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ACADEMIC DEANS' COUNCIL Minutes Arts & Sciences Conference Room February 3, 1976

DR. EARL E. EDGAR VICE PRESIDENT FOR ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

- 1. The minutes of the meeting of January 13, 1976 were approved.
- Dean Scriven passed out the schedule of registration dates, attached as Inclosure 1. This schedule had been reviewed by all individuals so was accepted as presented.
- 3. Dean Scriven passed out the paper entitled, "Highlights of 1976 Summer Orientation Program." Dean McBriarty spoke on the subject. After much discussion the proposed time distribution for the orientation and advisement periods was adopted with the amendment providing for a lunch break immediately following the Deans' session, as shown on Inclosure 2. In response to the question raised by Paraska about the evening sessions, Dean McBriarty agreed that the evening sessions would be abbreviated with the following time schedules:

6:00 - 6:20	Pick up of material	
6:30 - 7:15	Student Affairs Orientation	
7:30 - 8:00	Deans' Orientation	
8:00 on	Advisement and Registration	

Dean McBriarty stated that the evaluation instrument for the Summer Orientation would be sent to the Deans for review prior to the Summer.

- 4. Dean Scriven spoke about the material on Credit by Examination that had previously been distributed. Considerable discussion centered on the use of CR to record Credit by Examination. Dean Yozwiak moved, seconded by Dean McGraw, that the proposed policies be adopted, motion carried. Dean Rand moved, seconded by Dean Scriven that the symbol CR be used to record Credit by Examination, motion carried.
- 5. Mention was made that the Senate will be acting on the redefinition of the use of the PR to include competency based courses.
- Dean Scriven asked the Deans to assure themselves that students who are petitioning to have F's changed to W's actually have withdrawn from the courses.
- 7. Dean Miller's suggestion of scheduling 3-hour classes during the Summer on the first four days of the week was brought up. Dean Miller moved, seconded by Paraska that this be adopted. The motion was defeated.

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- 8. Paraska distributed an updated version of the letter that will be sent to Nursing applicants who are refused direct admission into the Nursing program. He pointed out that the admissions criteria will not be sent to the students, but will be available to others within the University to respond to questions by students interested in transferring into the Nursing program.
- 9. Dr. Edgar reminded Deans that recommendations for distinguished professors are due in the near future.
- 10. The next meeting will be Wednesday, February 11 at 1:00 p.m. at which time budget information will be distributed. Prior to that time Dr. Edgar will meet with individual deans to philosophy about the forthcoming budget. Information from Dr. Foster on productivity was distributed.
