YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - A slide show, brochures, books and menus will be featured at a preview of the Youngstown State University Home Economics' cuisine tour of England, France and Belgium this summer.

The preview will be at 7:30 p.m. March 28 in Room 3112 of Cushwa Hall. Jean Hassell of Warren, assistant professor in the Home Economics Department who will lead the tour, said the slides to be shown have been provided by International Education, the Madison, Wis., organization arranging the June 16-30 excursion.

The purpose of the tour is to examine the culinary characteristics of the three countries, visit food markets, a French cooking school, food industries and kitchens, and sample wines and foods as well as visit famous sights.

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YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Youngstown State University's Office of Continuing Education and the Departments of Nursing and Home Economics will co-sponsor a six-week course, "Parenting and Your Child's Health," beginning April 9.

This on-campus course will present contemporary parenting issues that involve infants, toddlers and pre-schoolers. The focus will be on maintaining the young child's physical and emotional health.

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YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Dr. Edith Lerner, associate professor of the Department of Nutrition, Case Western Reserve University, will speak at Youngstown State University 8 p.m. April 22 as a special lecturer. The presentation will be in the Chestnut Room of Kilcawley Center.

Admission to Dr. Lerner's free lecture, "Marvelous Minerals on Your Menu for Health," is on a first-come, first-served basis. YSU's Special Lecture Series are open to the public.

Students, the general public and interested professionals such as registered dietitians, nurses, physicians, educators as well as other allied health professionals are welcome.

Since June 1982, Dr. Lerner has been acting chairman, Case's Department of Nutrition and consultant for the Clinical Research Center of University Hospitals, Cleveland.

She was awarded a Bachelor of Science degree in foods and nutrition from Cornell University, and a Master of Science and doctoral degrees in nutritional sciences and biochemistry from the University of Wisconsin.

Dr. Lerner has many publications to her credit, including a Biochemistry-Nutrition Workshop which is an audio-visual self-instructional workshop and Physiological Aspects of Popular Weight Reduction Diets Proceedings. In 1984, she was involved with producing an abstract comparing effects of butter vs. sunflower oil margarine in the diet. This abstract was also presented at the 9th International Congress of Dietetics.

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
