#### To the Senior Class, 1960


Your years at Youngstown University have been a period of absorption in your own immediate problems and personal search for knowledge with which to solve them. You are free now to put that learning to the test of experience.

Historical facts, statistics and general information regarding students, sports events, campus organizations, enrollment, alumni, and many other news events may be obtained from Miss Flint's office.




# Director of Placement






## Pete Penguin Ball

The students of Dana School of Music presented the opera LA PERICHOLE by Offenbach for their musical offering of the first semester.












Afternoon festivities were over, the Army left and we were off to the dance.


I. F. C. is made up of two delegates from each of the twelve fraternities and four officers. Its primary function is to govern Greek men.

### Penguin Football History

No matter how far back into the football history of Youngstown University one searches, two names will make an appearance—Dike Beede and Willard Webster. These names are not present merely for dressing-up's sake, for without them there would be no football story.

For 30 years after its founding in 1908, Youngstown College, as it was referred to until 1956, fostered a great many achievements. Not among them, however, was football, a game flourishing throughout the country and dominated by Notre Dame's Knute Rockne and Pittsburgh's Jock Sutherland. The local college was thriving, but not in athletic competition.

In 1934 an attempt at intercollegiate athletics began with the formation of Youngstown's first basketball team. But the vast athletic plant now operating was still in its infancy. The biggest step toward athletic stability came in 1938 when the administration hired Dike Beede as Youngstown's first football coach. Another gentlemen came with him—Willard Webster.

With Beede at the grid helm and Webster as Athletic Director since 1940, the athletic fortunes of Youngstown have crept to a summit attained several years ago and since maintained.


During the 1938 season, the Penguins compiled a four win—five loss record after dropping the opening game to Geneva 12-6. The biggest thorn in Youngstown's side was the opposing quarterback, Dom Rosselli, who joined Youngstown's staff in 1940.

The names of Tony "Bull" Rosselli, Pete Lanzi, Al Campana, Ralph Goldston, and Jim Vechiarella are but a few of the many football greats produced by Youngstown over its 18-year history, interrupted for three years by World War II.


The history is brief by comparison, but the events are numerous, the stars are many, and the memories are fond, especially to Dike Beede and Willard Webster.

Northern Michigan interrupted Youngstown's winning streak when it edged the local grid eleven, 7-0 in  $\alpha$  tight defensive battle.







Buffalo and Southern Connecticut Universities provided two smashing blows to the Penguin grid fortunes when they stopped the locals on successive weekends.



#### Penguin Basketball History


Twenty-six years of basketball enterprise have earned the Youngstown University Penguins a place among the nation's small college cage elite. Many great personalities contributed to the success but for the last fourteen years Dom Rosselli's name has been the most dominant.

Rosselli, coach of the Penguins two years prior to World War II, returned to the head coaching position in 1946 after four years of military service and has piloted the basketball squad since.

Among the outstanding performers during this period which has produced 209 victories against 186 defeats are Mickey Yugovich, Herb Lake, Bob Atterholt, and Tony Knott among the most recent. Before these came Leo Mogus, Jack Christine, Ray Wise, Eli Danilov, and Sam Jankovich.

Rosselli's teams reached the basketball pinnacle between 1956 and 1959 when they captured the Ohio NAIA championship three years in succession. The 1956-57 Penguins reached the quarter finals before bowing to the eventual tournament champions, Tennessee A & I. The two teams repeated the performance the following year with the same results.

The Penguins have advanced a great deal since the inauguration of the hardwood sport in 1934. Yet the outlook for the future appears even brighter for Dom Rosselli and the Youngstown University basketball team.

Tom Smolanovich and Mickey Yugovich, two of Youngstown University's outstanding athletes over the past decade, were properly awarded at a special recognition banquet held late in March.

Smolanovich carried the brunt of the Penguin football burden in the 1959 campaign while Yugovich moved into the second place among the all-time basketball scoring leaders. Both hope to further their athletic careers in the professional ranks and if past performances are used as a measuring stick, the pair is close to the "can't-miss" category.

As a regular end for the Penguins for three years after transferring to Youngstown from Cincinnati University as a sophomore, Smolanovich earned the raves of the fans and praise of the opposing players and coaches for the amazing versatility he displayed.


Yugovich, though second to Tony Knott in individual scoring over his four-year career, holds the freshman record of 503 points set in 1956-57. His 1917 points fell 301 short of the school record. 
The trophies awarded were huge but minute in comparison to the efforts of Smolanovich and Yugovich.
