YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Canfield High School's team won the first place trophy in the computer programming contest held at Youngstown State University, May 17.

Austintown Fitch and Carrollton finished second and third in the contest, which was sponsored by the YSU student chapter of the Association for Computing Machinery in cooperation with YSU's Computer Center and the Department of Mathematical and Computer Sciences.

Seventeen teams from 14 area high schools participated.

The contest consisted of five programming problems. Four of the problems were solved by contestants, although no team solved more than two. Canfield placed first, based on finishing times and the number of incorrect attempts. In addition to the top three teams, both teams from Struthers solved two problems correctly.

In addition to the winners, the following schools entered four-member teams: Bessemer Mohawk, Cardinal Mooney, Chaney, Jackson-Milton, Liberty, Lisbon David Anderson, Maplewood, McDonald, Springfield Local, Struthers, and Warren Harding.

YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Youngstown State University's Chapter 143 of Phi Kappa Phi, national honor society, will honor two distinguished alumni, several faculty members, two administrators and 59 students at its 14th annual Convocation Banquet tonight (May 22).

The speaker at the 6 p.m. dinner in the Chestnut Room of Kilcawley Center will be Dale Pilz, Class of 1949, whose topic will be "The Changing World of Communications."

Pilz is now president and chief executive officer of Omnicom Group, Inc. of Los Angeles. He formerly was president of Kaiser Steel and chief executive officer of Sprint GTE.

Both Pilz and James D'Eramo, assistant superintendent of Austintown Schools, will be honored as "Distinguished Alumnus."

Emeritus Life Memberships in Phi Kappa Phi will be presented to Ivis Boyer of Boardman, professor of Political Science and Social Science, and Jane G. Cunningham, Austintown, assistant professor of Psychology, both of whom have retired, and Dr. Margarita W. Metzger of Youngstown, professor of Foreign Language and Literature, who is retiring soon.

Also initiated into the honor society will be Dr. Harold Yiannaki of Boardman, University registrar; Dr. Gordon E. Mapley of Boardman, assistant dean of the College of Arts and Sciences; Dr. Sandra W. Stephan of Youngstown, assistant professor of English; and Maureen M. Mitchell of Niles, instructor of Nursing.

Sixteen graduate students and 43 undergraduates will be initiated during the ceremonies.
