This sense of community can only be achieved through an evolutionary process that builds good will, trust, and confidence. While differences of opinions may arise, they can best be resolved if there is a pattern of respect and cooperation.

The expanded citizenship role of the University is predicated on two underlying concepts. First, over the years YSU has developed a pedestrian-oriented campus that has produced a desirable learning environment. An extension of this design concept within the campus boundaries and possibly to immediately adjacent areas could expand the visual beauty of the campus and its park-like atmosphere. Second, University efforts to work with neighborhood citizens could be used to create an extended campus concept thereby producing an interactive environment that extends beyond the current boundaries of the campus. The combination of these two

concepts forms the basis for the goals of Campus 2000 to:

- Create an ongoing process that promotes interaction and dialogue between the University and its neighborhood citizens.
- Explore the feasibility of producing a unified set of assumptions that fosters the extension of the pedestrian campus in areas of Elm Street, Spring and Lincoln Avenues.
- Establish a readily accessible University Visitors Center.
- Create a common set of assumptions regarding the future planning interests of the campus, with a particular focus on the long range location of academic buildings, parking areas, recreational sites, and student housing.
- Encourage the development of campus-community partnerships that foster the:
 - Development of a more secure living and investment environment in the areas adjacent to campus.
 - Improvement of properties that do not contribute to a positive neighborhood environment.
- Promote development in the areas immediately adjacent to the campus and serve as a catalyst for private commercial development by:
 - Encouraging the development of campus enterprise zones composed of restaurants, boutiques, and shops that cater to students.
 - Encouraging the construction of off-campus student housing, affordable family housing, and retirement housing in areas surrounding the campus.

The challenge of how to achieve these goals rests with the commitment of the individuals in the area, the capability of the city to assist in the shared goals, and the leadership of the University to serve as a catalyst for the process. All elements of this

triad must work together sharing openly their concerns, commitments, resources, and visions. Through this ongoing process the goals of Campus 2000 can be achieved.

As an initial step in the effort, the University should:

- Cooperate with the City in developing police mutual aid coverage in an expanded manner to the area surrounding the campus.
- Move toward the extension of its pedestrian campus within campus boundaries.
- Encourage the formation of campus-community neighborhood partnerships to enhance the living environment of the area surrounding campus.
- Form a Campus Community Council to create an interactive process so the goals of Campus 2000 can be achieved in the most positive manner possible.
