YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Theatrefest's production of "High Spirits," the third and final offering in University Theatre's summer repertory, opens on Thursday, July 30, in Kilcawley Center's Chestnut Room.

A tuneful adaptation of Noel Coward's recently revived "Blithe Spirit," "High Spirits" is a lively romping '40s musical.

The ingenious plot revolves around the hilarious mix-ups that result when novelist Charles Condomine, through wacky medium Madame Arcati, accidentally conjures up from the dead his first wife, Elvira, while he is married to his second wife, Ruth.

In the Theatrefest '87 production of "High Spirits," Mark Serman of Struthers, a YSU history graduate, portrays Charles; Maureen Putnam of Uhrichsville, a YSU music education senior, plays Elvira; and Killeen Vogel of Boardman, a YSU voice major, is Ruth. Joan L. Claypoole of Austintown, a YSU senior voice and music history major, plays the role of Madame Arcati.

Chet Domitz of Struthers, a YSU business major, is Dr. Bradman. Mrs. Bradman is played by Paula Rose McConnell of Canton, a YSU theatre major. Crystal Reeher, a Brookfield High School student, completes the cast as Edith, the maid.

The chorus includes several area high school students. They are Erin Chuey of Girard High School, Patsi Cline of Boardman High, Dave Crawford of Wilson, and Christina Peltz of Liberty High School. Melissa Landgraver of Austintown Fitch High School is am alternate member of the chorus.
