YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Youngstown State University's William Rayen School of Engineering and the Office of Continuing Education will offer a course for persons who are preparing to take the Fundamentals of Engineering examination on April 11, 1987.

"Fundamentals of Engineering Review" for the exam will be held from 9-11 a.m. Saturdays, beginning Jan. 10 and continuing through April 4.

The course fee is \$90, or \$75 for those registering prior to Dec. 27.

The course consists of a 24½ hour review of engineering fundamentals including: mathematics, statics, computer programming, electrical circuits and machines, electronics, dynamics, thermodynamics, engineering economics, strength of materials and fluid mechanics.

Instruction will be provided by the faculty of YSU's School of Engineering.
