Jon Faddis, called by his idol and mentor Dizzy Gillespie "one of the most gifted trumpeters and musicians," will be guest soloist for this special finale at 8 p.m. in the Chestnut Room of YSU's Kilcawley Center, Spring Street.

The concert is free and open to the public on a first-come, first-served basis.

It is sponsored by the YSU Jazz Society in cooperation with Student Government.

At 3 p.m. that day Faddis will conduct a free clinic on jazz improvisation and the trumpet in the rehearsal room of Bliss Hall, Room 2036.

In addition to accompanying the guest artist, Director Tony Leonardi and Jazz Ensembles I and II will present a number of selections.

Faddis will play several of his own original compositions plus some numbers from the old Dizzy Gillespie big band "book," including "Things to Come," Con Alma," and "One Bass Hit."

Critics say Jon Faddis' high note accuracy and youthful infusion into mainstream jazz, plus his rare talent, have given him the ability to acknowledge the masters and yet set his own style.

He was introduced to jazz and the music of Dizzy Gillespie at the age of 10 and five years later made a guest appearance with Dizzy's band.

Two days before his 18th birthday, Jon joined Lionel Hampton's band as featured soloist. He went on to perform with such top artists as Buddy Rich, Gene Krupa and Mel Torme, and to sub in the Thad Jones/Mel Lewis Band. When he was still 18, he won national acclaim when he substituted for an ailing Roy Eldridge in an all-star concert in New York's Philharmonic Hall.

Faddis went on world tours with the Jones/Lewis and Charlie Mingus bands.

Next, for nearly a decade, he sequestererd himself in recording studios and became
