1. Minutes of the September 6, 1994, meeting were approved.

2. Northeast Ohio Higher Education Covenant

There was extensive discussion of the generic articulation agreement distributed by Harold Yiannaki. There will be a signing ceremony for the "Northeast Ohio Higher Education Covenant" at Cleveland State University on Monday, October 31, 1994. Representatives from YSU will attend.

3. Revised Schedule of Operations

The revised Schedule of Operations was discussed as well as the timing change for the curriculum review process in the Faculty Senate. Curriculum changes, proposals, etc. should be developed during the Fall Quarter in order to ensure adequate time for the proposals to be considered by the University Curriculum committee and thus be approved by the Senate at the March meeting.

Raymond Dye and Harold Yiannaki discussed early registration activities planned by the Division of Student Affairs.

5. Electronic Campus

Gordon Mapley discussed the progress already made on the Electronic Campus project, as well as future plans.

WEEKEND DEGREE PROGRAM SURVEY



QUESTION #1: What times on the weekend would you be able to attend?

It appears that the best times to attend are Friday evening and all day Saturday. Other responses include one weekday evening per week and Saturday evening.




QUESTION #2: What terms would you be most likely to attend?

The resounding quarters of choice are during the regular school year. The rationale for these results comes from one who said that the summer is too hectic with vacations, little league, soccer and other extraneous activities that 80 pull attention away from class duties.

QUESTION #3: What format would you prefer to take weekend classes?

The two answers that seemed to be best received were the traditional ten week format and an accelerated format. The ten week format offers the instructors an advantage because they already have curriculum plans that coincide with this format.



QUESTION #4: What degrees would you be interested in completing?

Almost all the degrees that are offered at YSU were mentioned by at least one respondent. There were, however, some definite areas that received considerable interest. These are: BUSINESS/MANAGEMENT, ALL COMPUTER FIELDS, BUSINESS INFORMATION SYSTEMS, SOCIAL WORK, ALL ENGINEERING TECH MAJORS, PSYCHOLOGY, AND NURSING.

QUESTION #5: What are the credit courses you want to take?

About an equal number of respondents are interested in graduate and undergraduate courses. In both areas, business/management is the overwhelming choice for classes unrelated to attaining a major. About forty respondents decided not to answer this question with another ten saying they do not want to take any classes unrelated to a major. This shows that the majority of the respondents are hoping to achieve a degree, not just take classes.

QUESTION #6: What graduate degree would you be interested in completing?


Here again, more than half of the respondents did not answer this question. Of those who did answer, two major areas received the most support: BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION AND COUNSELING. The only other areas that bear mention in this category come from the schools of ARTS AND SCIENCE AND EDUCATION.

QUESTION #7: What non-credit courses are you interested in completing?

This question was left unanswered or answered in the negative by the majority of the respondents. Of those that were mentioned, many related to business classes (i.e. real estate, small business, and banking/finance) and the rest involved technical support.


QUESTION #8: What services would you use on the weekends?

All of the services mentioned in our survey, three received an over-whelming majority of votes for use on the weekends: LIBRARY, PARKING, AND THE BOOKSTORE. The other major spots of interest are the ADMISSIONS, REGISTRATION, FOOD SERVICES, FINANCIAL AID, AND THE XEROX/COPIERS.




QUESTION #9: What most appeals to you about the weekend program?

The two major responses to this question show a strong commitment to work and the family. Half of the responses said that the major benefit to this program is that it allows the individual to hold down a full time job while attending school. It also appears that child care will be easier for many to manage on the weekends rather than during the week.




Question #10: What concerns do you have with weekend courses?

The majority of those who answered this question did not foresee any problems with weekend courses. Nearly all of the concerns that were mentioned followed the concerns of most other new students to our campus. These include the time required to finish a degree and the overall quality of the education each student will receive.




QUESTION #11: Are you enrolled in another weekend program?

Only three of the respondents said that they are currently enrolled in some other weekend program.




QUESTION #12: Have you previously attended YSU?

Nearly two thirds of the respondents to this question have previously attended YSU. The other third's of the respondents have attended schools throughout our state and country.



QUESTION #13: Have you attended another school or university?

Nearly two thirds of the respondents to this question have not attended schools or universities. Of those respondents who have, many technical schools and colleges are represented.




QUESTION #14: How many hours have you completed in college classes?

As with many of the other questions on this survey, the respondents are as diverse as the people who are interested in this program. Just to give everyone a rough idea, respondents had as few as twelve hours completed or as many as multiple masters degrees in their chosen field of study. This would create an exciting learning environment for all in any weekend courses that are later implemented.

QUESTION #15: Do you know others who may be interested in this program?

The responses to this final question are half and half. Those who answered this question in the affirmative know of many who would be interested, not just one.



In summary, it appears that the idea of a weekend program is a good one. There is a decent amount of interest in a program of this type from those who are presently within the university and those who are anxious to begin the education process. Since beginning this survey, I have received many more through the mail from others interested in this program. As a precaution, I must also add that this survey does not follow any prescribed method to conform with the statistical nature of a random sample. Also, all of the respondents have not answered all of the questions. These two facts suggest that this survey is one that has been left to the individual curiosity of all the 92 respondents in this compilation.
