

PUBLICATIONS

An article written by **Joseph Sanson** and **Robert J. Korenic**, associate professors, Civil and Construction Engineering Technology, and titled "Youngstown State University Civil and Construction Engineering Technology Mini Capstone Final Project implementation and assessment," has been accepted to be published in the *American Society of Engineering Education Journal*. The paper was presented at the annual 2020 Conference for Industry and Education Collaboration in Orlando, Fla. Korenic and Sanson both earned bachelor's and master's degrees in Civil and Environmental Engineering from YSU.



Shakespeare and the 99%, a collection of essays co-edited by **Tim Francisco**, professor of English and director of the YSU Center for Working Class Studies, received a positive review in the **Los Angeles Review of Books**. The review by James Shapiro, professor of English at Columbia University, said the essay collection is the first book that "gives voice to a seething and justified resentment of the academic elite by those teaching at non-elite institutions."

Ewelina Boczkowska, associate professor in the Dana School of Music, coedited Music, Collective Memory, Trauma, and Nostalgia in European Cinema after the Second World War with Michael Baumgartner of Cleveland State University. Published by Routledge, the 341-page book explores one of the most integral elements of the cinematic experience—music. The essays consider the numerous ways in which post-war European cinema from 1945 to 1989 dealt with memory, trauma and nostalgia, showing how the music of the films shaped the representation of the past.

Among the movies examined are *Nybyggarna*, a 1972 Swedish film directed by Jan Troell and starring Max von Sydow and Liv Ullmann; *Muriel*, a 1963 French drama directed by Alain Resnais; *La Luna*, a 1979 Italian movie directed by Bernardo Bertolucci and starring Jill Clayburgh; and *Riso Amaro*, a 1949 Italian film directed by Giuseppe De Santis and produced by Dino De Laurentiis.

The ways in which marriage and abstinence from sex are described in U.S. high school textbooks are inconsistent with modern realities of adult relationships, concludes a new study by **Amanda Fehlbaum**, YSU assistant professor of Sociology.

"It is not exactly realistic to expect most young people to wait until their mid-to-late 20s to have sex, which is what the textbooks are telling them to do," Fehlbaum said.

The article titled "Delaying Gratification: How High School Health Textbooks Portray Marriage and Sex" is published in Sexuality Research and Social Policy.

The study uses a content analysis of nine U.S. high school health textbooks to examine how the textbooks address marriage, reasons for remaining abstinent until marriage,

and adult life outside of marriage. The article says abstinence-only-until-marriage ideology continues to be promoted in U.S. high schools as part of sex education, despite its well-documented lack of success at delaying onset of sexual initiation and sexual risk avoidance.

"On College Campuses, Social Media Provides Private Spaces for Thousands"

A scholarly article co-authored by Sumell was quoted in a recent New York Times story about the use of social media by today's college students. The article by Sumell and Eric P. Chiang, economics professor at Florida Atlantic University, was published in the Journal of Economic Education and titled "Are Your Students Absent, Not Absent, or Present? Mindfulness and Student Performance." The survey of 922 Economics students at YSU and FAU showed a significant association between mindfulness, time spent on mobile devices, the frequency of test anxiety and overall student performance. "The implications are that teachers should consider adopting strategies to reduce student distractions levels in the classroom, and universities should consider investing additional resources to help mitigate student stress and anxiety levels outside of the classroom," Sumell said.
