MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF YOUNGSTOWN STATE UNIVERSITY

Tod Administration Building Friday, September 17, 1993

Pursuant to notice duly given, a regular meeting (the one hundred and sixty-first) of the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University convened at 3:30 P.M., Friday, September 17, 1993, in the Board Room in Tod Administration Building.

Eight Trustees were present at the meeting, to-wit: Mr. Mark E. Lyden, Chairperson of the Board, who presided, Elizabeth C. DeLuca, Martin J. O'Connell, Mr. Richard P. McLaughlin, Mr. Edward A. Flask, Dr. Y. T. Chiu, Bruce R. Beeghly, Mrs. Eugenia C. Atkinson, and Mr. George J. Limbert. Absent was Dr. Y. T. Chiu. Also present were Student Trustees Phillippe Sebastian and Scott Schulick.

Also present were: Dr. Leslie H. Cochran, President; Dr. James J. Scanlon, Provost; Dr. Charles A. McBriarty, Vice President - Student Services; Dr. G. L. Mears, Executive Vice President; Ms. Shirley A. Carpenter, Executive Director - Personnel Mr. Joseph Malmisur, Executive Director - Intercol-Services; Mr. James McCollum, Executive Director legiate Athletics; University Relations; Mr. James D. Miller, Executive Director -Administrative Services; Mr. Vern Snyder, Executive Director -University Development; Mr. Alan R. Kretzer, University Legal Counsel and Deputy Attorney General, and Franklin S. Bennett, Jr., Secretary to the Board of Trustees. Also present were approximately 50 persons, including deans, members of the faculty, students, and members of the news media.

The Chairperson called the meeting to order.

ITEM I - PROOF OF NOTICE OF MEETING.

Evidence was available to establish that on September 2, 1993, the Secretary mailed notice of the original meeting date of September 24, 1993, to each of the nine Trustees, the two Student Trustees, and to the President. The Secretary also mailed copies of the notice to the presidents of the YSU-OEA, YSU-ACE, and YSU-APAS, to the Director of the YSU Alumni Association, and to Atty. Alan R. Kretzer, Deputy Attorney General and Legal Counsel to the University. The Secretary stated that today's meeting had been rescheduled to September 17, 1993, with the unanimous consent of the Trustees.

<u>ITEM II - DISPOSITION OF MINUTES FOR REGULAR MEETING HELD JUNE 25, 1993.</u>

Prior to the meeting, the Secretary had mailed draft copies of the minutes of the Board's regular meeting held on June 25, 1993, to each Trustee, the Student Trustees, and to the President. Upon motion made by Mrs. DeLuca, seconded by Mr. O'Connell, the Board unanimously adopted the minutes of the Regular Meeting of June 25, 1993, as mailed.

ITEM III - REPORT THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY.

Dr. Cochran provided the following informational reports:

- 1. <u>Distribution Profile of University Scholars.</u>
 Dr. Cochran distributed to each Trustee a map indicating the hometowns of the 40 University Scholars (A copy of the map follows these minutes).
- 2. "YOUNGSTOWN STATE TODAY". Dr. Cochran distributed to each Trustee a copy of the Fall 1993 edition of "YOUNGSTOWN STATE TODAY," alumni news magazine.
- 3. <u>125th Anniversary of the Dana School of Music.</u> Dr. Cochran reported briefly on the plans for celebration of the 125th anniversary of the Dana School of Music.
- 4. Agreement with Leningrad Forest Technical Academy. Dr. Cochran reported that an agreement had been signed that morning with Leningrad Forest Technical Academy in St. Petersburg, Russia for a 5-year exchange program involving students and faculty.
- 5. <u>Fall Enrollment</u>. Dr. Cochran provided a report on the status of Fall enrollment statistics. With opening of Fall Quarter still a week away, the administration continues to be optimistic about enrollment. Dr. Cochran noted that the number of 18-year-olds graduating from high school this year is the lowest in Ohio since 1980. Enrollment projections indicate that new student enrollments will be up from 30 to 50 students.

Dr. Cochran stated that the quality of the entering class has improved considerably. YSU has 51 first year students enrolled with 30+ ACT test scores (representing the national top 2% of test-takers), compared to 10 at this time last year. Dr. Cochran stated that entering students with an ACT of 26+ (representing the top 20%) is up 60% from last year.

6. <u>Campus 2000.</u> Dr. Cochran invited the Trustees to the outer lobby to view the newly-completed model of Campus 2000. Dr. Cochran and the Trustees spent approximately 20 minutes

viewing the model while Dr. Cochran described various short- and long-range concepts of campus development.

ITEM IV - REPORTS OF THE COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

Upon returning to the Board Room, the Board considered the following committee reports and recommendations:

1. Personnel Relations

The Chairperson recognized Mr. Beeghly, substituting for committee chairperson Y. T. Chiu, who stated that the Personnel Relations Committee was recommending four Resolutions for adoption by the Board. Mr. Beeghly then moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Ratify YSU-ACE Contract

YR 1994-01

WHEREAS, the tentative Agreement for 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96 between Youngstown State University and the Youngstown State University Association of Classified Employees, an affiliate of the National Education Association and the Ohio Education Association, has been negotiated within parameters established by the Personnel Relations Committee of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, the tentative <u>Agreement</u> has been reviewed by the Personnel Relations Committee and verified as being within the prescribed parameters and within the adopted 1993-94 operating budget of the University;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University that the tentative <u>Agreement</u> between Youngstown State University and the Youngstown State University Association of Classified Employees, for the period September 16, 1993 through September 15, 1996, is hereby ratified.

The motion was seconded by Mrs. Atkinson. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. Beeghly then moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Ratify YSU-OEA Contract

YR 1994-02

WHEREAS, the tentative <u>Agreement</u> for 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96 between Youngstown State University and the Youngstown State University Ohio Education Association, an affiliate of the National Education Association and the Ohio Education Association, has been negotiated; and

WHEREAS, Article III, Section 20 of the <u>Policies of the Board of Trustees</u>, authorizes the President of the University to pursue the development of Salary Plans for all University employee groups that provide for comparable pay; and

WHEREAS, the tentative <u>Agreement</u> is guided by this Policy and has been reviewed by the Personnel Relations Committee, and is within other prescribed parameters;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University that the tentative <u>Agreement</u> between Youngstown State University and the Youngstown State University Ohio Education Association for the period September 26, 1993 through September 25, 1996 is hereby ratified.

The motion was seconded by Mr. O'Connell. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. Beeghly then moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution Concerning Compensation for Classified Employees Excluded from Collective Bargaining

YR 1994-03

WHEREAS, the University ratified a collective bargaining Agreement with the Youngstown State University Association of Classified Employees (YSU-ACE) for the three-year period September 16, 1993 through September 15, 1996, which defines wages, personal leave, family medical

leave and insurance for classified employees in the bargaining unit; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code 3345.31, as amended, authorizes state-assisted universities to establish compensation plans for classified employees who are not eligible to participate in collective bargaining; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be equitable and in the best interest of the University to extend these same wage, leave and insurance provisions to classified employees excluded from collective bargaining;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University that pay increases specified in Article 3 of the <u>Agreement</u> be extended to all classified employees excluded from collective bargaining, except for University Law Enforcement Officers in the YSU Police Department; commencing September 16, 1993 and ending September 15, 1994;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the personal leave benefits provisions of Article 15.19 and the insurance provisions of Article 22 be extended to permanent classified employees excluded from collective bargaining and the family medical leave provisions of Article 15 be extended to all excluded classified employees, effective September 16, 1993.

The motion was seconded by Mrs. DeLuca. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. Beeghly then moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Ratify Faculty/Staff Appointments

YR 1994-04

WHEREAS, the <u>Policies of the Board of Trustees</u> direct the President to appoint such employees as are necessary to effectively carry out the operation of the University; and

WHEREAS, new appointments have been made subsequent to the June 25, 1993 meeting of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, such appointments are in accordance with the 1993-94 Budget and with the University policy on Equal Employment Opportunity;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby ratify and confirm the appointments as listed in Exhibit A attached hereto.

The motion was seconded by Mrs. Atkinson. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

2. Building and Property

Mr. McLaughlin stated that the Building and Property Committee had was recommending two Resolutions for adoption by the Board. Mr. McLaughlin then moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Mr. McLaughlin then moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Sell Clingan-Waddell Hall

YR 1994-05

WHEREAS, Youngstown State University has been authorized to offer for sale Clingan-Waddell Hall by Senate Bill 167 on July 26, 1989; and

WHEREAS, two previous efforts to sell Clingan-Waddell Hall have not been successful; and

WHEREAS, authorization to sell Clingan-Waddell Hall is scheduled to expire on July 25, 1994.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize the administration to take the necessary steps to offer for sale Clingan-Waddell Hall; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if this attempt to sell the facility is unsuccessful, the administration is authorized to demolish Clingan-Waddell Hall so that the property can be offered for sale before the authorization for sale expires.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Flask. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. McLaughlin then moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution Concerning Acquisition of Property

YR 1994-06

WHEREAS, on November 11, 1992, Youngstown State University and the City of Youngstown entered into an agreement under which the City of Youngstown assigned its rights under a purchase agreement to Youngstown State University for City Lot No. 665 (more particularly described in Exhibit B which is attached hereto and incorporated herein) located at the northeast corner of Fifth and Rayen Avenues;

WHEREAS, the City of Youngstown has fulfilled its obligation to pay full consideration due the owner under the purchase agreement; and

WHEREAS, the acquisition of this property is in the best interests of and incidental to the operation of Youngstown State University.

BE IT RESOLVED, that:

- The assignment of the purchase agreement for City Lot #665 pursuant to the terms and conditions of the agreement between Youngstown State University and the City of Youngstown is hereby ratified and approved; and
- Youngstown State University does hereby accept the deed tendered pursuant to the agreement for City Lot #665 transferring title to the State of Ohio for the use and benefit of Youngstown State University and authorizes the recording of such deed with the office of the Mahoning County Recorder.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Flask. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

3. Budget and Finance Committee

Mr. Beeghly stated that the Budget and Finance Committee was recommending one Resolution for adoption by the Board. He then moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Authorize an Increase in the Current General Fund 1993-94

YR 1994-07

WHEREAS, the Youngstown State University Current General Fund has allocated \$1,975,000 in a Reserve for Compensation Adjustments for 1993-94; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the collective bargaining agreements to be ratified, additional funds in the amount of \$ 125,000 are required for the purpose of funding compensation increases; and

WHEREAS, these additional funds are available within the Replacement of Obsolescent Equipment Account which is in the Plant Fund; and

WHEREAS, only the Board of Trustees has the authority to transfer money between funds and to authorize an increase in the total budget of a fund;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize and direct the transfer of \$125,000 from the Replacement of Obsolescent Equipment Account into the Reserve for Compensation Adjustments; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this transfer of \$125,000 will increase the total budget of the Current General Fund to \$82,567,000.

The motion was seconded by Mrs. DeLuca. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

4. Academic Affairs

Mrs. DeLuca stated that the Academic Affairs Committee had no report.

5. Student Affairs

Mrs. Atkinson stated that the Student Services Committee had no report.

6. Public Services

Mr. O'Connell stated that the Budget and Finance Committee was recommending one Resolution for adoption by the Board. He then moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution Accepting Gifts

YR 1994-08

WHEREAS, Resolution YR 1980-34 provides that the President shall compile a list of gifts to the University for each meeting of the Board of Trustees and present the list accompanied by his recommendation for action by the Board; and

WHEREAS, the President has reported that gifts in the amount of \$69,989 have been received by the Office of University Development during the period of June 26 through August 31, 1993; and

WHEREAS, the President has reported that gifts have been received by WYSU-FM in the amount of \$2,140 for the period June 17 through August 31, 1993; and

WHEREAS, the University has received \$246,460 in grants and contracts for the period of June 26 through August 31, 1993;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby accept these gifts as listed in Exhibit C on behalf of Youngstown State University and requests that the President acknowledge the acceptance of these gifts and expresses our gratitude for their generosity in support of the University.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby acknowledge the gifts made to the YSU Foundation for the period of June 30 through August 31, 1993 as listed in Exhibit D.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Beeghly. Following discussion, the motion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

7. Athletics Committee

Mr. Flask stated that the Athletics Committee had no report.

8. Executive Committee

Mr. Lyden stated that the Executive Committee was recommending two Resolutions for adoption by the Board. Acting on behalf of the Executive Committee, Mr. Lyden then submitted for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution Concerning President's Contract

YR 1994-09

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees has reviewed the Employment Contract between Youngstown State University and Dr. Leslie H. Cochran as President of the University; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Executive Committee that the President's Employment Contract be modified to provide for an increase in compensation, mileage reimbursement for certain official travel within the State of Ohio, and appointment to the Professional/Administrative staff.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Employment Contract of President Leslie H. Cochran be modified to provide the following:

- 1. An increase in the annual Base Salary from \$130,000 to \$135,000;
- 2. Reimbursement for automobile mileage for official travel within the State of Ohio on trips of greater than 50 miles; and

3. Appointment to the Professional/-Administrative staff in addition to Dr. Cochran's existing appointment as Professor with tenure.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board's officers are authorized to revise the President's Employment Contract in a manner consistent with this Resolution upon consultation with Dr. Cochran, and to execute appropriate documentation effecting these revisions.

Following discussion of the Resolution recommended by the Executive Committee, a vote on the committee recommendation received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the recommendation carried and the Resolution adopted.

Acting on behalf of the Executive Committee, Mr. Lyden then submitted for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution Concerning Board Secretary's Professional Services Contract

YR 1994-10

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees has reviewed the professional services contract between the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University and Franklin S. Bennett, Jr., as Secretary to the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee recognizes that the Secretary's stipend has not been increased since the inception of the contract on July 1, 1990, while the duties of the Secretary have increased; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Executive Committee that the Secretary's professional services contract be modified to provide for an increase in compensation, and reimbursement for certain out-of-pocket expenses incurred by the Secretary on behalf of the University.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the professional services contract with the Board's Secretary be, and the same hereby is, modified to provide the following:

- 1. An increase in the annual stipend paid to the Secretary from \$24,000 to \$26,500; and
- 2. Reimbursement to the Secretary for expenses of postage, copying and long distance telephone incurred on behalf of the University.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board's Chairperson and Vice Chairperson are authorized to execute appropriate documentation effecting these modifications to the Secretary's contract.

Following discussion of the Resolution recommended by the Executive Committee, a vote on the committee recommendation received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairperson declared the recommendation carried and the Resolution adopted.

ITEM V - COMMUNICATIONS, MEMORIALS

There were no communications or memorials brought before the Board.

ITEM VI - UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no unfinished business considered by the Board.

ITEM VII - NEW BUSINESS



RESOLUTION TO SELL CLINGAN-WADDELL HALL

WHEREAS, Youngstown State University has been authorized to offer for sale Clingan-Waddell Hall by Senate Bill 167 on July 26, 1989; and

WHEREAS, two previous efforts to sell Clingan-Waddell Hall have not been successful; and

WHEREAS, authorization to sell Clingan-Waddell Hall is scheduled to expire on July 25, 1994.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize the administration to take the necessary steps to offer for sale Clingan-Waddell Hall; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if this attempt to sell the facility is unsuccessful, the administration is authorized to demolish Clingan-Waddell Hall so that the property can be offered for sale before the authorization for sale expires.

RESOLUTION CONCERNING ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY

WHEREAS, on November 11, 1992, Youngstown State University and the City of Youngstown entered into an agreement under which the City of Youngstown assigned its rights under a purchase agreement to Youngstown State University for City Lot No. 665 (more particularly described in Exhibit B which is attached hereto and incorporated herein) located at the northeast corner of Fifth and Rayen Avenues;

WHEREAS, the City of Youngstown has fulfilled its obligation to pay full consideration due the owner under the purchase agreement; and

WHEREAS, the acquisition of this property is in the best interests of and incidental to the operation of Youngstown State University.

BE IT RESOLVED, that:

- 1. The assignment of the purchase agreement for City Lot #665 pursuant to the terms and conditions of the agreement between Youngstown State University and the City of Youngstown is hereby ratified and approved; and
- 2. Youngstown State University does hereby accept the deed tendered pursuant to the agreement for City Lot #665 transferring title to the State of Ohio for the use and benefit of Youngstown State University and authorizes the recording of such deed with the office of the Mahoning County Recorder.

Situated in the City of Youngstown, County of Mahoning, State of Ohio, and known as being Youngstown City Lot Number Six Hundred Sixty-five (665) according to the latest enumeration of lots in said City in the Parmalee Plat, as shown by the recorded plat of said subdivision in Volume 1 of Plats, Page 76, Mahoning County Records.

RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE AN INCREASE IN THE CURRENT GENERAL FUND 1993-94

WHEREAS, the Youngstown State University Current General Fund has allocated \$1,975,000 in a Reserve for Compensation Adjustments for 1993-94; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the collective bargaining agreements to be ratified, additional funds in the amount of \$125,000 are required for the purpose of funding compensation increases; and

WHEREAS, these additional funds are available within the Replacement of Obsolescent Equipment Account which is in the Plant Fund; and

WHEREAS, only the Board of Trustees has the authority to transfer money between funds and to authorize an increase in the total budget of a fund;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize and direct the transfer of \$125,000 from the Replacement of Obsolescent Equipment Account into the Reserve for Compensation Adjustments; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this transfer of \$125,000 will increase the total budget of the Current General Fund to \$82,567,000.
