 - Designing a new orientation course for new freshmen. Resolution: No action will be taken until after Dr. Tinto's visit to campus.

 - 3. It has been proposed that the hub of the Ohio Library Network System be located at a university outside of Columbus. Dr. Humphrey will write a letter proposing that YSU be selected as the hub.
