YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio ~ A new type of planetarium show is being introduced to begin the season at Ward Beecher Planetarium of Youngstown State University.

All programs are free and open to the public.

"Fall Skywatch," at 8 p.m. Oct. 3 and 4, is not a traditional planetarium program but an informal presentation of the constellations, stars, planets, and sky phenomena in autumn.

It will include the Oct. 3 eclipse of the sun, and there will be a discussion and simulation of the meteor shower which will occur Oct. 21.

Other seasonal shows will be "Winter Skywatch" on Jan. 9 and 10; "Spring Skywatch," April 3 and 4; and "Summer Skywatch," July 10 and 11.

Premiering the reopening of the Planetarium, which has been completely refurbished during renovations at Ward Beecher Science Hall, will be "Digital SpaceScapes," which begins Nov. 6.

This show will look at the most recent discoveries about our celestial neighbors, including the international flyby of Halley's Comet and the Voyager 2 encounter with the planet Uranus.

"Digital SpaceScapes" points out how our perceptions of the solar system have changed because of the startling information returned to Earth by unmanned space probes.
