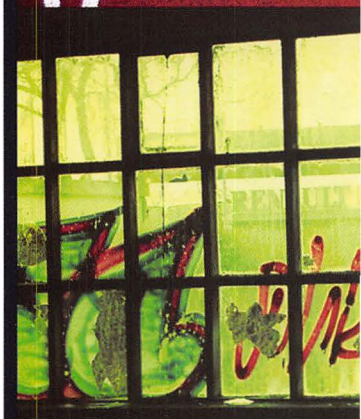
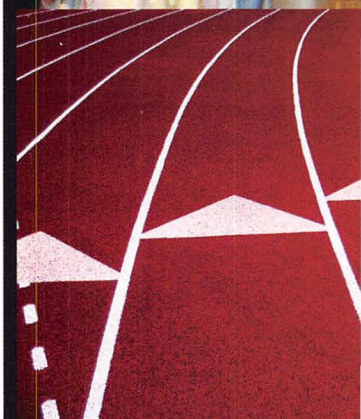
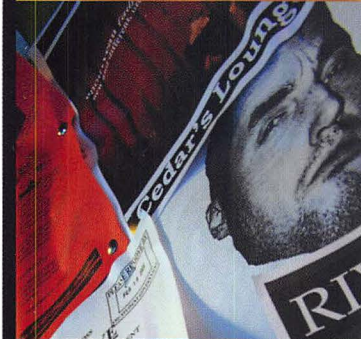
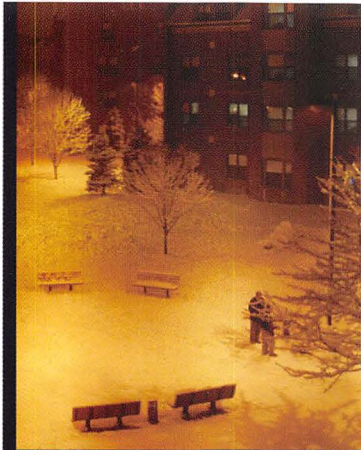
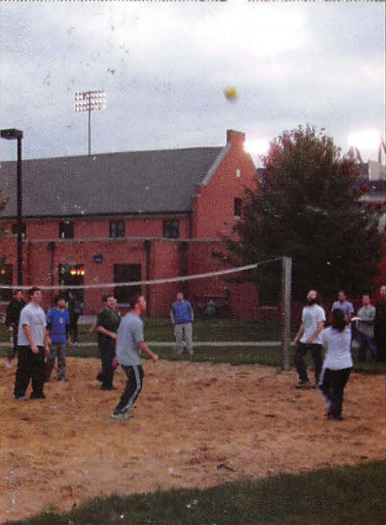
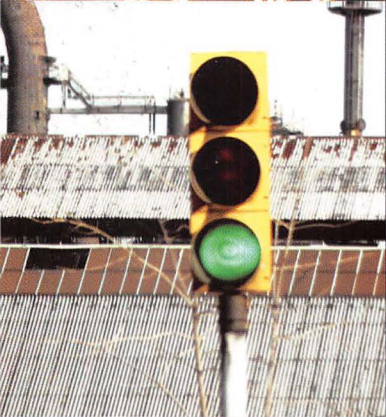
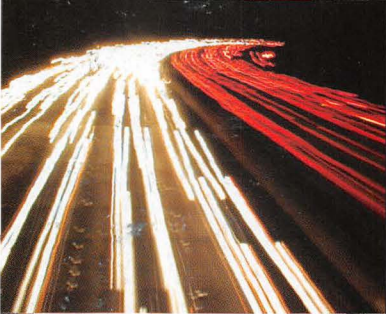
A LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

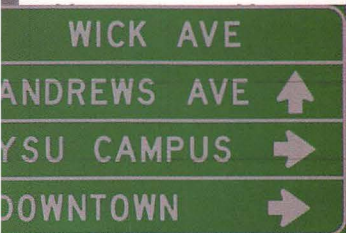

The History of Youngstown State University

Presented by the Alumni Association

Located on a spectacular 130-acre campus near downtown Youngstown, Youngstown State University offers its students a broad selection of major programs backed by a strong tradition of teaching and research. YSU is one of only a handful of state assisted universities that offer a comprehensive selection of degree programs from certificate to doctorate in one location.

To meet the challenges of the new century, the Young Men's Christian Association School established the School of Law of the Youngstown Association School in 1908. The vision of the future established the base for Youngstown State University. Through the next 60 years, the institution evolved from Youngstown College to Youngstown University and, in 1967, joined the Ohio system of higher education as Youngstown State University.

Under the leadership of Dr. Howard Jones, the College began to respond to the ever-changing needs of the community it served. Beginning with the Bachelor of Laws degree in 1922, and followed by the Bachelor of Arts degree in 1930, the University has grown to offer over 110 major areas of study.

The University now has six major undergraduate colleges including the College of Arts and Sciences, the Warren P. Williamson College of Business Administration, the William Rayen College of Engineering and Technology, the College of Fine and Performing Arts, the Bitonte College of Health and Human Services, the Beeghly College of Education and the School of Graduate Studies and Research. In addition, the University sponsors the Northeastern Ohio Universities College of Medicine, in cooperation with Kent State University and the University of Akron.

Although the University has expanded far beyond its beginnings as an advanced training center for local residents, it remains solidly committed to providing outstanding educational opportunities for students of all races, ages, religions and geographical regions. YSU's student body of approximately 12,698 and a student ratio of 19:1 provide the personal contact associated with smaller institutions while drawing on the vast resources available through the Ohio state system of higher education.

Since 1908, over 220,000 individuals have taken classes at Youngstown State University, Youngstown University or Youngstown College. Today the University boasts a diverse alumni body composed of over 65,000 graduates and over 78,000 degrees granted. More importantly, over 30,000 graduates live and work within fifty miles of campus. The impact of the University throughout this region can be measured by the quality of graduates who have assumed leadership roles in virtually every segment of the economy in the Mahoning Valley and beyond. Distinguished University graduates transcend all ages, fields of endeavor and majors and include success stories from Youngstown College, Youngstown University and ultimately Youngstown State University.

Throughout the twentieth century, Youngstown State University has grown and developed to realize the promise of its beginnings and vision of its future. YSU is on the move, proving leadership, vision and the people who will shape our future. Those individuals graduating from Youngstown State University in 2003 -2004 have been provided with a quality education and the ability to make a difference in the community we reside in and beyond.

This year, 12,698 students attended YSU allowing for a student-faculty ratio of 19:1. Of the 12,698 students at YSU, 11,375 are undergraduates. Multicultural students make up 13 percent of the student body and international students hail from fifty-five countries. The average undergraduate class size is 27 for lectures and 9 for labs. Youngstown State University seeks to offer its students a vital living and learning environment with a relatively small, cohesive campus and a wealth of curricular and co-curricular activities.

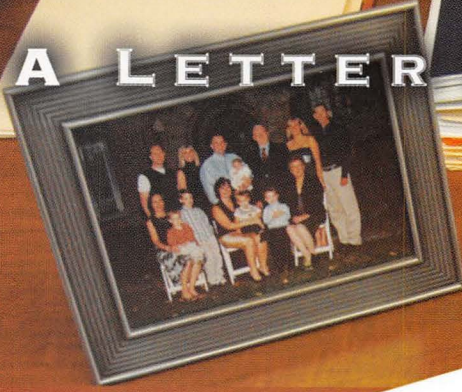
President David C. Sweet sums up his career highlights of the year with just three words, “enrollment, diversity and partnerships.”

Under Sweet’s leadership, YSU has increased enrollment and strengthened partnerships throughout the region. He guided the development of the \$22 million University Courtyard Apartments, a 408-bed student facility that is expected to play a key role in the revitalization of the Smokey Hollow neighborhood adjacent to campus. Sweet provided leadership to raise private funds to build a new \$12 million student recreation and wellness center on campus. Working with Youngstown Mayor George McKelvey, Sweet plans to devise an urban development plan that will lead YSU and the city well into the 21st century.

“We have reached our eighth consecutive semester of enrollment growth,” Sweet said. “That is a critical accomplishment.”

With great enthusiasm I welcome the return of the NEON student yearbook. I also extend my congratulations to the student staff members and their advisor, Alyssa Lenhoff, who have made this special project possible.

The 2003-2004 academic year was an outstanding year of accomplishments at Youngstown State University.

If I may, let me list a few of these achievements:

- Opening of the new \$22 million, 408-bed University Courtyard apartments
- Seventh consecutive semester enrollment increase in Fall 2003 with 12,858 students
- Campus visits by two Nobel prize laureates, Toni Morrison and James Watson
- Ohio Professor of the Year, Dr. Sherry Linkon, selected by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching
- Dedication of a new \$3.3 million Bliss Hall addition for the Department of Art
- Ford Foundation grant of \$350,000 awarded to the Center for Working Class Studies
- National Science Foundation Grant of \$700,000 awarded to Chet Cooper, Tom Kim, and Gary Walker, and \$395,000 federal grant awarded to James Carroll, the largest single grant received by a YSU faculty member
- Millicent S. Counts named Trustee and Charity Anne Pappas named Student Trustee to the YSU Board of Trustees
- The re-accreditation of the YSU Beeghly College of Education by NCATE
- Eighth consecutive semester enrollment increase in Spring 2004
- Kresge Foundation approved a \$600,000 challenge grant for the new \$12 million Andrews Student Recreation and Wellness Center and its exciting groundbreaking which took place this spring
- Expanded campus-community partnerships, including Wick Neighbors, Youngstown 2010 developed jointly with the City of Youngstown, NEO HealthForce, Mahoning Valley Education and Training Institute, and the Early College Program developed jointly with KnowledgeWorks and the Youngstown City School District
- Growing faculty, staff and student diversity in which minority students comprised 12.8 percent of enrollment for Fall 2003, a five-year high for YSU, and currently more than 144 minority faculty and staff members employed, representing a ten percent increase over three years ago

As a result of these efforts and the continued dedication of our outstanding faculty and staff, that is why I believe YSU is the best public university in Northeast Ohio and beyond to obtain an undergraduate degree and among the best universities to pursue selected graduate and professional degrees.

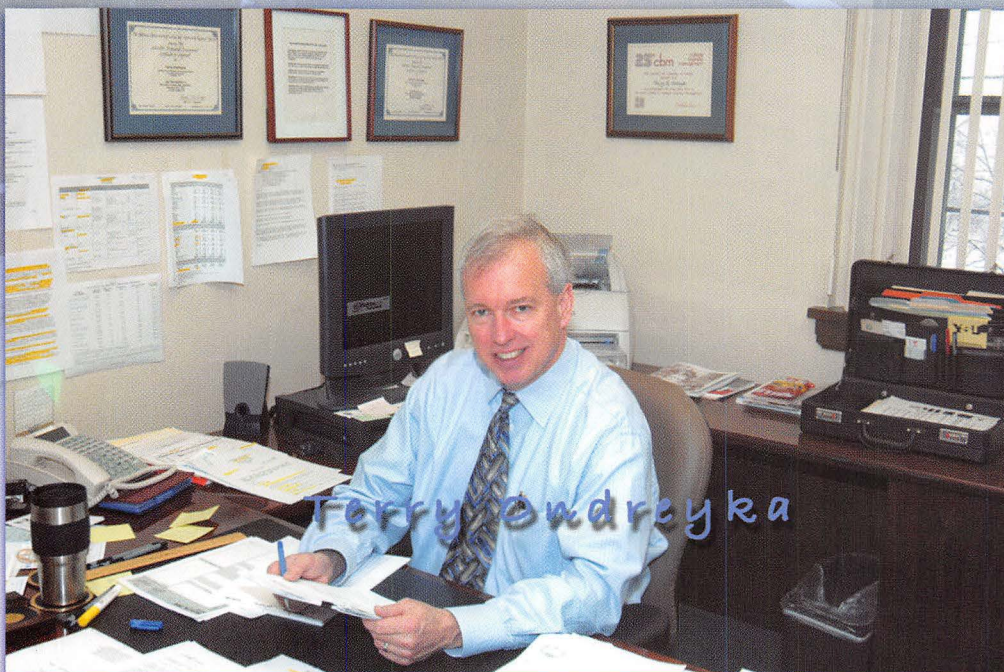
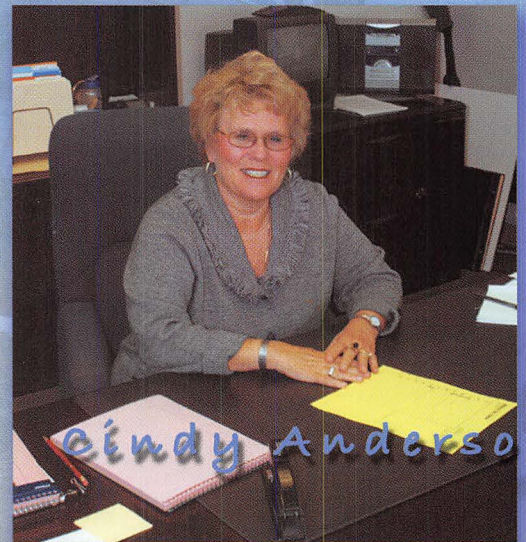
"I enjoy the variety of challenges I encounter every day," Habat said. "I get to deal with everything imaginable."

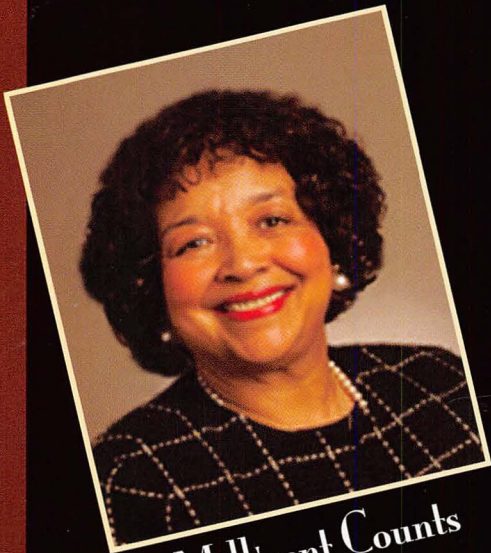
"I do whatever the president asks me to do," Maraffa said with a laugh.

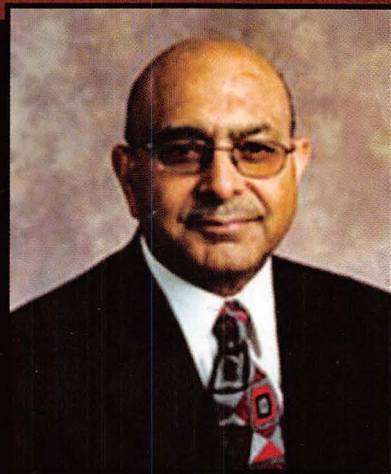
"I enjoy the variety of work and the opportunity to work with the entire campus from students to administration," Maraffa said. "It's always interesting working in a university setting."



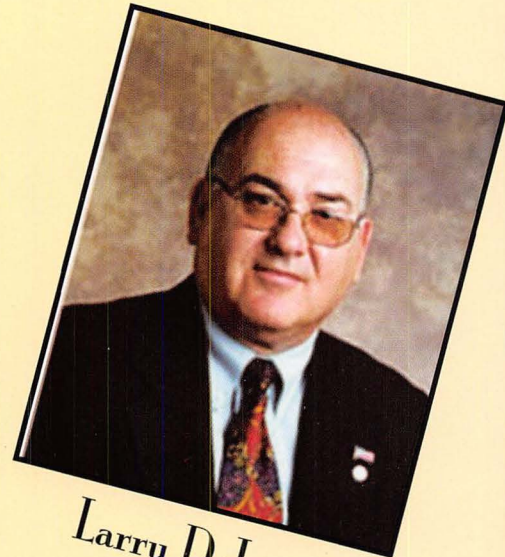

Charity Anne Pappas

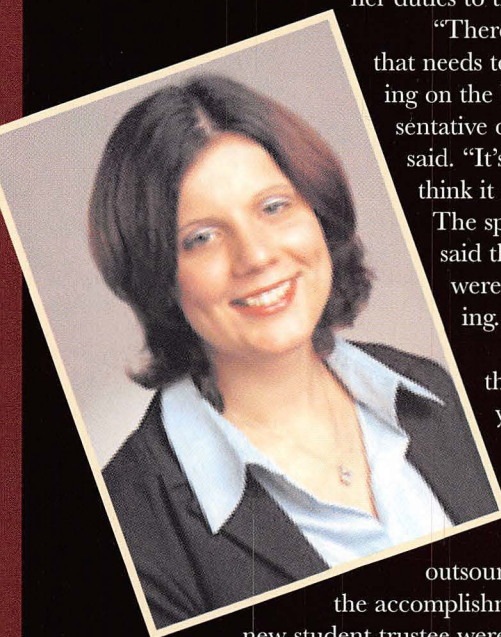

The special education major said this year’s experiences were educational and inspiring.

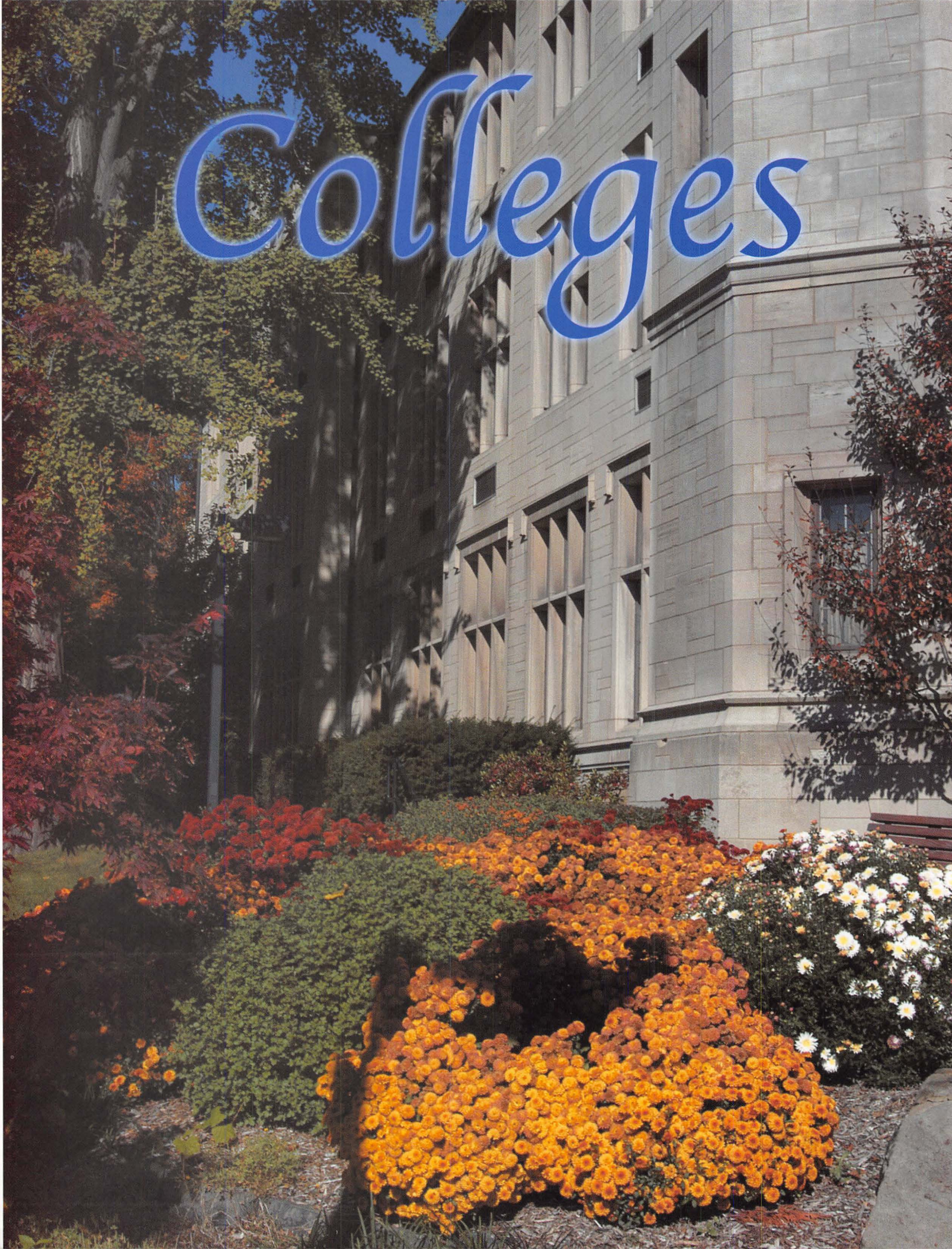

Dean Robert Bolla is proud of the strong traditions of research and teaching present in the College of Arts and Sciences.

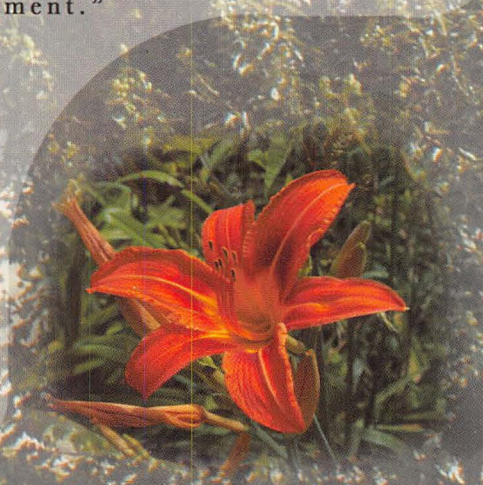
The college has reached many of its goals this year, reaffirming its stature as a predominate force for fueling academic achievement.

Faculty members in the college received more than \$4 million in external grants to aid in their academic programs and research.



Home to 24 different departments, Bolla said the College of Arts and Sciences is focused on helping students acquire the basic knowledge and skills they need to become well-educated and well-rounded human beings.

“Each major offered in the Youngstown State University College of Arts and Sciences comes with a guarantee not found in too many other places. All skills, knowledge and experienced gained during a person’s time as an undergraduate will have applied value in the workforce,” Bolla said.

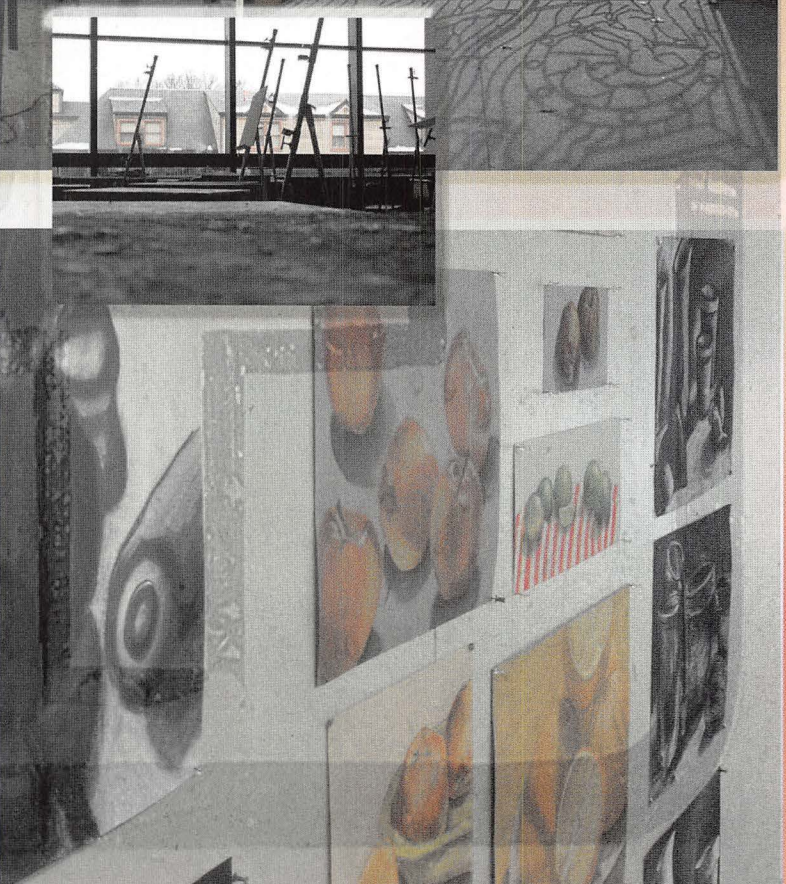
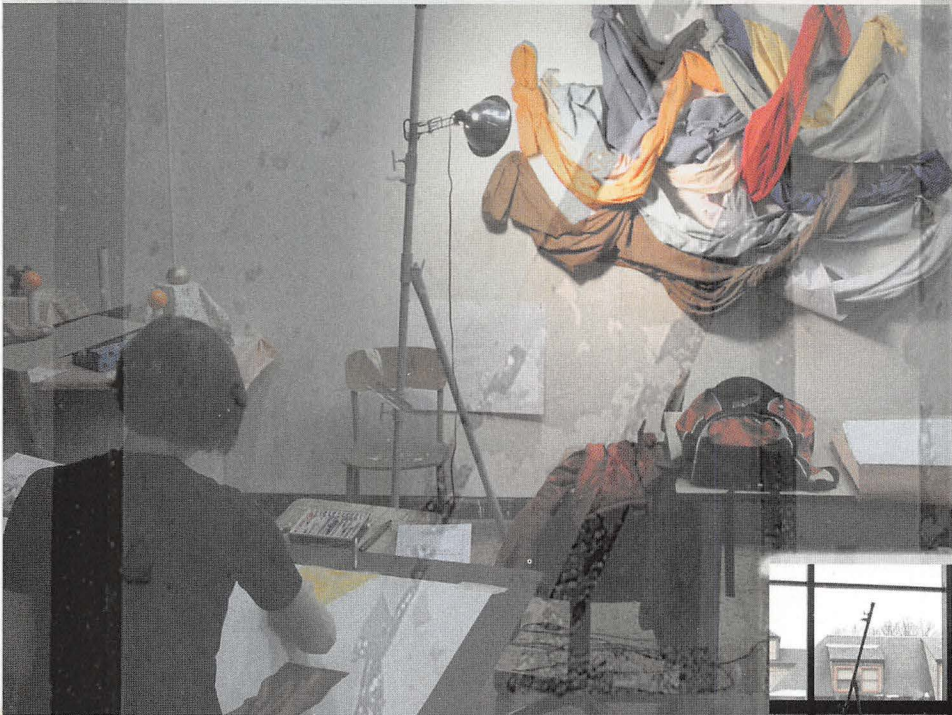
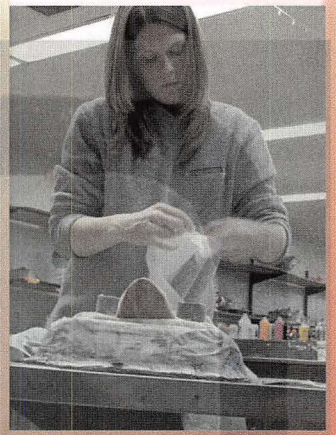
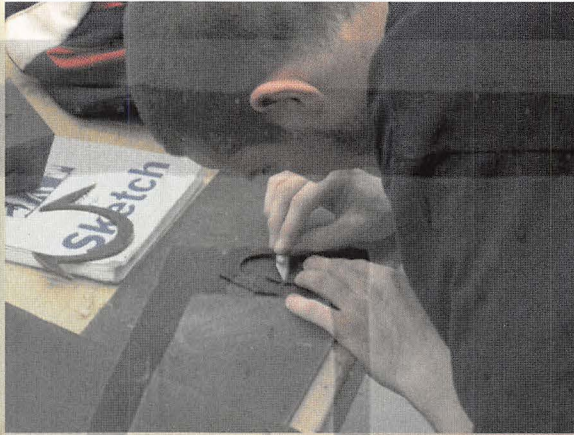
Hirtzel said she was drawn to engineering because she wants to make the world a better place.

She lists numerous accomplishments during her time as dean, including sizable donations from private companies and government organizations for research programs.

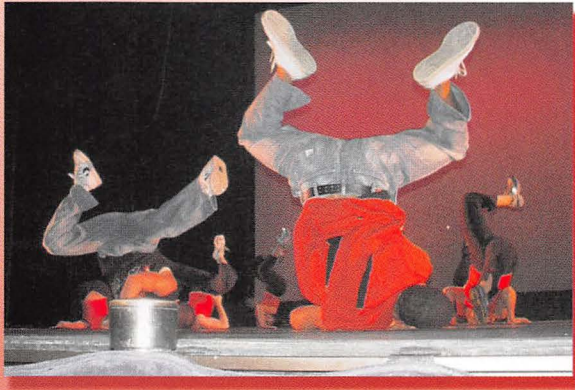

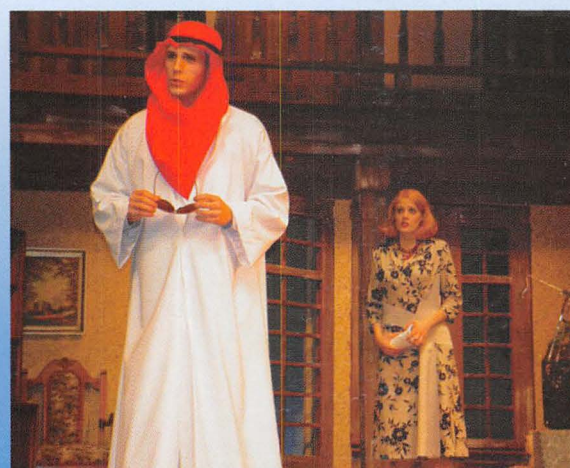
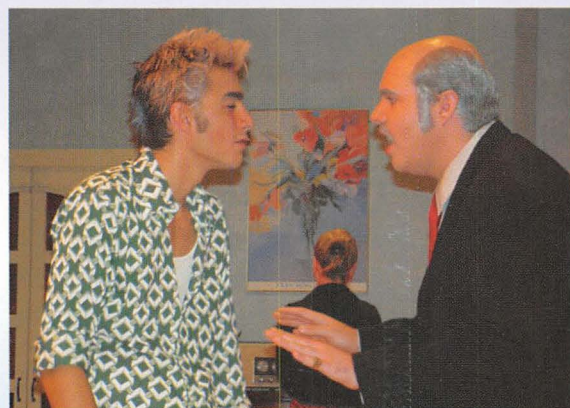
The art department equips students with the tools they need to become successful artists and designers. Students are exposed to a wide variety of styles, viewpoints, and histories in an effort to help them expand their vision and give them a clearer perception of themselves and the world around them. The newly opened addition of a sculpture wing on the eastern side of Bliss Hall provides much needed space for the department, which continues to see growth. A quick walk through the McDonough Museum of Art will show you why. The college unquestionably contains some of the most talented artists in the nation.

The department of communication and theater contains three areas: Communication Studies, Telecommunication Studies, and Theater.

The Department of Communication Studies specializes in studying interpersonal, presentational, and group skills and teaches students the skills they need to be effective oral communicators. Those receiving degrees in the area of communication reap two benefits. First, they are equipped to compete for jobs in which excellent communication skills are required. Secondly, they are given life skills that will enhance their ability to communicate with those around them, and to help those around them better communicate.

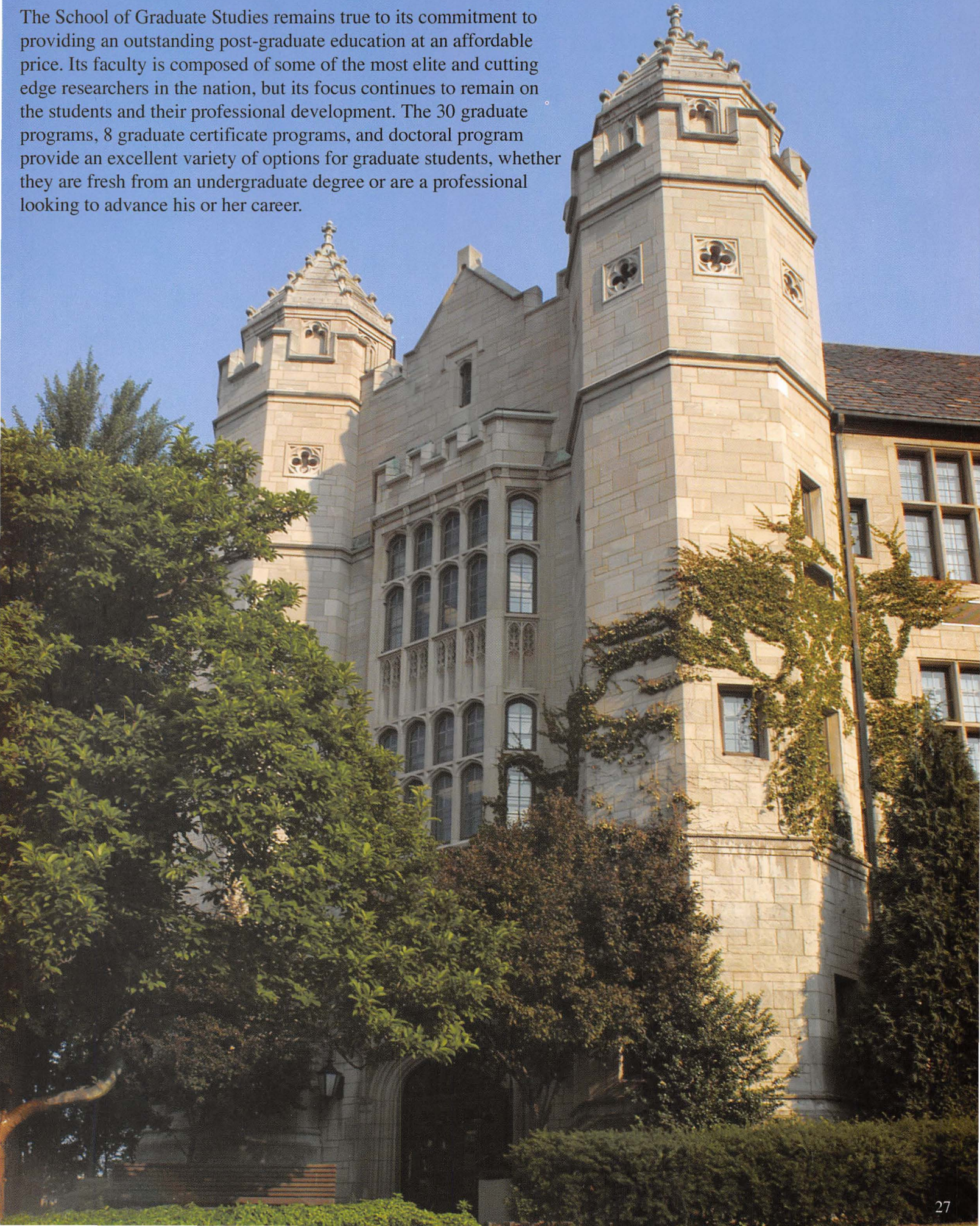
The Department of Telecommunication Studies focuses on human communication that passes through a medium, such as television or the radio. Students do an in-depth study of the uses of these different mediums, and how to effectively use them to communicate information. The low student-to-faculty ratio gives students in this major an added opportunity to receive important feedback that will help them perfect their skills.

The Department of Theater Studies breaks apart and analyzes the many facets of the human nature. Students are taught how to utilize this information to interpret and portray different characters in the public performance setting. The theater department puts on two main-stage and two black box performances each year, along with various independent projects. Students may choose to pursue a Bachelor of Arts in Theater, or a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theater or Musical Theater.

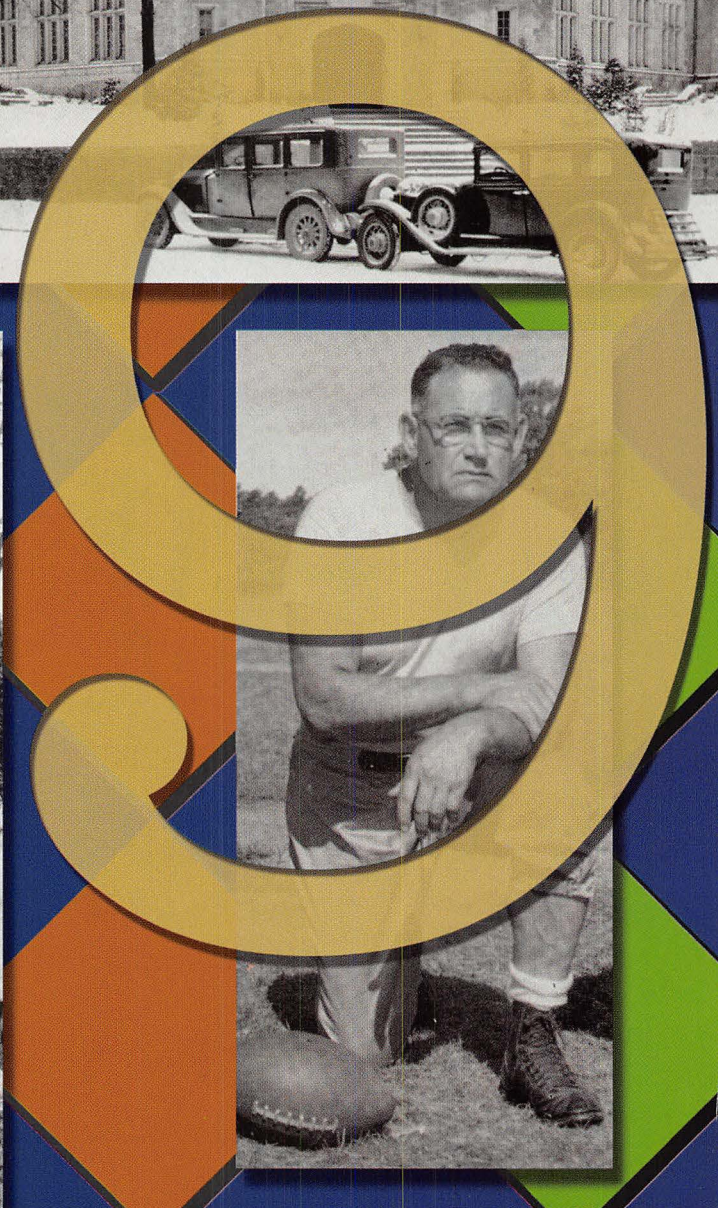
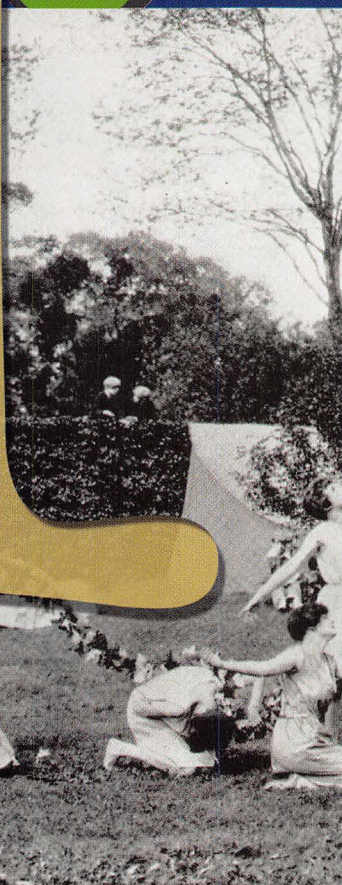
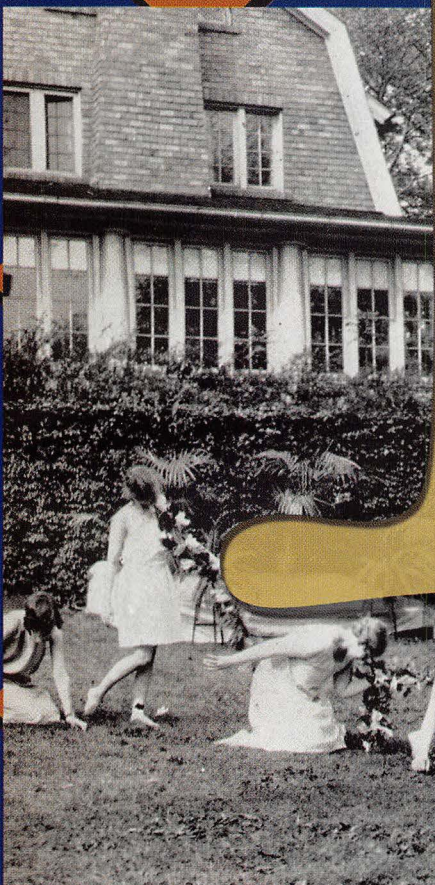
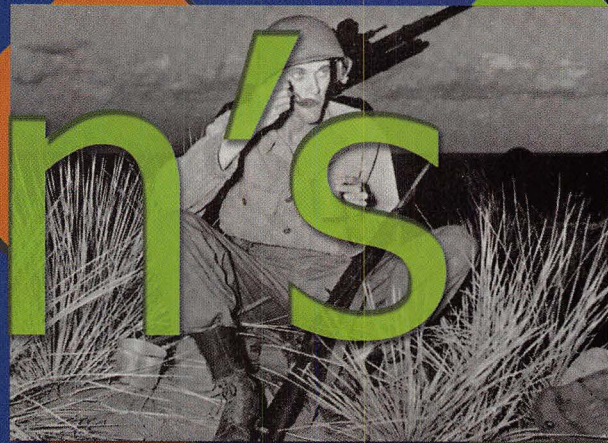
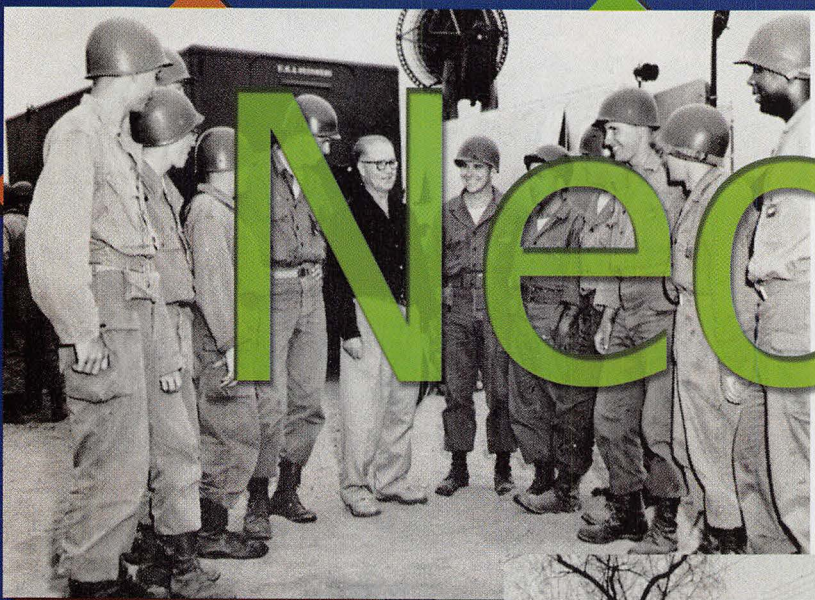

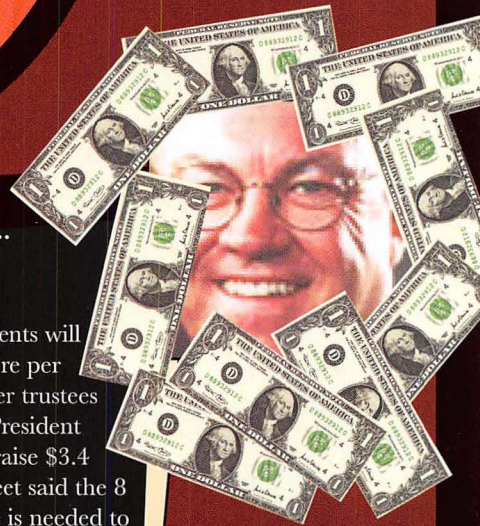


Bursar's Office Bumps Non-Paying Students

Associate bursar James Herschel sent letters to YSU faculty members requiring them to oust students who had not paid anything toward their tuition bills. Students' registrations for fall semester were canceled, and they were no longer permitted to attend classes or take final exams.

Beginning fall 2004, students will be paying 8 percent more per year to attend YSU after trustees approved University President David Sweet's plan to raise \$3.4 million in revenue. Sweet said the 8 percent tuition increase is needed to cover student, staff and faculty salaries and scholarships, while two percent is allocated for technology upgrades.

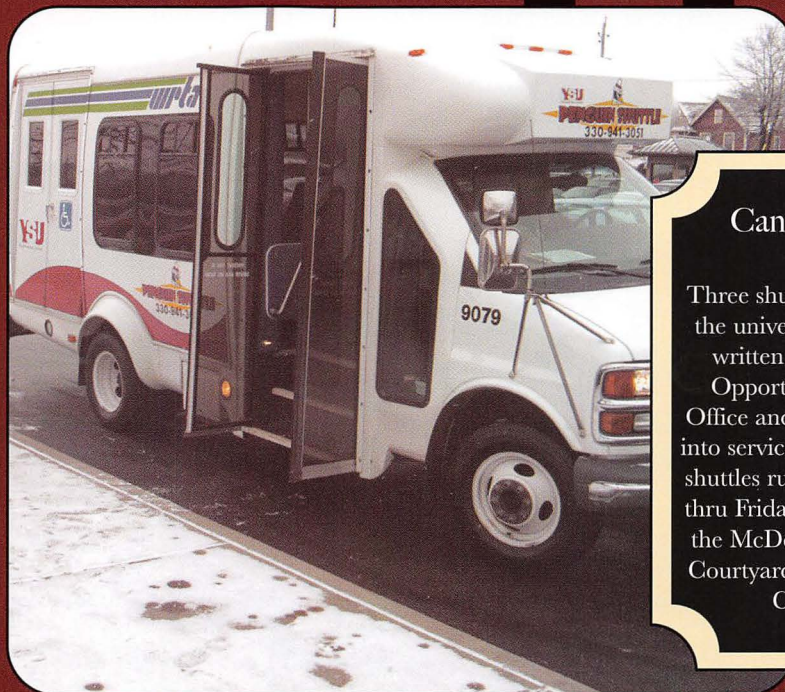


You Have E-Grades

Fall semester 2003 brought an end to the mailing of YSU student report cards. University officials expect to save approximately \$11,000 per year by eliminating bulk mail expenditures and posting grades through CUE-mail, the university run email server.

Healthy Growth

Construction on the Andrews Student Wellness Center began in the spring and is scheduled for completion in fall 2005. The 65,000-square-foot center is the first campus building constructed entirely from private funds since 1967. Located adjacent to Kilcawley Center, it will include a fitness center, climbing wall, weight room, jogging track, racquetball courts and meditation room.



Can I Get A Lift?

Three shuttle buses provided to the university through a grant written between the Equal Opportunity and Diversity Office and the WRTA were put into service spring semester. The shuttles run two routes Monday thru Friday and include stops at the McDonough Museum, the Courtyard Apartments and the Cafaro House.



Women's Studies Takes A Hit

The Women's Center is currently in a state of limbo as debates continue over who is going to pick up the office - Arts and Sciences or the Office of Student Affairs. Women's programs that have done well in the past are facing serious problems because of budget cutbacks.

The Skeggs Lecture Series

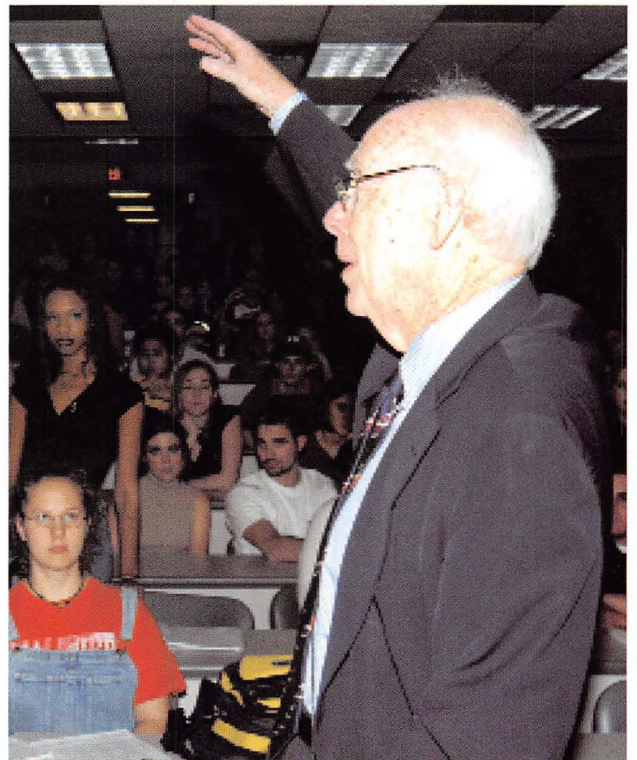

Pam Palumbo, associate director of Events Management, recalled that the announcement of **Toni Morrison** as a speaker “caused such a stir” on campus that within three hours of their release, the tickets allocated for the Morrison lecture were gone. The Pulitzer Prize-winning author lectured to a capacity crowd at Powers Auditorium in September of 2003, and held a smaller session for a select group of YSU students.

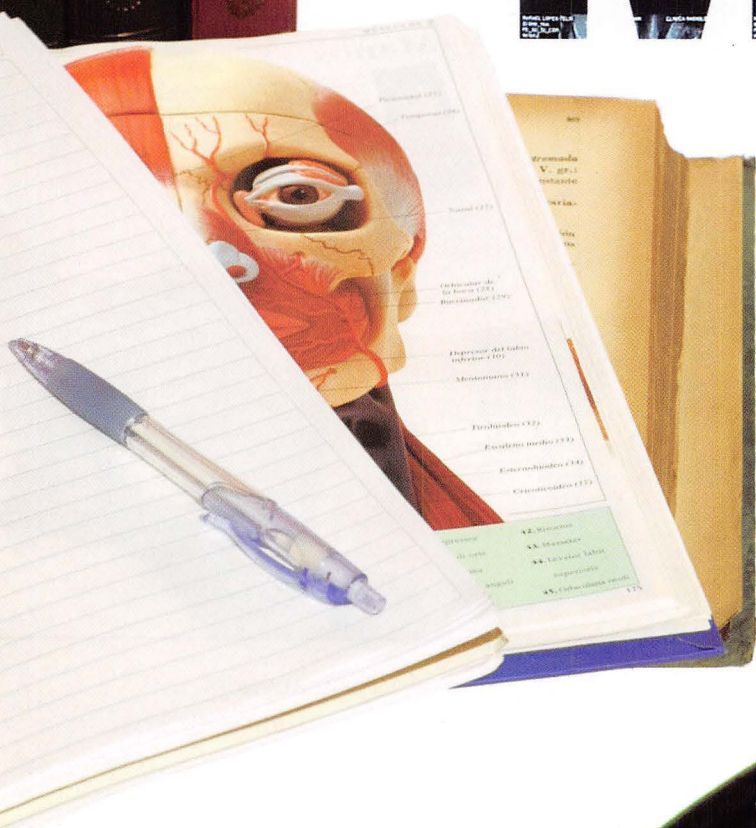

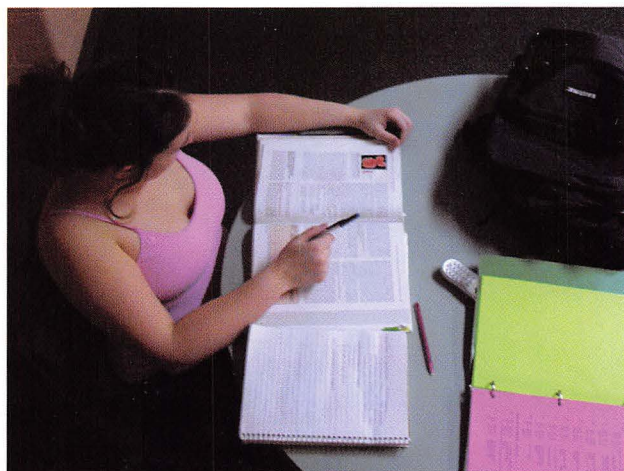
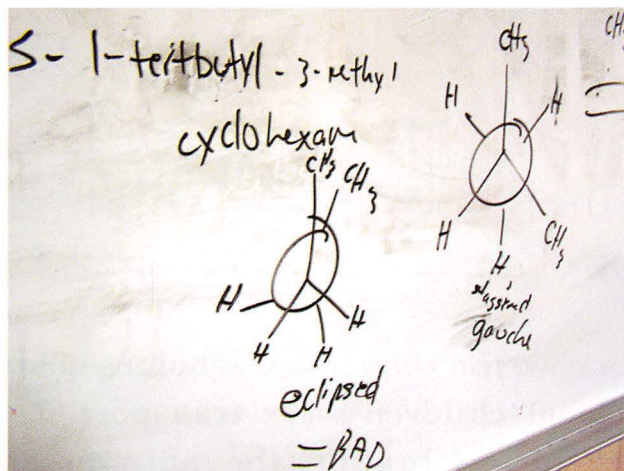

On an accelerated path to become doctors, two weeks after high school graduation, classes resume for students enrolled in the Northeast Ohio Universities College of Medicine program.

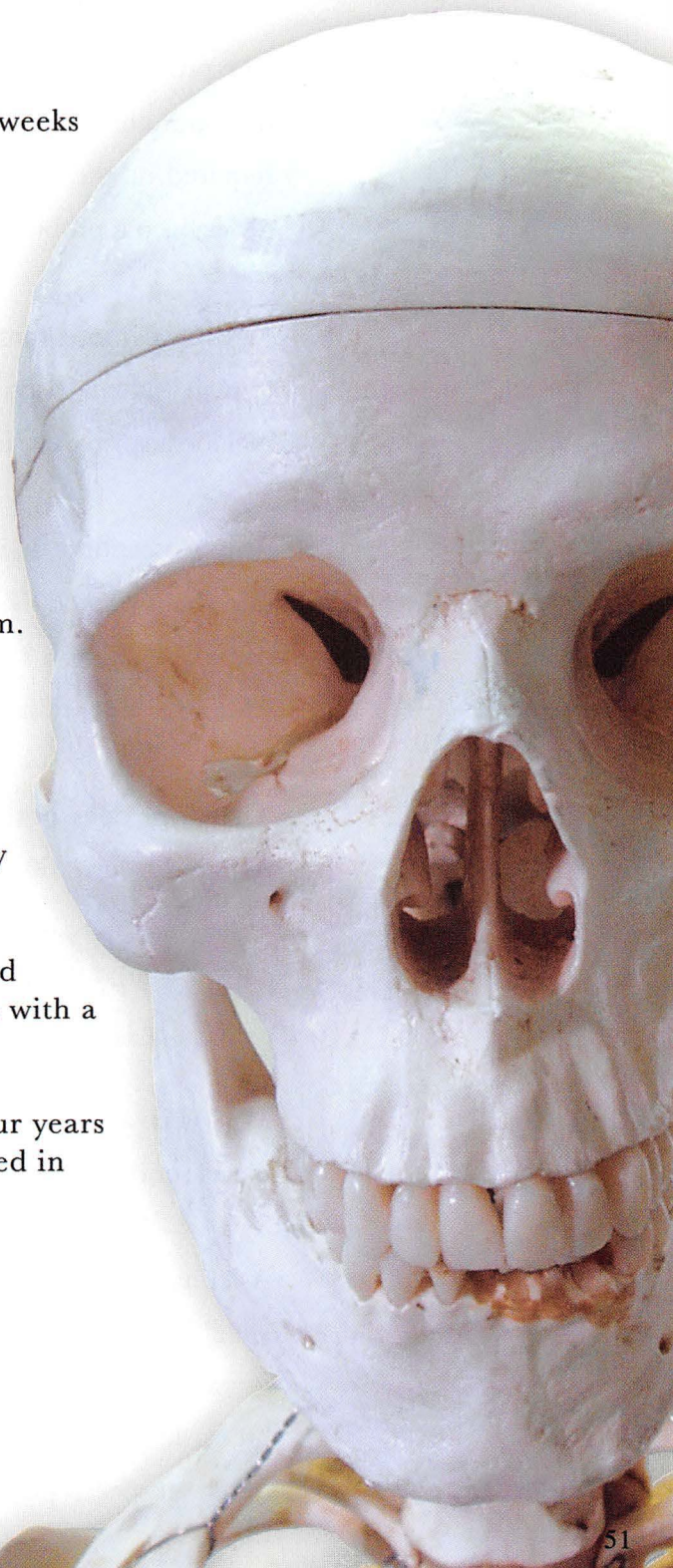
Instead of enjoying time off in the warm weather, NEOUCOM students spend summer nose-deep in books studying cellular biology and biomathematics in study sessions that last at least six hours.

Ninety-three students were enrolled during the 2003 to 2004 academic year and took part in the two-phase program.

Jennifer Board, B.S./M.D. and coordinator and adviser to the NEOUCOM students, said the first phase begins at one of three local universities: YSU, Kent State University and the University of Akron.

Students carry heavy class loads and attend school for two to three years, then graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree.

The second phase of the program consists of four years of medical school. NEOUCOM campus is located in Rootstown.

For the second year in a row, the University Scholars hosted the “Fall Festival” where local children were transported to the dormitory for a night of celebrating the autumn season.

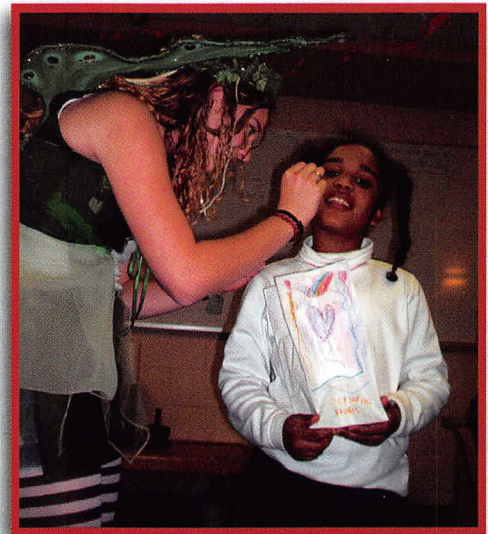
“We have more than enough people willing to donate time and resources to the festival,” Hiznay said. “So much so that we are thinking of expanding the program to include a spring version as well.”

They’re doing it for the kids.”

Projects like Shantytown, Make a Difference Day, Relay for Life, Up ‘til Dawn, the MS Walk, and Habitat for Humanity see scholar participation each year while others have found their niche volunteering in community schools and mentoring programs.

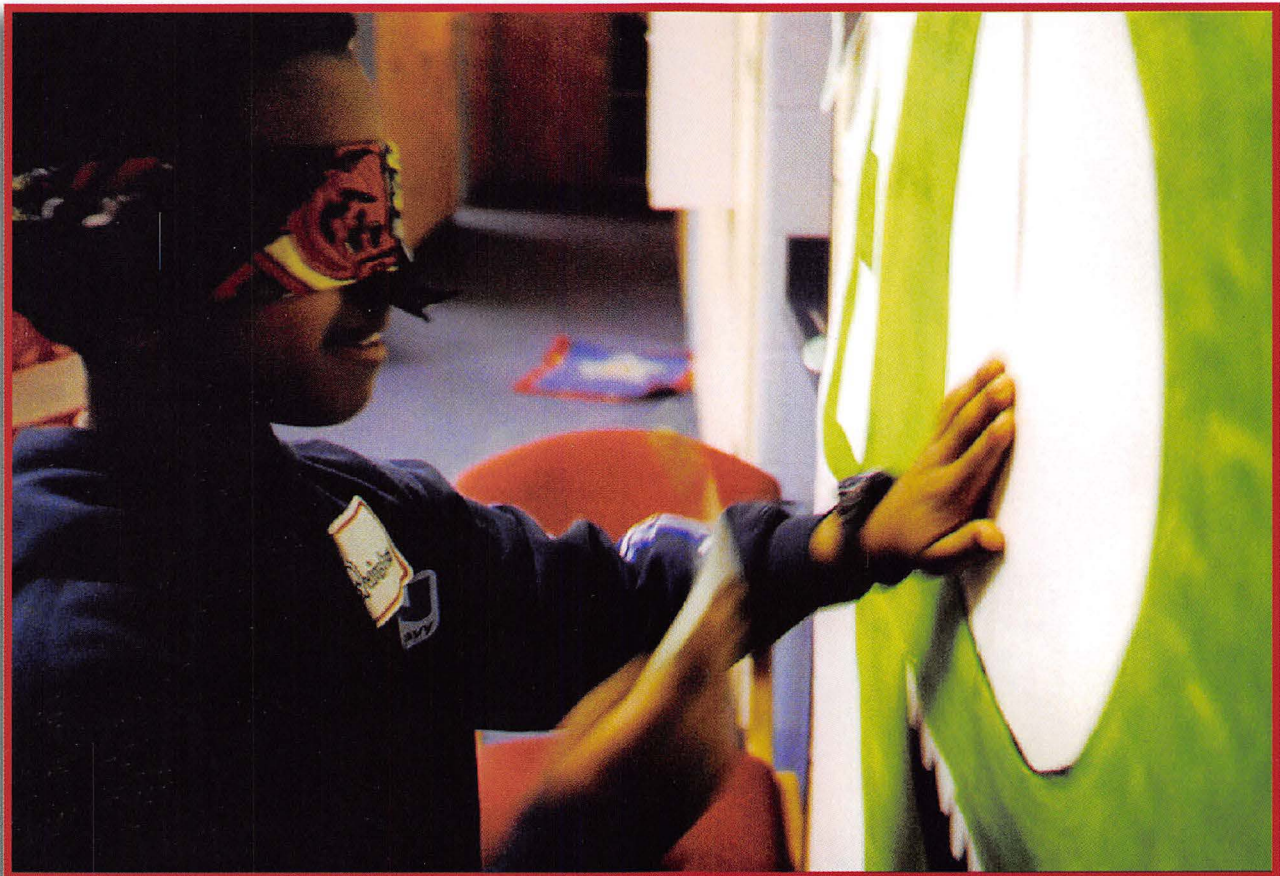

ROTC participates in many activities throughout the year such as Ranger Challenge, a national competition that takes place at Fort Knox. Events include a rope bridge construction, marksmanship, and grenade assault.

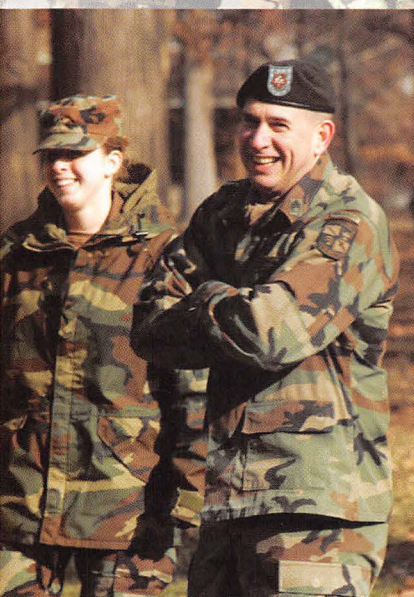
However, ROTC is better known on YSU's campus as the "Cannon Crew" at football games, firing the cannon for each touchdown and field goal, and then marking out the score with push-ups. Souder insists that ROTC is, "the best course you can take in school," because cadets learn to make quick decisions and become motivated.

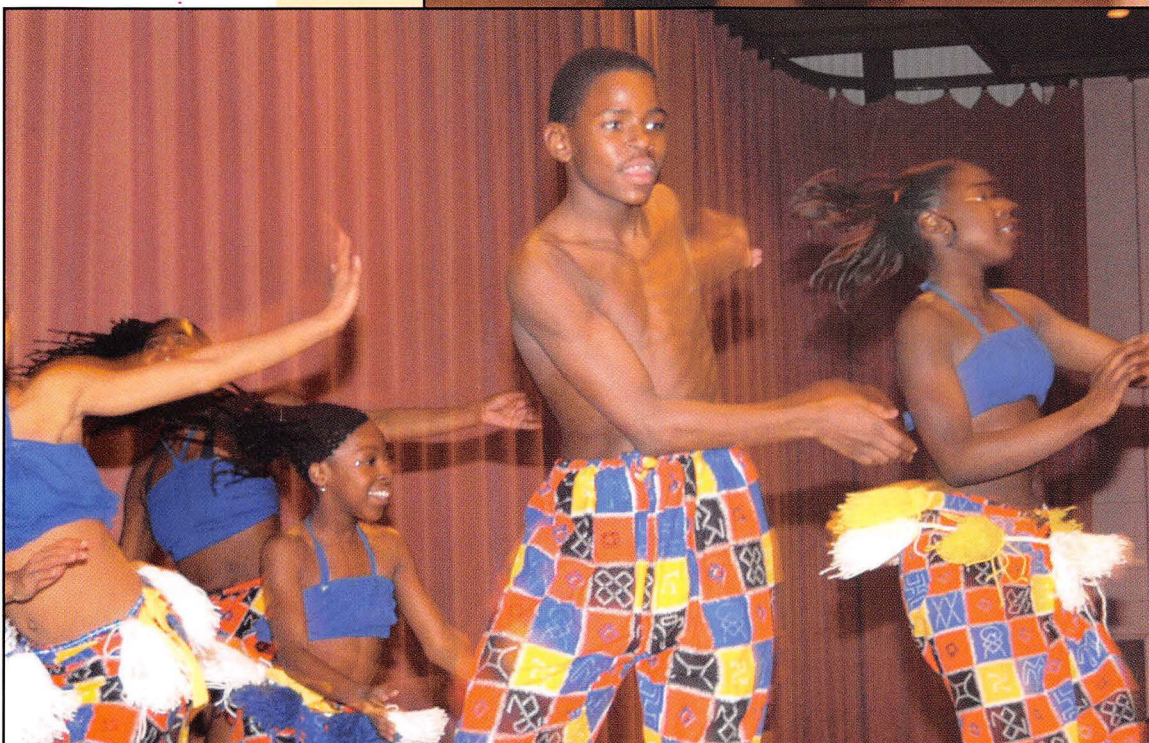
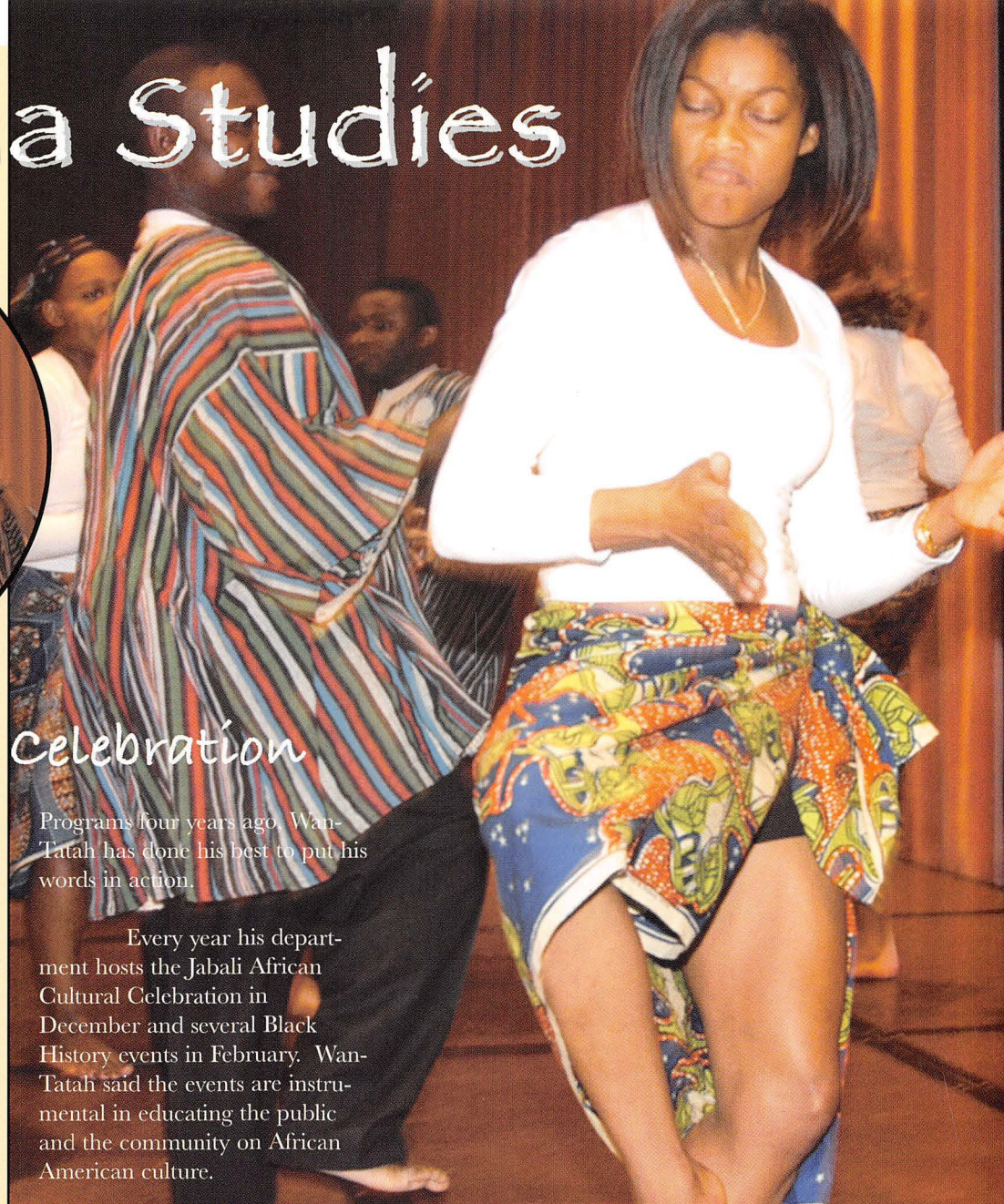

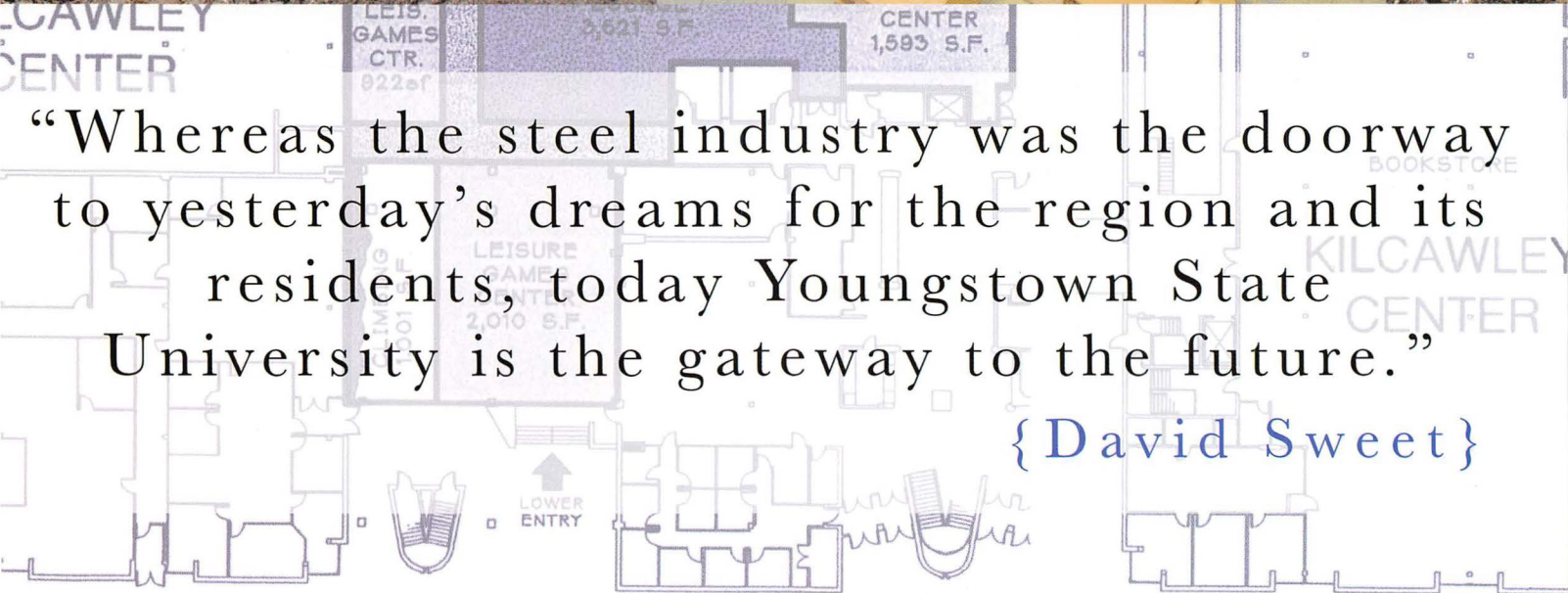
Since becoming the director of the Africana Studies

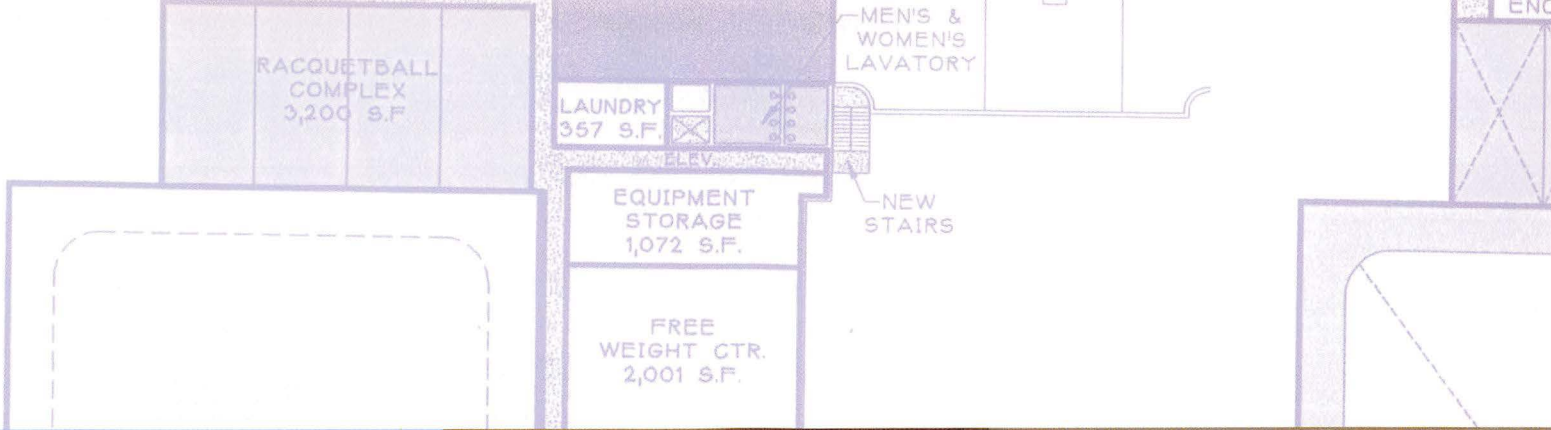

When President Sweet announced plans to build the \$12 million Center for Health and Wellness, the community quickly responded with generous donations.

Center For Student Progress

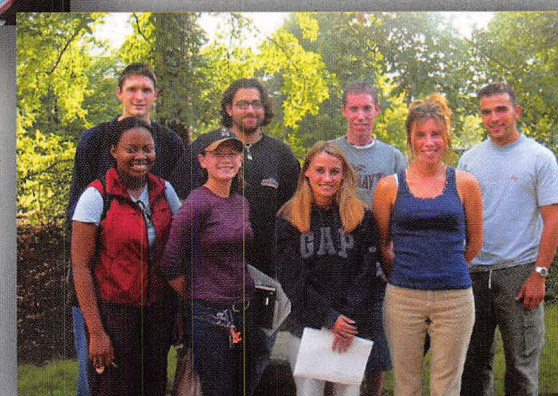
It is the place for the lost, the confused, the worried and the troubled.

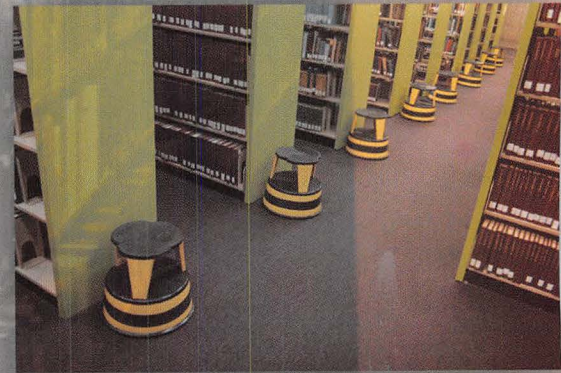


Maag Library: Keeping

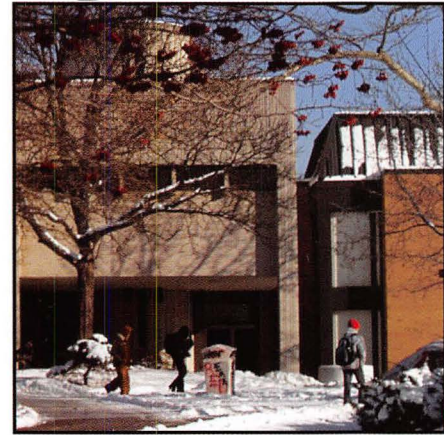
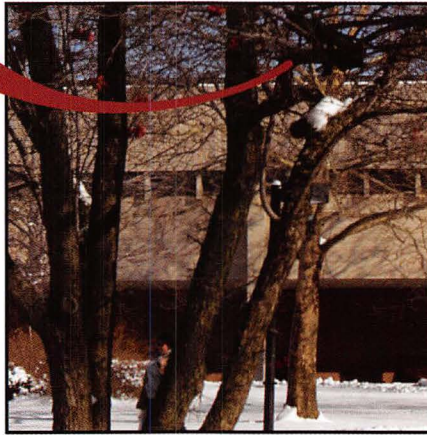
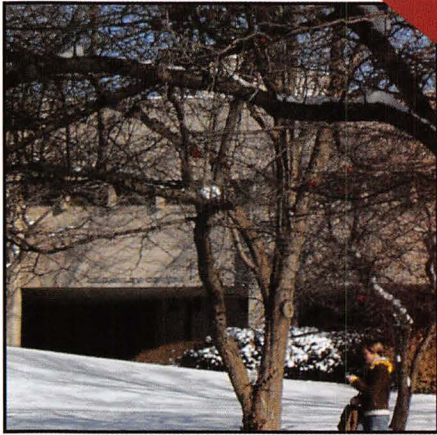
If officials are satisfied with how the pilot is received, wireless laptops in all buildings across campus could be available as early as next year.

Kobulnicky said students and faculty must have a CUE-mail account with the university and present their YSU ID with their library code to borrow one of the 20 available laptops.

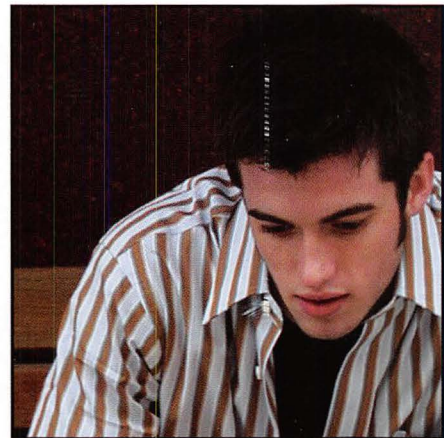
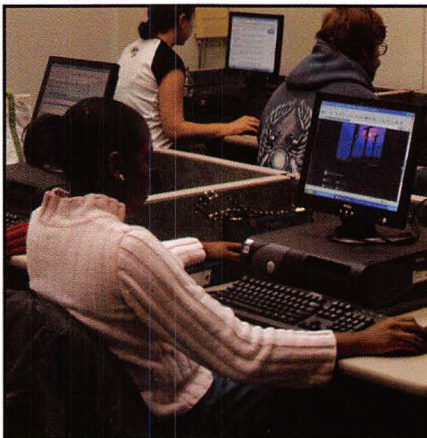
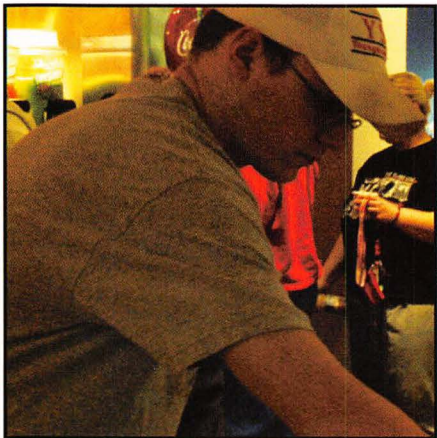

The Ward Beecher Planetarium features several free programs each year to encourage community members, both young and old, to attend.

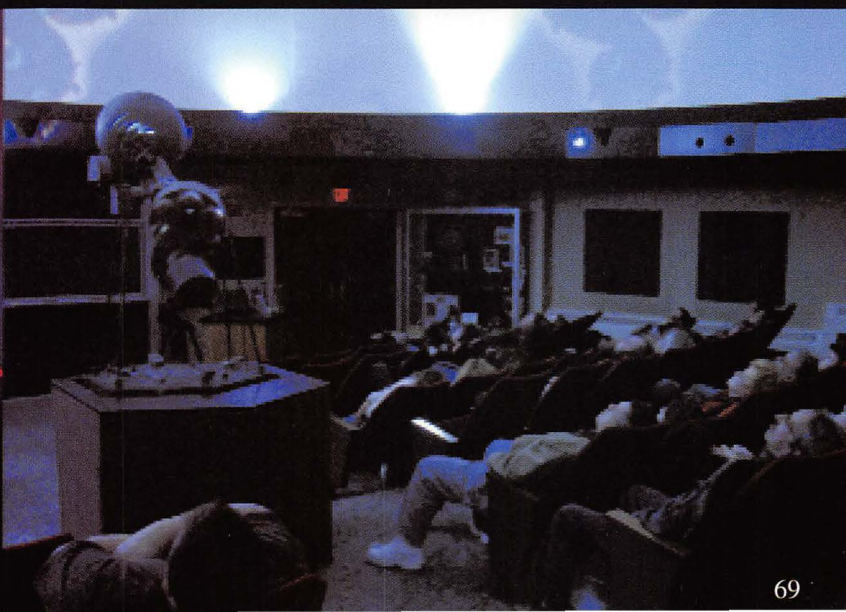
Mars Live will cover the exploration of our red neighbor - its history and its science.

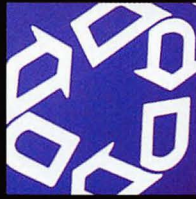
The whole endeavor cost \$22 million.

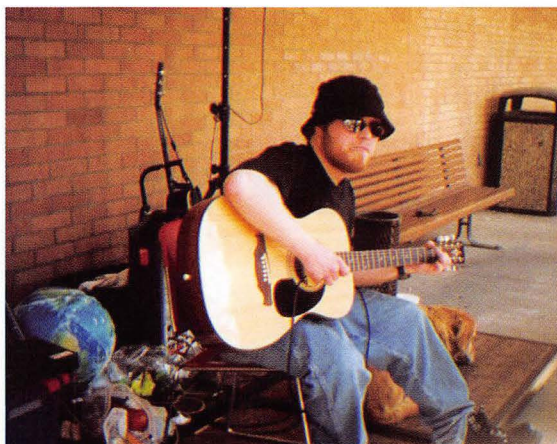

“Youngstown is not an environmentally focused city, but I think that makes it all the more important that we keep doing what we’re doing and trying to make things better.”



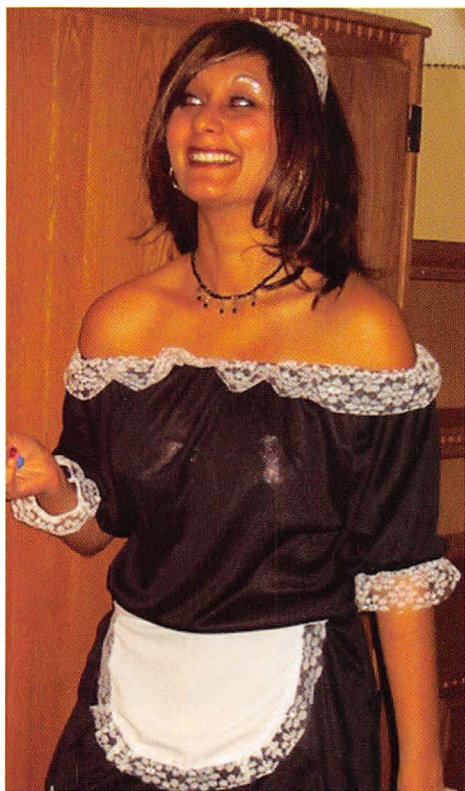

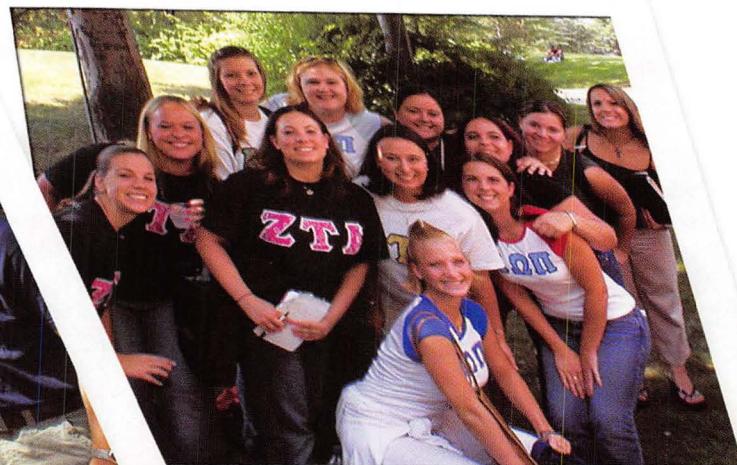
During finals, RHA worked with Wood Dining Services to provide students with a place to go for a place to study and to grab a late night snack by opening up Noodles and Christman for the residents.

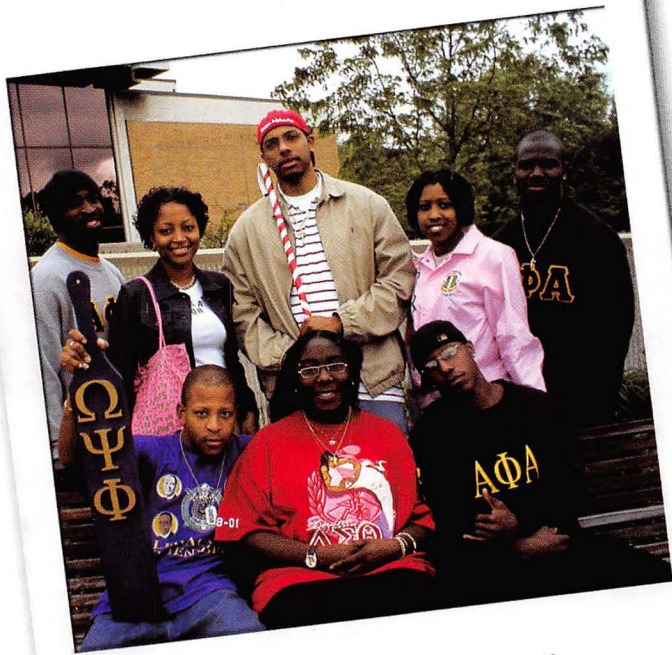

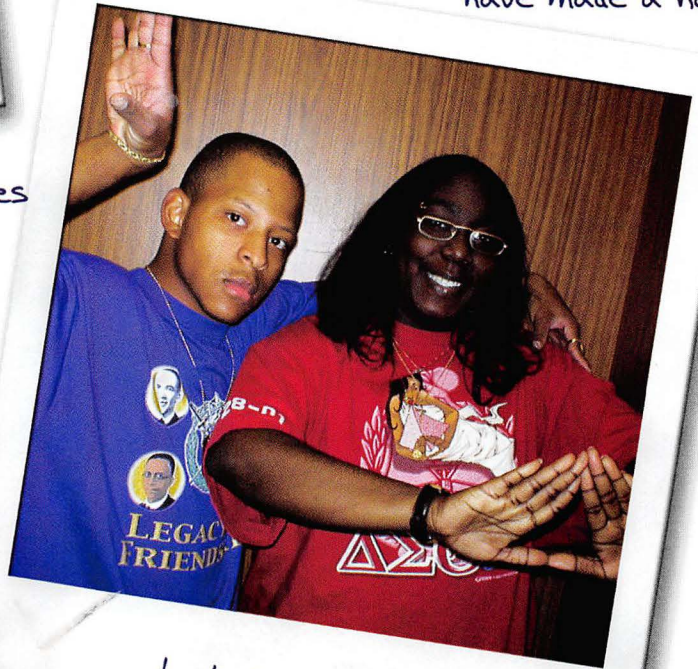

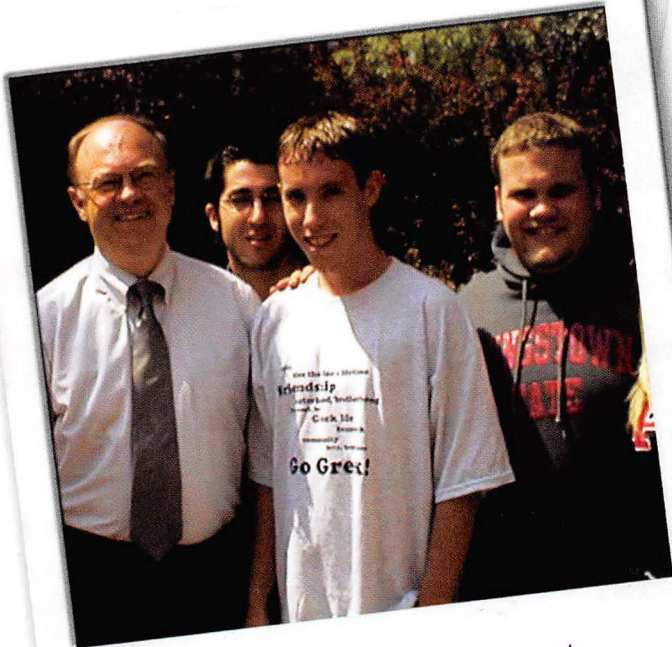
for themselves

One of its best-known events on campus, however, is their spring drag show in Kilcawley Center, which serves as a fundraiser for local charities.



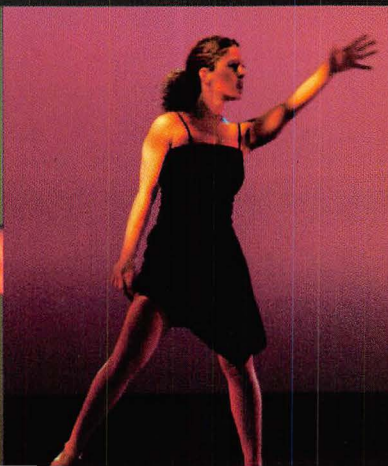

"By the end of the year, the last four games, we were decimated by injuries, and because of that we were over-matched," said Russ Houser, YSU assistant coach.

this year," Heacock said. "Our biggest departures in the future are on both lines. Add that to the injuries we sustained last year, I think we took care of our needs."

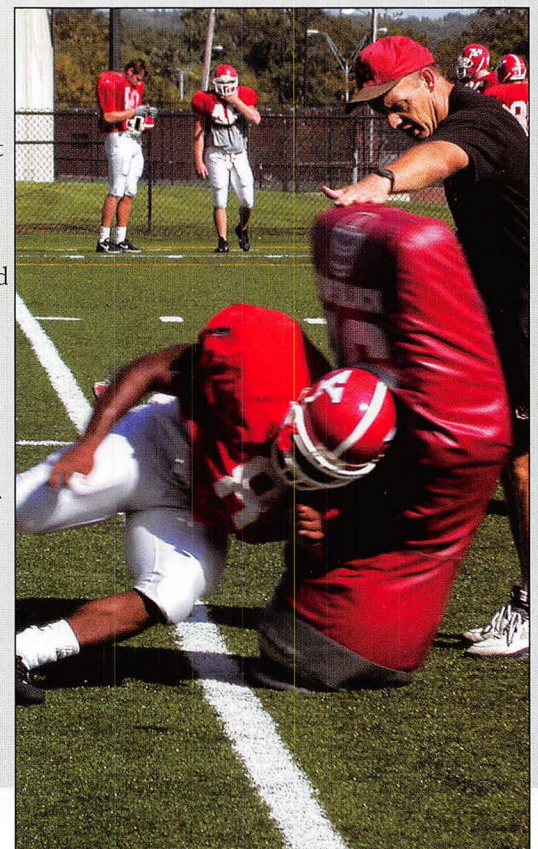
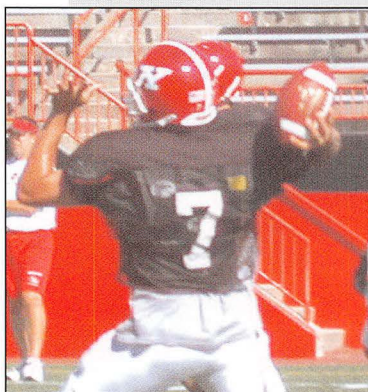
Heacock said he doesn't expect all of the new players to contribute immediately, but he was excited about the class, which includes Ohio bred players as well as out-of-state transfers.

"These guys are our future at critical positions," Heacock said.

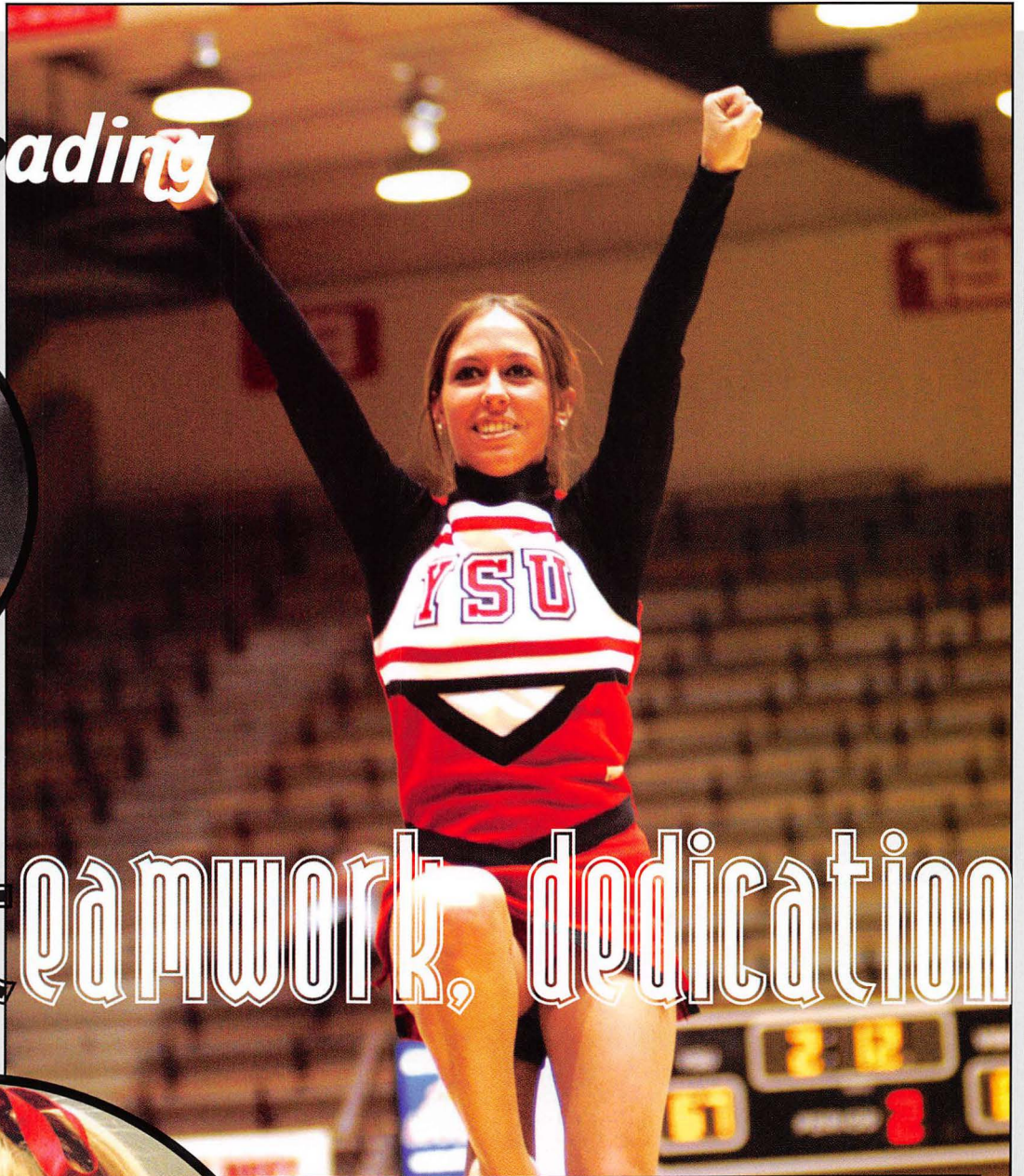
Reflecting on the 2002-2003 season, junior punter Joe Bishop said the highlight of the year was the team's undying commitment and effort

coupled with a bright optimism for the coming season.

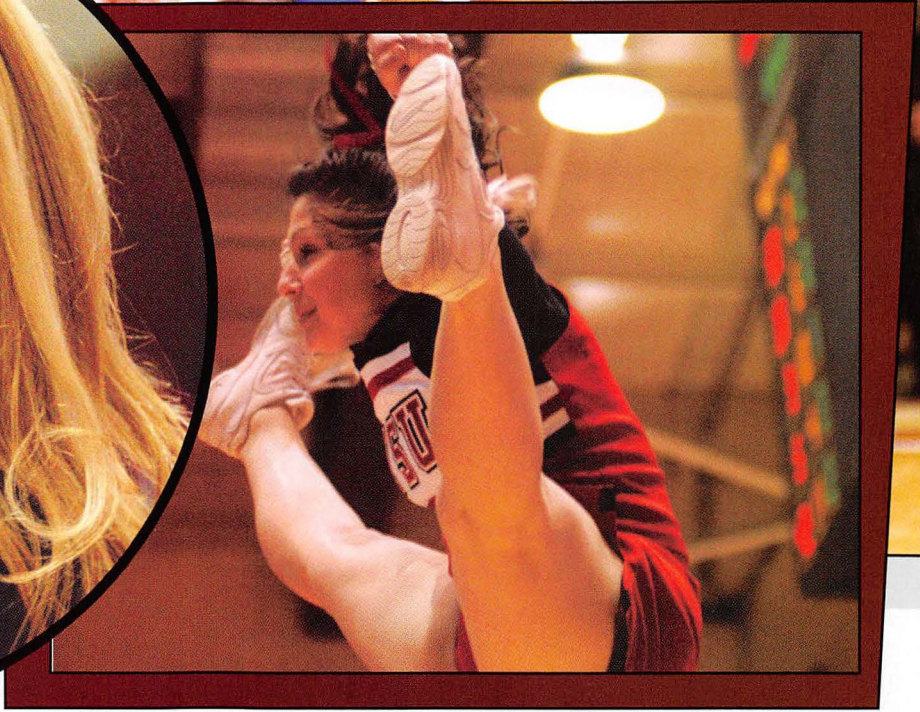
"The young players who contributed to the team make the future look bright even though the season did not have the result that we wanted," Bishop said.



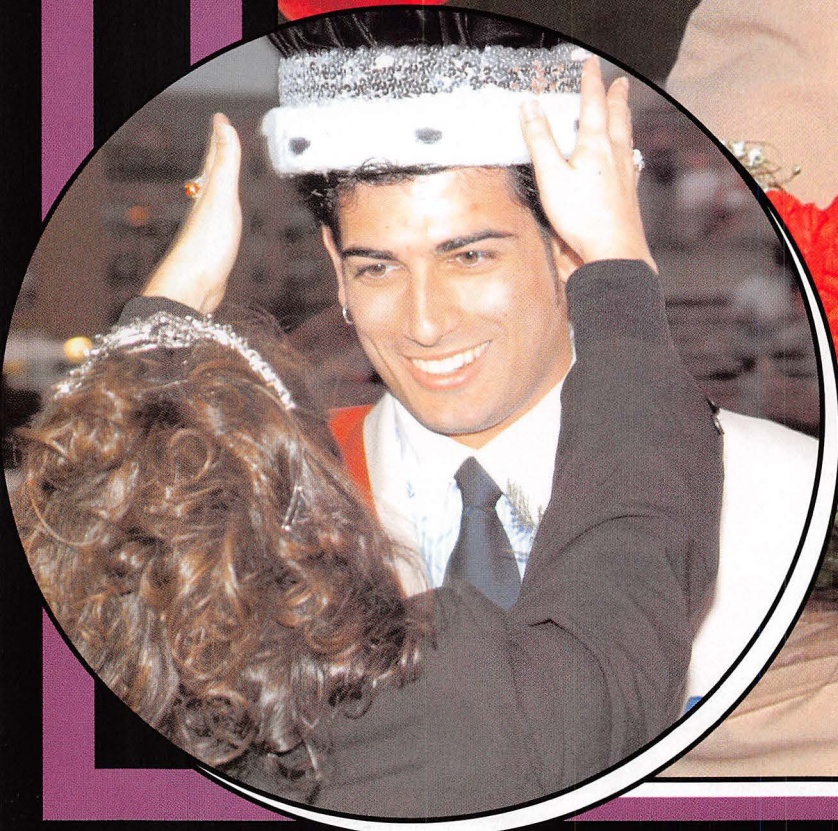

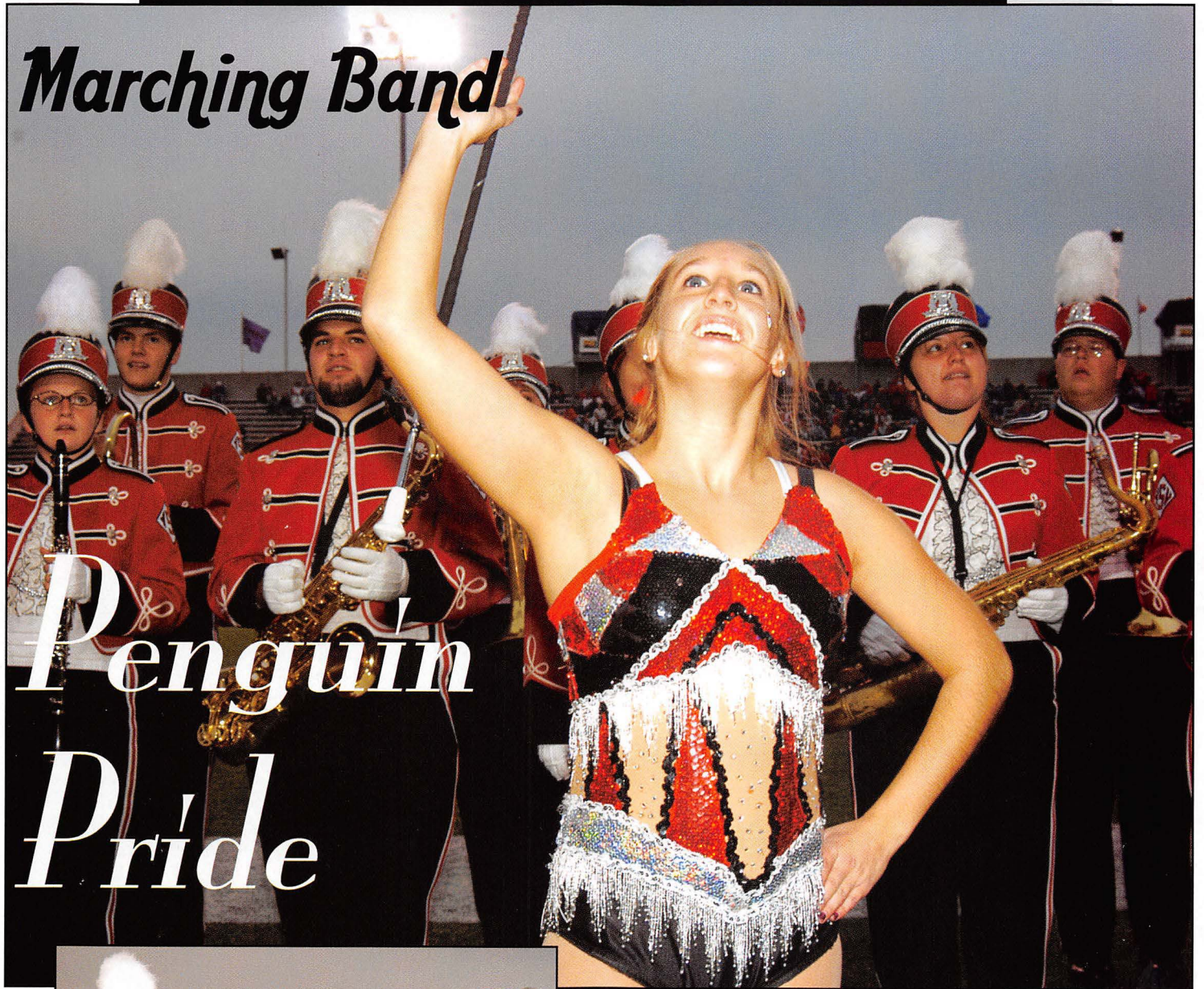
Eating contests, appearances by local TV personalities, caricature drawings and virtual NASCAR were also popular events during the week.

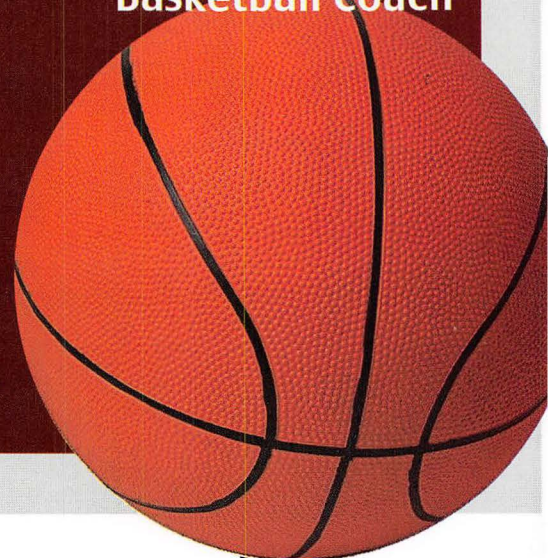




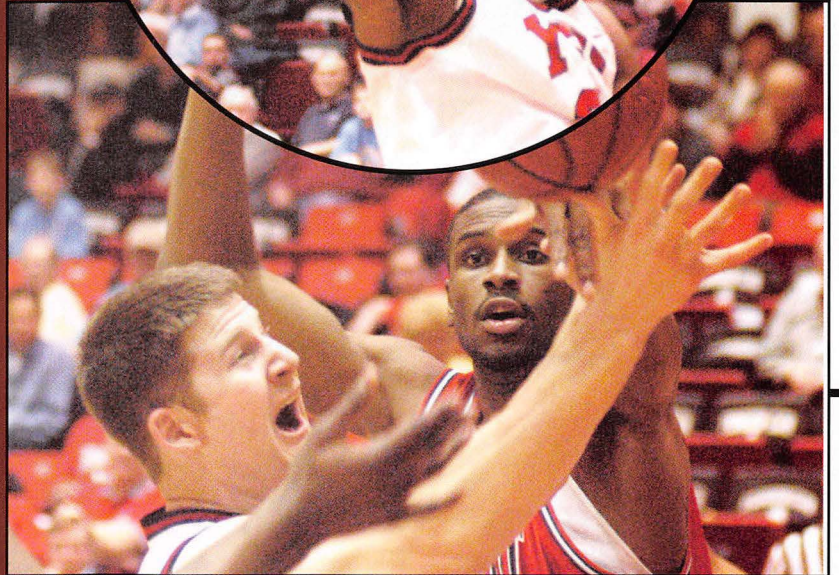
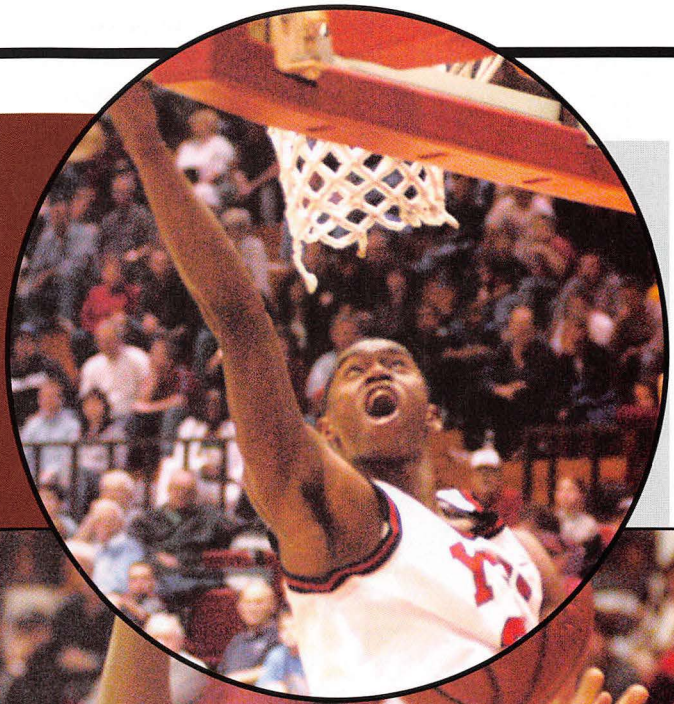

In his fifth season with Youngstown State, Robic found himself struggling to bring back the Penguin Power that drove the team to a winning record in the 2000-2001 season.

Though the team finished with a disappointing overall record of 8 wins and 19 losses, fans were impressed with the tenacity that the players displayed.

After suffering two quick losses to open the season, the team regained their focus and picked up an impressive win against St. Francis during which Penguin defense forced

31 turnovers.

The team then faced a series of close losses, but Coach Robic continued to commend them for sticking through it to the end.

Late in the season, the team was able to pick up three wins in a row against Cleveland State, Loyola and IPFW, helping them to clinch a seventh-seed in the Horizon League.

The Penguins ended their season with a loss to Butler in the opening round of the Horizon

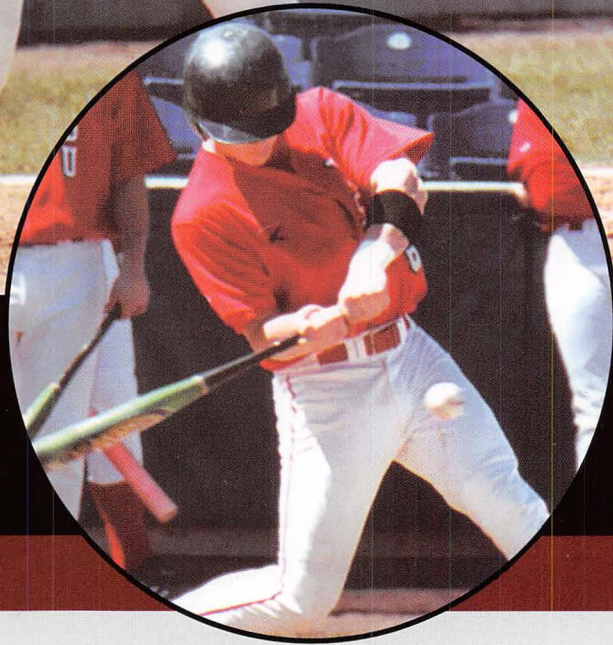
having played all five schools within the first month of the season.

“Our goal is to win the Horizon League,” head coach Mike Florak said. “There’s no question about it. That’s our number one priority.”

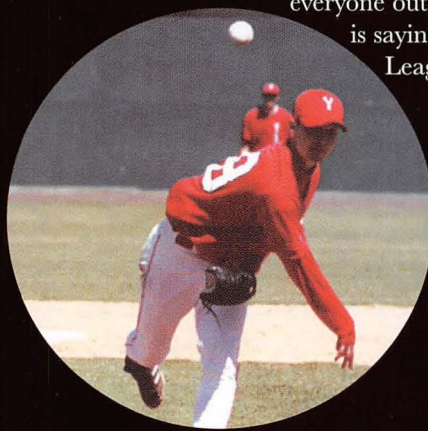
The Penguins, who are coming off their best year in Florak’s five-year tenure look to build off a 27 win campaign last year.

The team returned eight starters and also includes a strong pitching staff while also boasting a talented sophomore class that earned all-newcomer Horizon League honors last season.

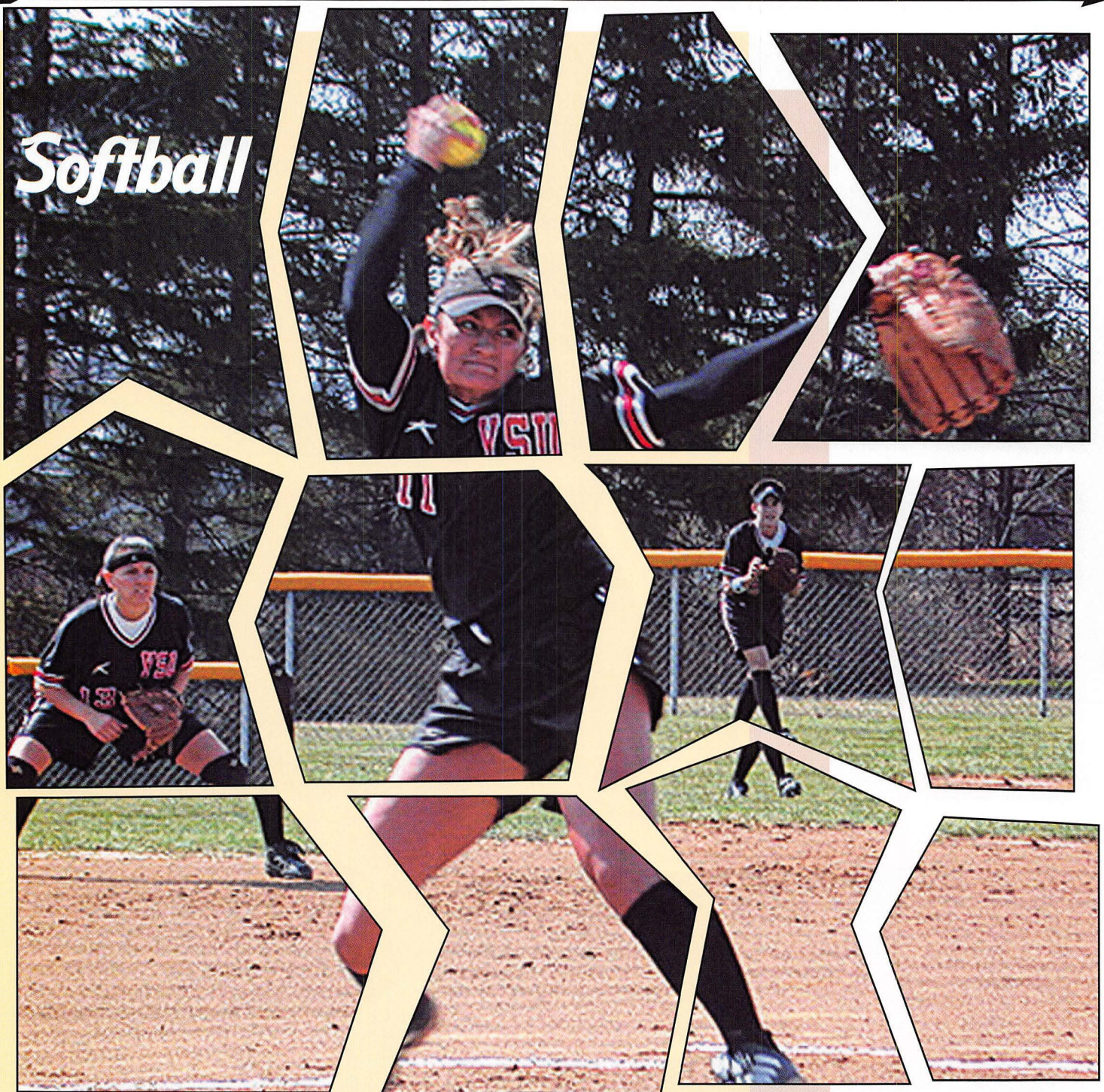

Looking to build off a school best 36-17-1 record, high expectations and annual success are starting to become a reality instead of an afterthought for the YSU softball team.

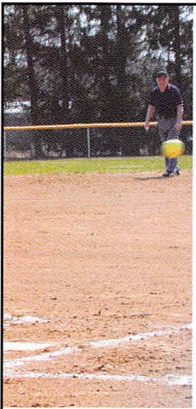

The team also broke five records and brought home eight Horizon League Champions at this year's Horizon League Championships that was held at DePauw University. The women's team won the championship, its first indoor conference title in eight years.

Freshman Danielle Bolt was named Horizon League Newcomer after breaking the record in the 60-meter dash, clocking in at 7.71.

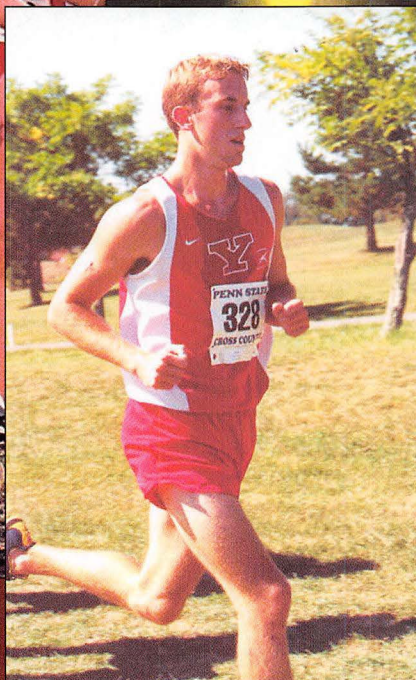
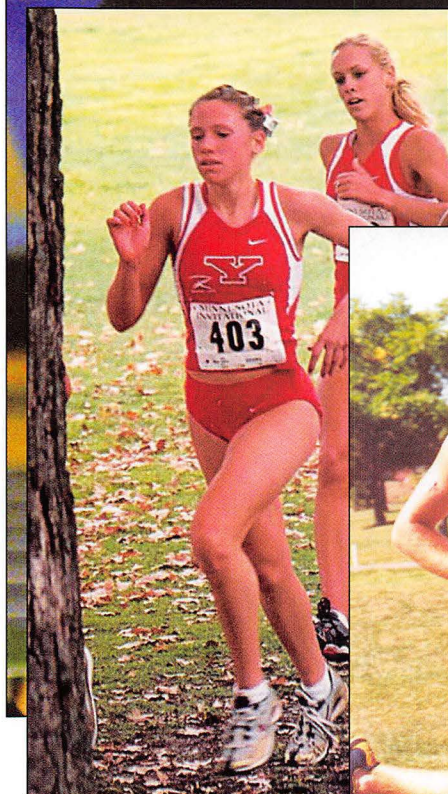
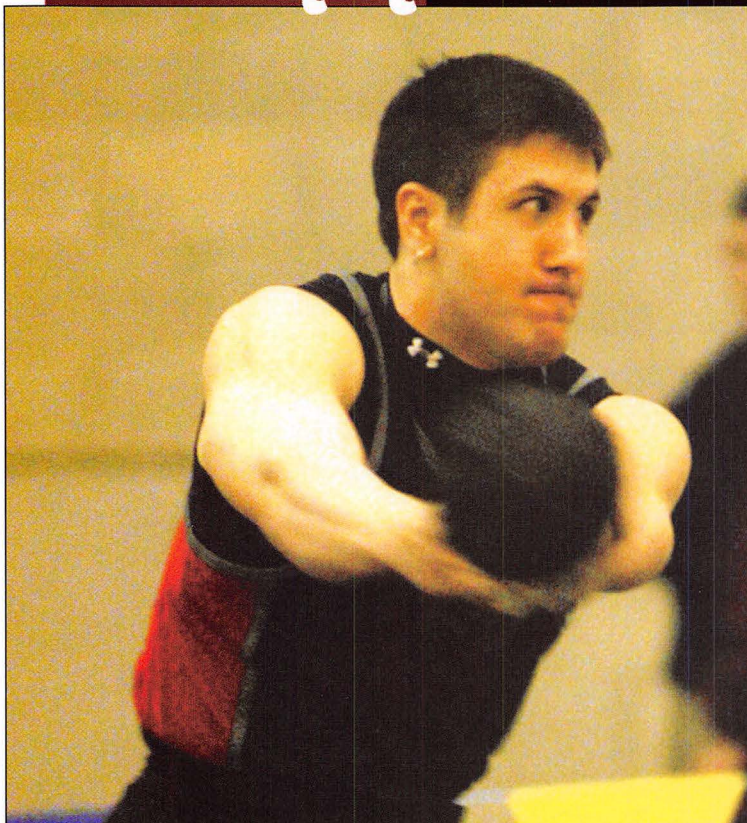
Junior Adam Lewis also set a record in the 60-meter hurdles, clocking in at 8.56 and earning him second place.

Although the team did not fare well in the tournament, Coach Conroy said he feels his players are the "most competitive" in their league.

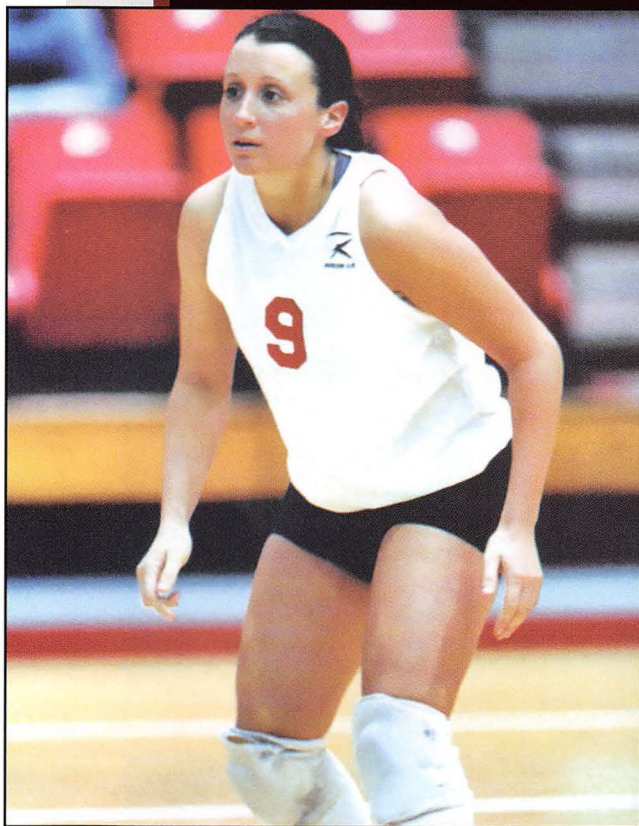
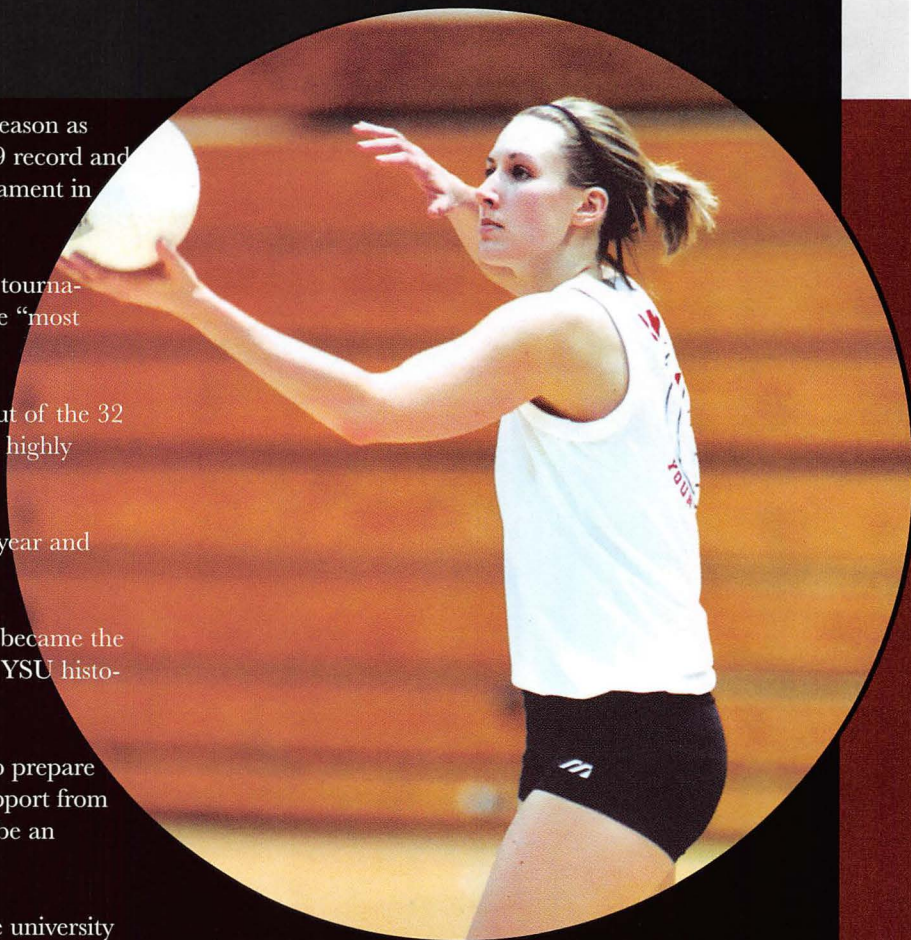
Conroy said the team was ranked eighth out of the 32 teams in the Horizon League. The team joined the highly competitive league in 2001.

Two players "spiked" the competition this year and etched their names in the YSU record books.

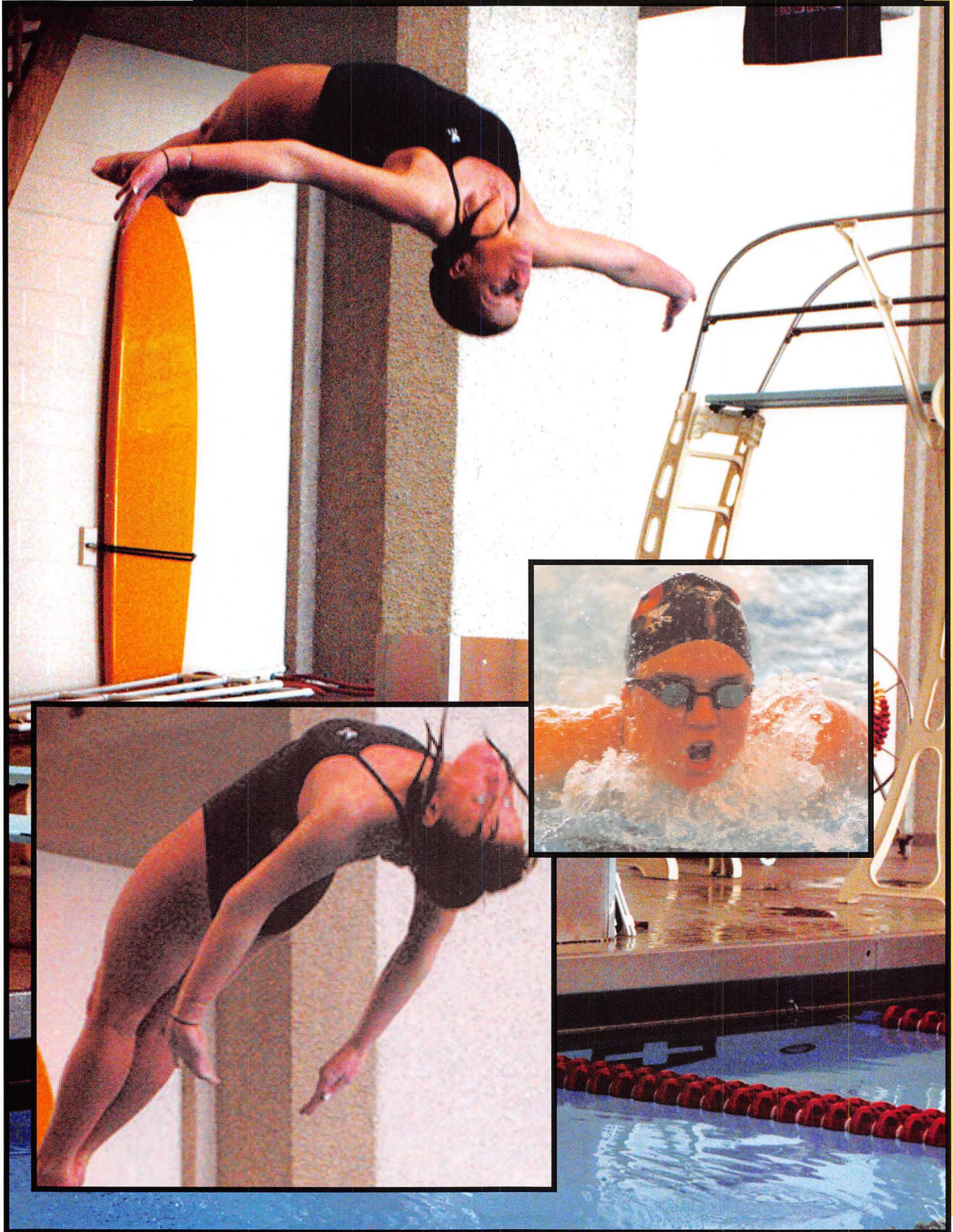
Seniors Colleen Royer and Annie Buscher became the seventh and eighth volleyball players respectively in YSU history to reach over 1,000 kills.

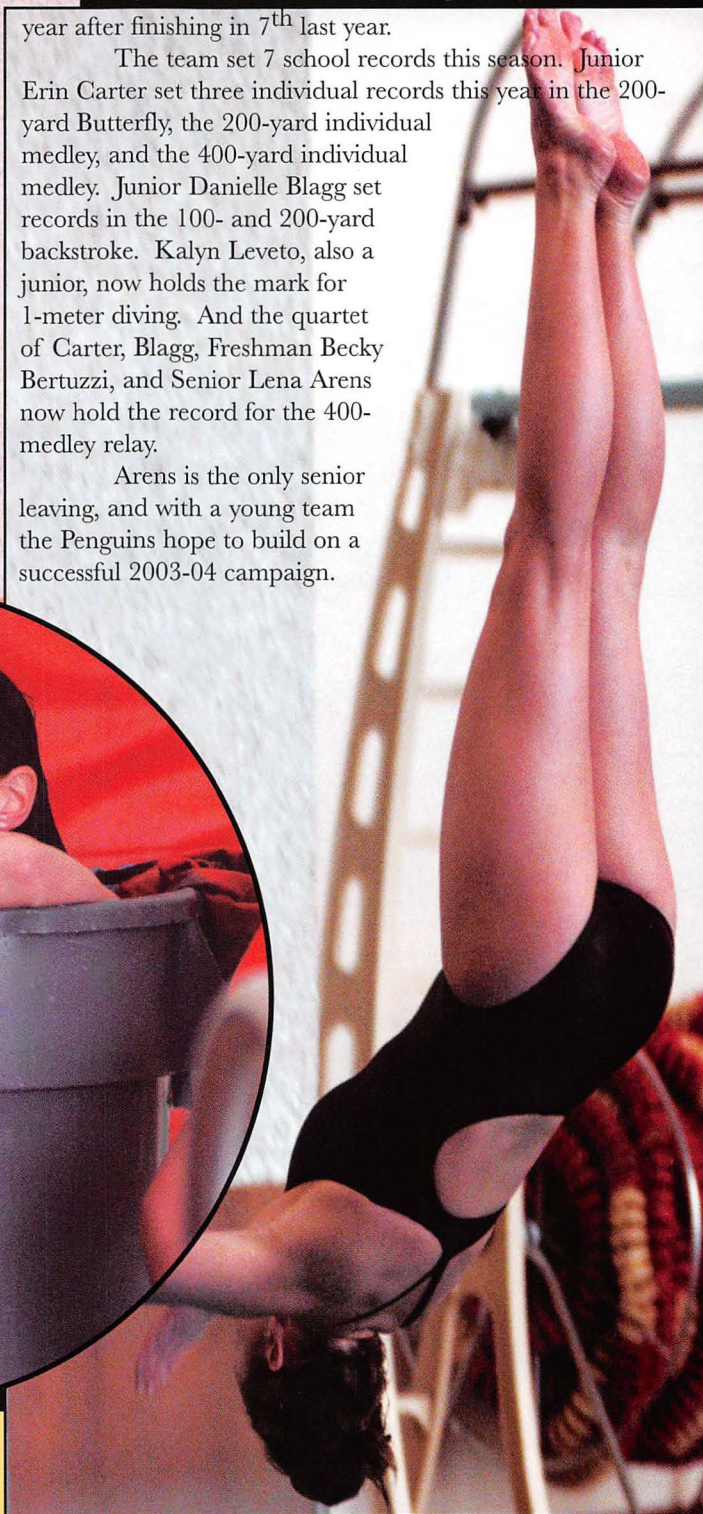


Breaking Records, Setting the Standard

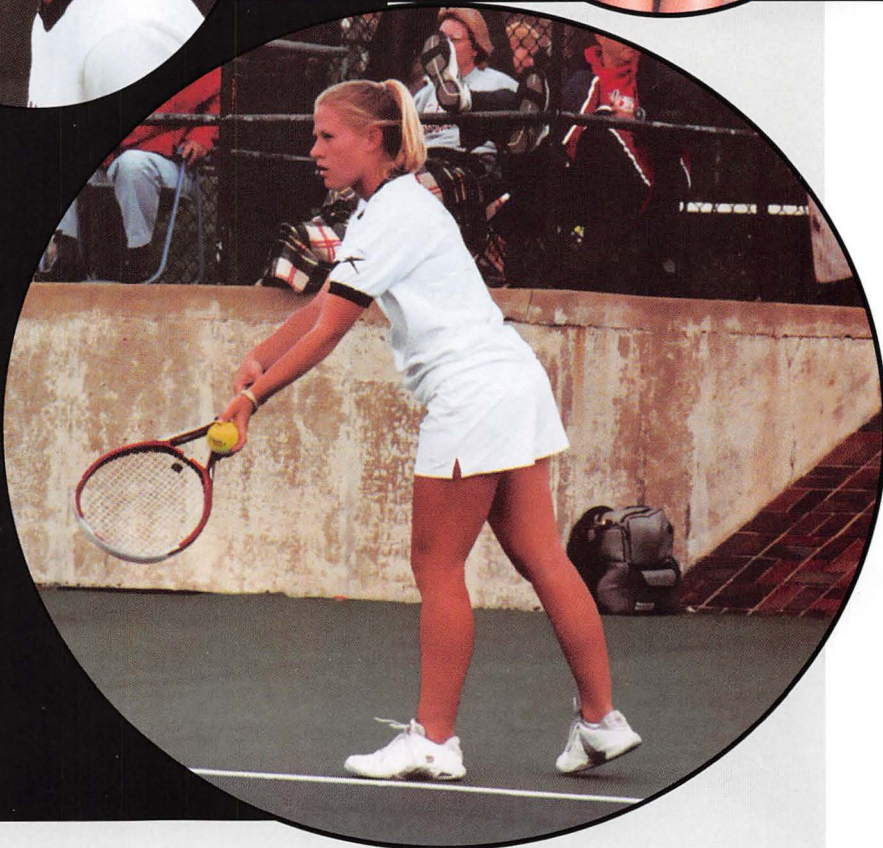
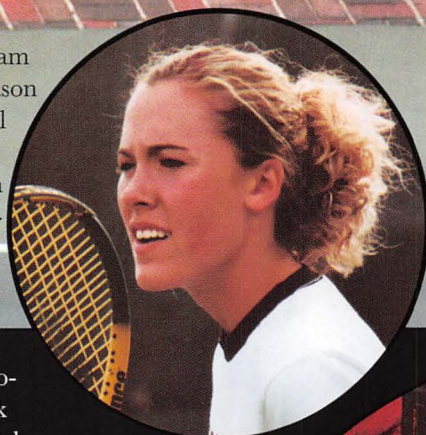
Women's Tennis

A Taste of What's to Come

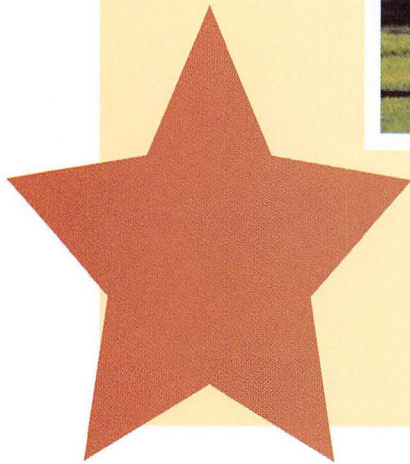
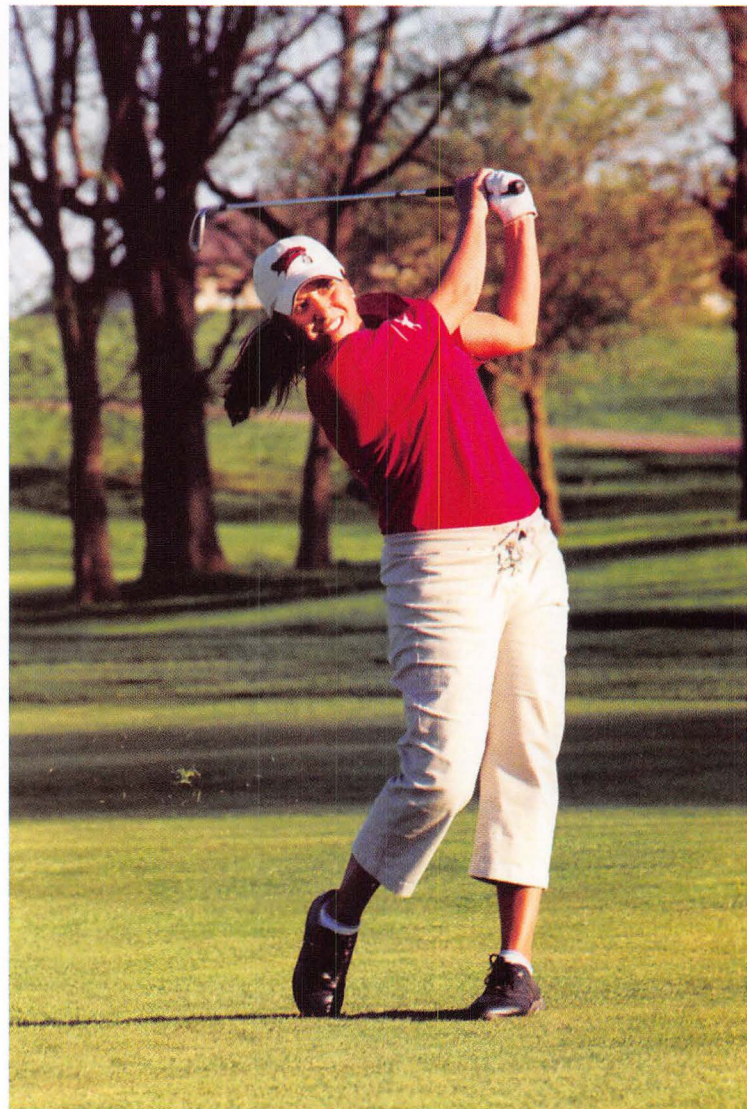

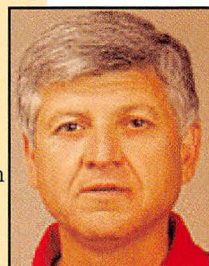

"We did a 'little sisters' watch program where each player helped them out, telling them what to do and what not to do," said Gina Abruzzino, a YSU junior.

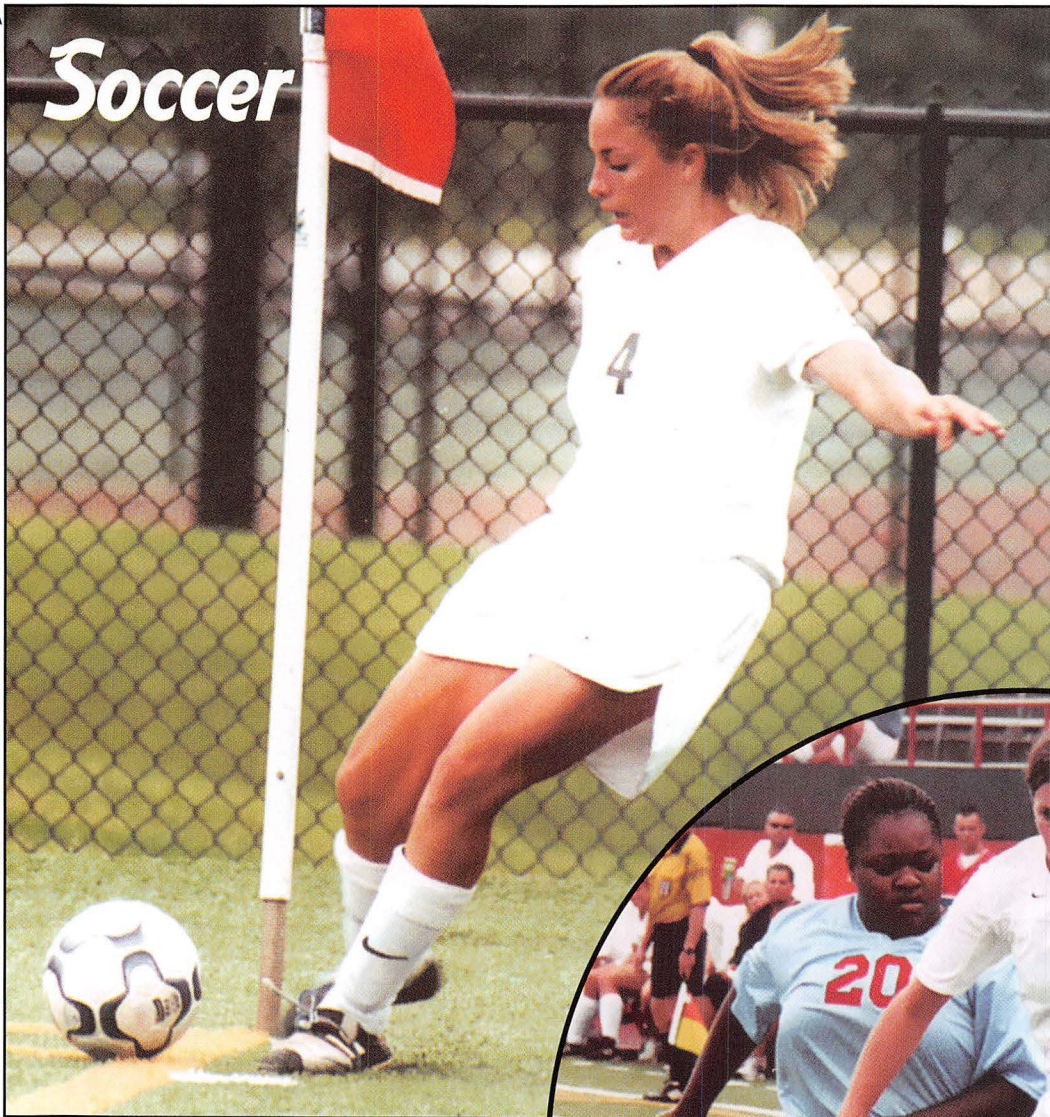
With constant help from Coach Rick Schwartz, the girls on the 2003-2004 team said they had a good year.

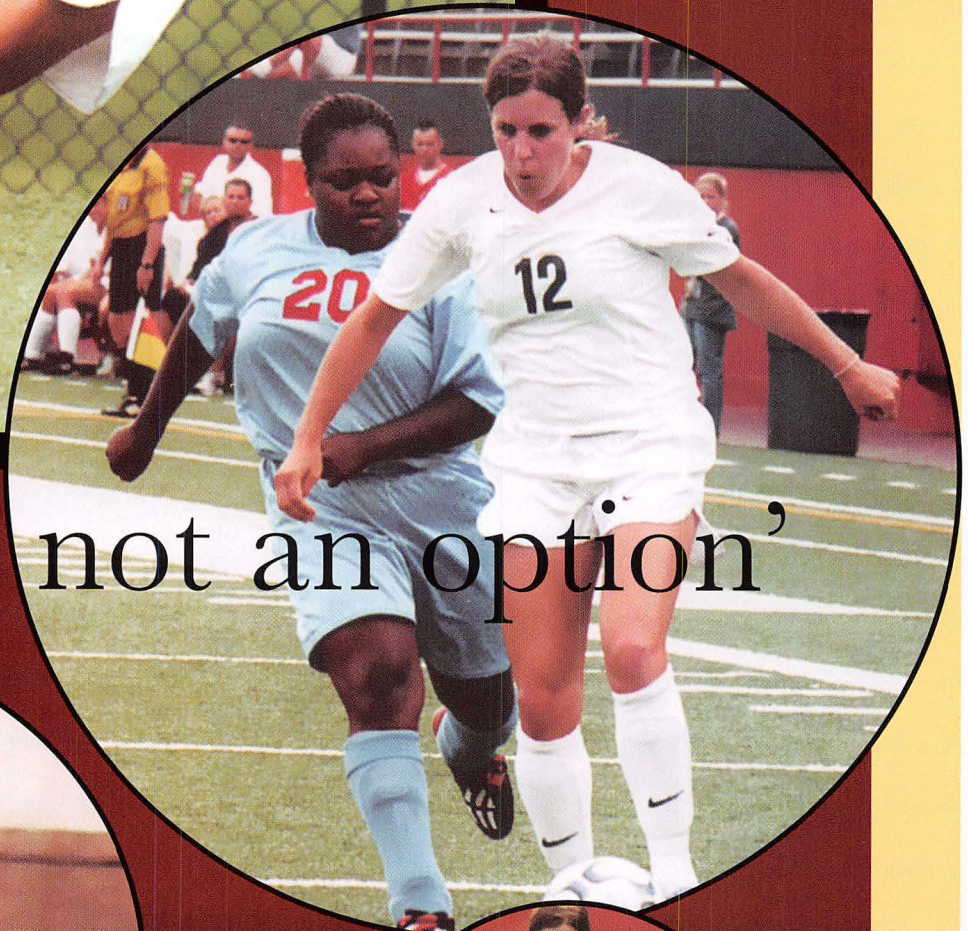


After running through three head coaches in eight years The Youngstown State University soccer team hopes to stabilize its program under new leadership.
