Call to Order: Senate Chairperson Chet Cooper called the meeting to order at 4:05 p.m.

### **Minutes of the Previous Meeting:**

#### Report from Dr. Thomas Maraffa, Senior Assistant to the President

Dr. Maraffa presented a summary of budget development activities for the FY 2010 budget. The presentation is contained in Attachment 1.

Remarks from Dr. Shearle Furnish, Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences:

First, I would like to mention two new degree programs in CLASS as of Fall 2009.

a. Undergraduate program in Gerontology. It will span elements of 3 colleges: CLASS, HHS, and STEM, including ten programs. The need for this degree is considerable. The Mahoning Valley and Western Pennsylvania are, like much of Ohio, aging populations. There could be around 900 jobs related to this opening up in coming years just in the Mahoning Valley area.

b. Graduate program (M.S.) in Applied Behavioral Analysis. The need here is also great in such areas as treating developmental disabilities, senior citizen care, occupational safety and health, and others. There are significant occupational opportunities in these areas as well. We will welcome a new faculty member in the Fall who is a board certified behavior analyst.

Both of these are unusual, in the best sense, within a college of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences.

Also, the Ohio Historical Society is in need of partnership. Our Department of History has reached out to assist them. Two history graduate assistantships are now working in the area.

Finally, International Studies is an emerging emphasis nationwide, and we will be hosting three international scholars and will be sending two abroad to participate in collaboration in other countries.

#### Senate Executive Committee (SEC) / Report from the Chair: Chet Cooper, Chair of the Senate, reported:

Senate Secretary Bob Hogue will soon electronically distribute a Committee Preference Survey for next year. He asks faculty members seeking to serve on various Senate committees to complete the survey by April 17th.

The last Penguin Pride Event, formerly known as Civility Hour, will be held at 4:00 PM on Friday, April 24th. On behalf of the Senate, I wish to thank the YSU-OEA for sponsoring this event. All members of the University community are welcome to attend.

Dr. Sharon Stringer, Director of Assessment, is organizing a round table meeting of various constituents of the University community who are involved in activities related to assessment. The round table will be held during finals week. Please contact Dr. Stringer if you have questions or need further information.

Dean Licata is organizing a Service Learning and Engagement round table to be held on April 17th. She is seeking participants from various colleges and other units of the University who utilize engagement in their curriculum or other academic endeavors. If you have any questions or interest in this round table, please contact Dr. Licata.

A number of Senate committees have yet to submit a report for the current academic year. Committee chairs are encouraged to submit a report for next month's meeting of Senate. Please contact Secretary Hogue for further information.

#### **Ohio Faculty Council Report: Chet Cooper presented the following report:**

Most of pertinent discussion held at the last Ohio Faculty Council concerned the fiscal state of Ohio's institutions of higher education. The representatives of all those institutions in attendance related tales of current and anticipated financial woes. Virtually all reported upon the Draconian-like measures being taken to help address their present, as well as future, financial challenges. Imagine my pride when it was my turn to report, at the time, that YSU's current budget was within 0.2% of being balanced and our University is committed to addressing future budgetary challenges without harming the academic enterprise. I don't believe I was well liked at that moment.

In addition, representatives of Ohio State, Cincinnati, Wright State, and Ohio University shared their respective institution's plans for changing from quarters to semesters. The plans varied among the schools and some noted looming apprehension. Of course, after my previous report, I kept my lips sealed, but secretly smiled knowing that we at YSU had addressed this issue during better economic times.

Finally, as I noted at last month's meeting, Dr. Tammy King has been nominated to be the next Vice Chair of the Ohio Faculty Council. The vote will be taken next Friday and I hope to report good news in this regard at next month's Senate meeting.

General Education Committee: An informational report of approved courses is contained in Attachment 2.

Ad Hoc Committee on Sustainability: Martin Abraham reported on the committees activities and a draft resolution that had been sent to Senate members for consideration. A presentation on the committee's work is contained in <a href="Attachment 3">Attachment 3</a>. A final version of a resolution will be brought to the Academic Senate at the May meeting.

#### **New Business:**

Shanna Kelly moved that the Academic Senate approve the following resolution from Student Government Association on a First-year Experience for YSU students:

#### RESOLUTION

To recommend the creation of an Academic Senate ad hoc committee to further research and develop the First-Year Experience

Whereas A First-Year Experience program is proven to be beneficial to students in that it increases retention rates, promotes campus leadership, and generates an overall positive campus atmosphere; and

Whereas The above mentioned is vital to the Youngstown State University community and its betterment; and,

Whereas The Academic Senate is the standing authority on all academic matters: Now, Therefore, Be It

Resolved, That the Academic Senate establish an ad hoc committee for the purpose of addressing the topic of a First-Year Experience program; and Be It Further

Resolved, That the committee's membership be open to all Members of the Academic Senate and Student Government Association; and Be It Further

Resolved, That concerned or appropriate individuals from the campus or community shall be encouraged, by the Executive Committees of Academic Senate and the Student Government Association, to be members of the ad hoc committee; and Be It Further

**Resolved,** That the ad hoc committee uses the research and proposal already completed by Student Government Association as its foundation; and Be It Further

 $\it Resolved$ , That the ad hoc committee publish a report to the Academic Senate no later than the end of Fall 2009 semester.
