YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Dr. David Garner, director of research in the Department of Psychiatry at Toronto General Hospital will present a program at Youngstown State University on the relationship of women's body image to eating disorders such as anorexia nervosa and bulimia.

The program, which is free and open to the public and health care professionals, will be held in Kilcawley Center's Chestnut Room at 8 p.m. April 1.

Dr. Garner will discuss how these life-threatening eating disorders undermine an individual's self-esteem and effect their ability to interact on the job, in school, and in daily relationships.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - If you've always dreamed of becoming a pilot, here's the place to start--Private Pilot Ground School I at Youngstown State University.

This 10 week course, sponsored by YSU's Office of Continuing Education, will begin April 12 and continue through June 21. Classes will meet from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. on Saturdays.

This course will introduce students to basics of flying fundamentals, aerodynamics, navigation, communication systems and Federal Aviation Regulations and assist the student in preparing for the Federal Aviation Administration Private Pilot Written Examination. In order to prepare for the entire exam, students must take both this course and Private Pilot Ground School II.

George Repasky of Youngstown, a limited-service faculty member at YSU, will be instructor. He is certified as a basic ground instructor by the FAA.

The course fee is \$165, or \$150 for individuals registering prior to March 29.
