Founded in 1908, Youngstown State University originally served 160 students with about a dozen faculty members and provided expanded educational opportunity for all people—store clerks and factory managers, steel industry workers, newly arrived immigrants, women and men, and both part-time and full-time learners.

This progressive spirit guided the development of the institution as it evolved from a YMCA technical institute, later as Youngstown College (1928), then as Youngstown University (1955) and, in 1967, as Youngstown State University, a member of the Ohio public higher education system.

Today, Youngstown State University is a leading comprehensive university, serving more than 12,000 full- and part-time students with 120 undergraduate programs, 36 master's degree programs and a doctorate in education. There are more than 410 full-time faculty and 688 professional and support staff members in seven colleges, schools and administrative departments. In partnership with schools and the corporate and non-profit communities, Youngstown State University promotes diversity and excellence in teaching, research, and service to increase the educational attainment and economic and environmental vitality of the region.

Throughout its 96-year history, Youngstown State University has been cited as an innovative educational leader. It has also been recognized through numerous awards—both in academics and athletics—as one of the best urban, public, comprehensive universities in the United States.

Today's commencement speaker is Clarence R. Smith, Jr. Mr. Smith is chairman of Diamond Steel Construction Company and Compco Industries and its affiliates. He is also an active community leader, serving the boards of a wide range of organizations. He

recently received the 2004 Distinguished Citizen Award, among the most prominent ways Youngstown State University recognizes outstanding accomplishment.

A longtime supporter of Youngstown State, Smith was a major contributor to the building of Stambaugh Stadium in the late 1970s and early 1980s. Smith and his company contributed generously to the stadium renovations that were concluded prior to the 1997 season, which included construction of the East stands. In 2001, he donated much of his outstanding rock and gemstone collection to the YSU Geology Department. Smith is also an active member of the Penguin Club and has played a key role in University athletics; an athletic scholarship was established in his name by the employees of his company, Compco Industries. Throughout his life, Smith has kept his ties close to home. He was born and raised in Boardman, graduated from Boardman High School, and attended Kenyon College and Youngstown State University.

Among his many civic involvements, Smith chairs the Mahoning Valley Republican Party and serves on the board of directors of the Home Savings and Loan Company. He is an advisor to Goodwill Industries and a board member of the Youngstown Warren Regional Chamber of Commerce, the Public Library of Youngstown and Mahoning County, the Boy Scouts of America's Camp Stambaugh, the Western Reserve Port Authority, and the 32° Masonic Children's Learning Center. He is a member of the Mahoning Valley Council of Churches, the Organization for Protestant Men, Boardman Rotary, the Youngstown Club, Tippecanoe Country Club, and Masonic Fraternity.

Smith has been widely recognized for his contributions to the life of the community. He has been named Honorary Member of the Buckeye Elks Lodge No. 7, Man of the Year by the Boardman Civic Association and 2002 Penguin of the Year. In 2003 he was inducted into the Northeast Ohio Business Hall of Fame and has received the 2004 Regional Chamber William G. Lyden, Jr. Spirit of the Valley Award as well as the Private Sector Business Award from the Better Business Bureau.

Academic Regalia and Ceremony

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of those worn in medieval times by students and professors. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, somber black garb became the norm, and it is primarily in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing graduate degrees

granted by various colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; olive for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution The Presidential Medallion

The presidential medallion was designed and created out of sterling and bronze by Wendell August Forge of Grove City, Pennsylvania. Dr. Sweet is the first president to wear this medallion.

The Youngstown State University Seal

The University's official seal was adopted in 1936. Designed by a student, the seal includes a torch, quills, wings, a globe, and the Latin words animus liberatus. In simple terms, those words summarize the transformation—or liberation—that occurs on this campus countless times each day. In English, they are translated *The Mind Freed*, or *The Spirit Freed*.
