# The Commencement Speaker

DR. WILLIAM H. COFFIELD

University of Tennessee educator DR. WILLIAM H. COFFIELD, recognized nationally for his research in the field of administrative behavior and learning, served as vice president for academic affairs at Youngstown State University from 1967 to 1970. Dr. Coffield joined the University of Tennessee as professor and head of the department of continuing and higher education in 1970 after helping guide YSU through its first years as a state institution. He is currently associate dean for graduate programs and administration, College of Education, University of Tennessee.

From 1954 to 1958, Dr. Coffield served on the faculty of Auburn University, and during 1958 was research associate at Columbia University's Teachers College for the U.S. Office of Education Project on Administrative Behavior, Following the one-year special assignment, he served two years at Ohio State University as associate professor and associate director of the University Council for Educational Administration. From 1961 to 1963, he was professor and head of the department of education at Northern Illinois University. Prior to his YSU appointment in 1967, he was professor and dean of the College of Education at Kansas State University for four years.

Dr. Coffield has co-authored numerous articles on administrative behavior for professional journals and magazines.

Among publications he has co-edited and contributed material to are Simulation in Administrative Training, Dimension of Administrative Performance, and Administrative Performance and Personality. He also planned and served as educational advisor in the production of two motion pictures for instructional use in administrative programs. One of the films, The Conference, was selected as one of the 10 outstanding films produced by American universities in 1961.

He has served as team member and/or chariman of visiting teams for the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (nine institutions between 1960-72), and in 1969 as a member of the committee to study faculty workload and administrative cost for public colleges and universities of Ohio for the Ohio Board of Regents. Dr. Coffield also served as chairman of the Chancellor's Task Force on University Housing at the University of Tennessee from 1971-72 and the following year as a consultant on organizational structure and administrative effectiveness for Louisville and Jefferson County (Kentucky) Public Schools.

A graduate of Troy (Alabama) State College, he was named its Alumnus of the Year in 1962. Dr. Coffield also holds degrees from George Peabody College and the University of Iowa.

## ACADEMIC REGALIA AND CEREMONY

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of clothing worn in medieval times by students and professors. In the early universities — Bologna, Paris, Oxford — the undergraduate students had no prescribed academic dress but wore their usual clerical or ecclesiastical habits. The professors wore more colorful academic regalia than their modern day descendents. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where the lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, there is a change to somber black and it is only in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the warmth and color of medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing degrees granted by various colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. The facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters, or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; drab for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education. It is possible, also, to determine from the length of the hoods the type of degree held by the wearer—quite long for the doctor's degree, medium for the master's, short for the bachelor's.

Since 1895, in the United States, the colors and types of caps and gowns have been largely standardized; in 1932 the code was revised to some extent, and in 1960 it was revised once more. A few American universities have adopted gowns other than black in color, and in European universities there is more diversity in cut and in the cap than prevails in the United States. Trustees and administrators of American colleges and universities, too, may wear regalia

which is different from that commonly worn. The trustees of Youngstown State University wear a specially designed cardinal gown.

The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's gown is worn open or closed, depending partly on its tailoring and the wearer of the doctor's gown has the privilege of wearing it open or closed. The sleeves of the three types of gowns are of different lengths and cuts, and in addition the sleeves of the doctor's gown have three horizontal velvet stripes. The doctor's gown also has vertical facing of velvet in front. The stripes and facing may be either black or in the color representing the field in which the wearer has received the doctorate.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period. The tassels worn on the caps may or may not be of the same types. In some institutions all master's and bachelor's tassels are black; in others the tassels, which are the same as the colors of the facings of the hoods, reflect the degree received. The tassels worn by doctors may be black or gold thread.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirements. The chief marshals lead the line of march, followed by the president, the speaker, trustees, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform. Then follow the faculty and the candidates for degrees. The procession at the end of the ceremony follows the same order.

Recipients of University Honors will receive special insignia, consisting of golden honor cords placed around the shoulders.
