### Problems

- "Solved if stated correctly"
- It is my philosophy that a properly stated problem is a problem solved. The adequate statement must contain an inventory of all the resources available and all the variable parameters uniquely involved. The solutions are inherent in such adequacy of statement.

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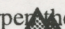



### Stephen Covey

- Identifies common problems of individuals, families, organizations
  - Suggests 7 behaviors that will help solve most problems
  - “The Seven Habits of Highly Effective People”
- 





### Covey’s “Seven Habits of Effective People”

- Be proactive
  - Begin with the end in mind
  - Put first things first
  - Think win-win
  - Listen first to understand, then to be understood
  - Synergize
  - Sharpen the saw
- 





### Problem-solving Approach

- List problems, before and after conditions
  - Rephrase problem as a behavior: who does what
    - Use Contingency Diagram and Job Aid
  - Identify consequences
  - Monitor and chart behavior
-
