YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Youngstown State University's Continuing Education Office, the Mahoning Valley Chapter of the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders Association, and the District II Area Agency on Aging will sponsor a one-day seminar, "Alzheimer's Disease: Theory and Pragmatics for Health Care Professionals."

It will be held from 8 a.m. to $4: 30$ p.m. on Friday, May 3, on the YSU campus. This seminar has been approved by the Ohio Department of Health's Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators for six hours of Continuing Education credit.
