YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Ivan C. Karp of New York, famed art dealer, author, lecturer and critic, will speak at 4 p.m. Oct. 8 at the Butler Institute of American Art at the third annual "Symposia on American Art" presented by the Butler and Youngstown State University's Art Department.

The program is free and open to the public.

The YSU/Butler Symposia Series annually brings artists, art historians and critics to address important contemporary issues in American art.

It is sponsored by the interface program between the University's Art Department and Butler Institute, and is made possible by a grant from the Youngstown State University Foundation.

Karp opened his O.K. Harris Works of Art Gallery in New York City in 1969 after serving as an art dealer and assistant director for other galleries. He has also been an art and film critic, film editor and art history instructor. He has numerous articles and short stories published and has lectured throughout the U.S. at universities, museums and art centers. He has also appeared on many radio and television shows.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Dr. Ernest R. Nordtvedt has assumed the post of acting dean of Youngstown State University's Warren P. Williamson, Jr. School of Business Administration.

He succeeds Dr. H. Robert Dodge, who headed the school since 1979 and has returned to the classroom to resume full-time teaching.

Since 1979, Dr. Nordtvedt, 56, has been professor and chairman of the Department of Management, Marketing and Legal Studies in the Father Joseph Butt College of Business at Loyola University, New Orleans.

He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Western Washington University, Bellingham, Wash., in 1952. As a naval aviation officer, he obtained a Master of Science degree from Purdue University, where he was on the faculty, and another master's in science from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Troy, N.Y., on a Navy Department Master's Study Program Award. He also graduated with distinction in 1974 from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces, Washington, D.C., and in 1975 he earned a doctorate in Business Administration from George Washington University in Washington.

Dr. Nordtvedt's professional posts include: research and development project manager, Naval Air Development Center, Warminster, Pa. (1967-69), commanding officer of a Naval patrol squadron (1968-71); program planner and controller, Bureau of Naval Personnel, Washington (1971-73 and 1975-77 respectively); and director of finance and controller, Mare Island Naval Shipyard, Vallejo, Calif. (1977-79).

At Loyola, Dr. Nordtvedt established a Small Business Development Center, working with the Small Business Administration and Louisiana Department of Commerce. He has done management and small business consulting, and has been involved in teaching and management of academic programs under American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business accreditation.

He has also been active in many university governmental committees, including Faculty Senate, budget, curriculum, standards and admissions, and the Council for Academic Planning. He was selected by Student Government Association as an "Outstanding Professor" in 1983 and received the "Outstanding Faculty Community Service Award" in 1985.

Dr. Nordtvedt has also had many papers and articles published and has presented reports and studies at numerous national conferences.

He and his wife have two married children.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Youngstown State University's Office of Continuing Education will offer a six-week course in "Airbrush Rendering and Photo Retouching."

Participants will acquire skill in the application of the airbrush using transparent and opaque colors and will learn airbrush techniques used in figure, mechanical, advertising, architectural and technical illustrations. They will also learn airbrushing in photo retouching.

Donald E. Wright, art director for R.J. McCallister Co., will be instructor.

Classes will be held from 7:40-9:30 p.m. on Thursdays, beginning Oct. 9 and continuing through Nov. 13.
