YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Twenty-two engineering majors from Youngstown State University's William Rayen School of Engineering recently represented the school at the 34th annual American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AICHE) Regional Conference where one YSU senior captured third place for his student research paper.

Randal E. Rymer of Austintown, a senior engineering major, won the award for his senior paper, "Separation of CO-N2 in a Moving Absorbent Bed." There were 16 papers considered for the awards, which were judged on subject matter as well as presentation of the paper.

Rymer was guided by Dr. L. V. Szirmay of Youngstown, chairman of the Chemical and Metallurgical Engineering Department. Dr. Szirmay studied the feasibility of similar processes in the early 1970's.

The conference was attended by chemical engineering majors from the AICHE's North Central Region and included participants from colleges and universities in Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois and Wisconsin. A Wayne State student won first place and a Purdue student second for their papers.

The YSU group was accompanied by their advisors, Dr. Stanley Zager of Cuyahoga Falls, professor of chemical and metallurgical engineering, Dr. Tadeusz Slawecki cf Canfield, former department chairman, and Dr. Soon Lim of Austintown, associate professor of chemical and metallurgical engineering.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Youngstown State University's department of foreign languages and literature was recently awarded a plaque that commended its outstanding service to foreign language education in northeastern Ohio.
