This is down only slightly from the 15,026 students last fall, and just two less than estimated in a recent preliminary report. It is the twelfth consecutive year in which enrollment exceeded 15,000 students.

This fall's enrollment includes 9,480 full-time and 5,535 part-time students. Full-time students are those taking 12 or more credit hours.

The Full-Time Equivalent for Fall Quarter is 11,077. (FTE is the studentcredit hour formula used by the state to measure both part-time and full-time students into a full-time equation.)

Of the total student body of 15,015, there are 13,811 undergraduates and 1,204 graduate students; 7,459 are men and 7,556 are women.

There are 5,351 freshmen, 2,977 sophomores, 2,939 seniors and 2,544 juniors.

The student body includes 13,797 Ohioans and 1,218 from other states and approximately 50 other countries.

Fall enrollment by school or college shows 4,569 in the College of Applied Science and Technology; 4,520 in the College of Arts and Sciences; 1,725 in the Warren P. Williamson, Jr. School of Business Administration; 1,350 in the School of Education; 1,204 in the Graduate School; 833 in the William Rayen School of Engineering; and 814 in the College of Fine and Performing Arts.

A comparison of this quarter's class enrollment figures to those of the 1985 Fall Quarter shows senior class enrollment is 102.3 percent of last fall's figure; the junior class, 101.7 percent; sophomore, 98.1 percent; and freshmen, 97.6 percent.
