President Neil D. Humphrey, who announced the figure today in a report prepared for the Ohio Board of Regents, emphasized that this unofficial count exceeds the projection of 14,900 used to prepare the University's \$66.6 million budget for fiscal 1986-87.

Official enrollment at YSU last fall was 15,026.

If this fall's preliminary figure holds up for the official count, usually made after the 14th day of classes, it will be the 12th consecutive year that the University's fall total has been above 15,000 students.

The YSU record was a student body of 15,898 in 1978.

The Summer Quarter enrollment of 6,064 was the second highest in history, just behind the 6,100 recorded in the summer of 1983.
