A dinner honoring him has been set for 6:30 p.m. Friday, March 13, at Fonderlac Country Club. It has been arranged by Alpha Tau Gamma, the accounting honorary society, and the dean's office of the School of Business Administration under Dr. Ernest R. Nordtvedt, acting dean.

Professor Miller received his Bachelor of Science in Business Administration degree in 1941 and Master of Business Administration degree in 1950, both from Ohio State University.

Miller served overseas in the Army during World War II. He began his career acting here in 1946 when he was appointed/dean of the School of Business at what was the the Youngstown College. He was named dean in 1948 when the school was recognized as a permanent part of the institution and began granting the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration degree. He served as dean until December 1978, when he returned to full-time teaching.

In addition to acting as dean and professor of accounting, he also served as chairman of the departments of Merchandising, Advertising and Secretarial Studies.

In 1947 Miller established the Alpha Tau Gamma fraternity, the accounting honorary. He also helped to establish its first public accounting "clinic" in 1950, which has been held annually since then. Add One -- Miller
