YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Reactive Metals and Alloys Corp., (Remacor), West Pittsburgh, Pa., has established a \$1,000 annual "Remacor Scholarship in Metallurgical Engineering" at Youngstown State University's Department of Chemical and Metallurgical Engineering in the William Rayen School of Engineering.

Creation of the scholarship was announced by Joseph R. Jackman, president of Remacor.

YSU President John J. Coffelt said he was delighted with the new scholarship, which has been approved by the University Board of Trustees, and he praised Mr. Jackman and Remacor for encouraging the studies of engineering students.

The recipient will be presented the Remacor Scholarship in Metallurgical Engineering at the October meeting of the Penn-Ohio Chapter of the American Institute of Mining Engineers. Anderson is chairman of the Penn-Ohio Chapter, which has been cooperating in establishing the scholarship.

In addition, the scholarship will be acknowledged and the selection of the person to receive the 1981 award will be announced at YSU's Honor Convocation.

Under terms of the scholarship, the Penn-Ohio Chapter chairman, or a committee he designates, together with Dr. Tadeusz K. Slawewski, Chairman of YSU's Department of Chemical and Metallurgical Engineering, will designate an outstanding junior metallurgical student enrolled at the university. That person is to be selected on criteria established by the selection committee, including both financial need and scholastic standing.
