The book is the first modern biography of Salmon P. Chase, a key Civil War era personality.

The New England-born, Ohio-bred attorney devoted his life to public service at many levels of government. He served as Free-Soil Senator from Ohio, as Governor of the same state, as secretary of the Treasury under Lincoln, and as Chief Justice of the United States. And although there was a constant effort, Chase never realized his primary ambition, the presidency.

Dr. Blue also reveals in his book Chase's hard work for the rights of fugitive slaves. Chase became prominent in the anti-slavery movement and in establishing the Liberty and Free-Soil parties.

The author began research for the book with the advent of a Faculty Improvement Leave in 1979-80. He studied the Chase papers at the Library of Congress in Washington, D.C., at the Historical Society of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia, and at the Ohio Historical Society in Columbus.

Professor Blue became interested in the Free-Soil party when he researched it in graduate school. His first book was published on the subject, "The Free Soilers: Third Party Politics, 1848-54," in 1973 by the University of Illinois Press.
