

DANA SCHOOL OF MUSIC

The Dana School of Music began in 1869 as Dana's Musical Institute in Warren, Ohio. It was merged with Youngstown College in 1941.

The purpose of the school is to complement the general objectives of the University by providing intense professional training in music based on a thorough understanding of the fundamental skills and theory upon which all music rests, and to provide an opportunity for the non-music major to develop a background of musical knowledge.

The school is one of three departmental units in the College of Fine and Performing Arts, which is housed in Bliss Hall, where there are 80 acoustically controlled practice rooms, faculty studios, classrooms, rehearsal rooms and a recital hall with a seating capacity of 237. In addition, frequent use is made of Stambaugh and Powers Auditoriums.

ABOUT STAN KENTON

Few, if any of the big jazz bands that blossomed in the 1940's and achieved international fame came from California. One that did, and that never lost the stamp of the West Coast, was Stan Kenton's. Kenton's band would be more accurately described as Stan Kenton and his band-of-the-period, because his orchestra passed through numerous phases during which he hired and fired, or lost, countless sidemen and employed numerous arrangers and composers. He made bold changes from one period to the next in pursuit of the ultimate in modern music, but his personalized sound remained unmistakable.

Stanley Newcomb Kenton was born in Wichita, Kansas, on February 19, 1912, and died in Los Angeles on August 25, 1979. He was raised in Los Angeles, studying piano with his mother and other teachers. He wrote his first arrangement at the age of 16 and played with local bands before joining the Everett Hoagland band as pianist and arranger in 1934. He worked with others including Vido Musso, prior to starting his own band. In the summer of 1941 he made a landmark appearance at the Rendevous Ballroom in Balboa. He was a smash hit, went on to the Hollywood Paladium, was broadcast coast to coast, and began accumulating his legion of devotees.

Kenton created a composing and arranging style which owed much to Claude Thornhill, Fletcher Henderson, and Jimmy Lunceford. Kenton composed the popular "Eager Beaver" and his well-known theme, "Artistry in Rhythm." He also developed a piano style, influenced, in part, by Earl Hines. However, Kenton was less important as a pianist and arranger than he was as a bandleader. His skill at public relations and his talent for finding and employing creative modern composers rank among his major contributions to jazz history. It is significant that, because of his band's great popularity during the late 1940's, Kenton became financially free enough to experiment and that he channeled this freedom into hiring relatively unknown writers and encouraging ambitious compositions which had little chance of realizing commercial success. Improvisers had enjoyed these kinds of opportunities throughout jazz history, but composers had not. His bands provided work for hundreds of musicians who may not have otherwise received much exposure. Though he began leading bands in 1941 when the big band era was still flourishing, he continued to lead long after big bands went out of fashion.

Kenton's first band, often labeled Artistry in Rhythm, retained its identity for about six years. This orchestra boasted jazz soloists of the caliber of tenor saxophonist Vido Musso, trombonist Kai Winding, trumpeter-arranger Ray Wetzel, bassist Eddie Safranski, drummer Shelly Manne, and two top-notch jazz vocalists, first Anita O'Day and later June Christy.

In 1947 Kenton disbanded and reorganized his twenty-piece Progressive Jazz concert-dance orchestra. The keystone of the new band was composer-arranger Pete Rugolo who helped formulate the Kenton style of the 1940's. The band played some rather heavy material, but the **Down Beat** polls voted it the best big band in 1947 and 1948. The band toured virtually nonstop for two years. By the end of 1948, Stan notified his sidemen that he was disbanding again.

Less than a year later Kenton organized a forty-piece concert orchestra that included strings, French horns, oboe, bassoon and tuba. He called it Innovations in Modern Music. His intent was to further the third stream movement by fusing classical concepts with jazz. Despite its classical composition, the band carried a contingent of some of the most exciting jazz solists in the country. flutist Bud Shank, alto saxophonist Art Pepper, trumpeters Shorty Rogers, Chico Alvarez, Buddy Childers, and the stratospheric Maynard Ferguson. In addition, no fewer than eight composer-arrangers wrote for it. The payroll was staggering. The orchestra took to the trail in 1950 and survived until 1952. It received great reviews but was a financial failure.

In 1952 Kenton formed the nineteen-piece New Concepts in Artistry in Rhythm band with standout saxophonists Lee Konitz, Richie Kamuca and Bill Holman, trombonist Frank Rosolino and trumpeters Conte Condoli and Maynard Furguson. In addition, Kenton enhanced his musical library with compositions and arrangements from Gerry Mulligan, Bill Holman and Bill Russo.

For the next four years the band toured tirelessly, sometimes billed as The Festival of Modern American Music. It covered the United States and Europe and presented guest artists such as Charlie Parker, Dizzy Gillespie, and Billie Holiday.

In 1959 Stan began perhaps his most significant contribution to the continued health of jazz. He started his Orchestra in Residence program at universities in Indiana and Michigan. The band would remain at schools for a week or two playing concerts, conducting clinics, and encouraging young musicians to pursue jazz as a career. The movement has since been adopted and furthered by other jazz artists to the point where jazz courses now are offered by most big schools. Kenton continued the program throughout the remainder of his career.

Stan Kenton maintained a resident orchestra in Los Angeles from 1964 to 1967, commissioning new works and calling it the Los Angeles Neophonic Orchestra. During the 70's he took to the road again until illness caused him to disband for the final time in August, 1978, one year before his death.

Just as the feeling projected by the Basie band can be described as easy swinging, the feeling projected by the Kenton bands can be described as massive power and intensity. Whether slow or fast, his pieces are usually massive-sounding. It was not unusual, for example, to find five trumpets and five trombones in a Kenton band at the same time as Ellington was carrying only four trumpets and three trombones. Additionally, some Kenton trombonists have doubled on tuba, and one version of his band carried an entire section of mellophoniums. The band's character is based more on elaborate arrangements than on the simplicity and swing associated with Count Basie's approach. Kenton emphasized composition over improvisation. In fact, some solo improvisations were not solos in the conventional sense, but embellishments of the ensemble sound. Although Kenton was often accused of not swinging in the traditional sense, his band was always exciting.

Audree Coke, Stan Kenton's long time friend and personal manager writes, "Some may think of Stan Kenton as a survivor, a musician who forded many streams along his trek for his beloved jazz. As a pioneer, he was a survivor. But as a doer, a man who knew what he wanted to hear and knew how to get it, he was a creator. He made an indelible mark on modern music..."

Nanette Gomory Lunde, harpsichord, has performed in the United States and Europe as a solo recitalist and continuo player. She is a graduate of the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, Northwestern University School of Music and the Akadamie Mozarteum in Salzburg, Austria. Ms. Lunde teaches harpsichord, baroque performance practice and piano, and is the coordinator of the Telemann Society, the resident period instrument ensemble at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire. She has also authored books and articles on the harpsichord and its literature, including the newly published 'The Continuo Companion'. Ms. Lunde is the president and founder of the Midwestern Historical Keyboard Society, an organization devoted to the study of harpsichords, early pianos and organs.

Ivar Lunde, Jr., baroque oboe, is the former principal oboist of the Norwegian National Opera. He received his education at the Conservatory of Music, Oslo, Norway, and the Mozarteum, Salzburg, Austria. His teachers of oboe include Kees Lahnstein and André Lardrot; of baroque oboe, Grant Moore and James Caldwell. He has taught and performed in Europe and the United States, and appeared as oboe soloist with the Bergen Symphony and the Oslo Philharmonic, and many smaller orchestras in Norway, Sweden, Austria, and the United States. He has also performed on baroque oboe with the Smithsonian Concerto Grosso, the Minneapolis Bach Society, and Basically Bach in Chicago. Mr. Lunde is also an award winning composer and a conductor. In addition to his position as conductor and music director of the Chippewa Valley Youth Symphony, he conducts the University Chamber Orchestra at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire, where he also teaches oboe, theory and composition.

ROBERT CLÉRISSE

Robert Clérisse, born on February 8, 1899 and died in 1973, was a French composer who studied classical music in Paris and abroad. He was the Director of Musique di L'Air and the Director of Harmony in Sion Switzerland.

Most of his compositions are for solo wind instruments with piam accompaniment. He also has different works arranged and transcribed for diverse ensembles.

PAUL DUKAS

Paul Dukas, born in Paris on October 1, 1865 and died in the same city on May 17, 1935, was a French composer and teacher at the Paris Conservatorie. 'The Villanelle,' for horn and piano, is one of his smaller works. It was composed in 1906. The original orchestration was written by one of Dukas's own students. Recently, a newer orchestration was written and published by Vitali Bujanowski, music professor at the Leningrad Conservatory. Mr. Bujanowski was interested in writing the orchestration because he is the solo horn player with the Leningrad Philharmonic Orchestra and has held that position for the past thirty years.

Dukas was clearly under two great influences when he wrote 'The Villanelle,' the neo-romanticism of Richard Strauss and the impressionism of Claude Debussy. Dukas's 'Villanelle' shows us a very concise picture of the French countryside. He achieves this by displaying the full range of characteristics and capabilities of the horn within the context of the beautiful melodies that occur throughout the piece. For this reason, 'The Villanelle' remains one of the major works in the repertoire for the solo horn.

WOLFGANG AMADEUS MOZART

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart composed the fourth concerto for horn and orchestra, K. 495, in Vienna during 1786. It was composed for a dear friend and one of the finest horn players of the time, Ignaz Leibgelb. It is stated in Mozart, His character, His work by Alfred Einstein that Leibgelb was often the brunt of Mozart's practical jokes. This concerto in particular was written as a visual joke for the talented Leibgelb; the concerto was written in four different colors of ink: blue, black, red and green.

About the wind instrument concertos of Mozart, Einstein says, "Accordingly all these concertos have something special and personal about them, and when one hears them in a concert hall, which is seldom enough, one has the feeling that the windows have suddenly been opened and a breath of fresh air has been let in."

ABOUT OUR GUEST ARTISTS

NICK BRIGNOLA, a native of Troy, New York is an internationally acclaimed jazz virtuoso on the flute, clarinet, soprano and bartone saxophone. He gained early attention when he won the "Benny Goodman" Scholarship to the Berklee School of Music (Boston). In 1958 he was on the West Coast performing with Cal Tjader at the Blackhawk in San Francisco. In 1963 he joined the Woody Herman Herd. He has also worked with many notable jazz greats including Don Ellis, Paul Winter, Wes Montgomery, Herbie Hancock, Phil Woods, Elvin Jones, Clark Terry and Buddy Rich. BILL WATROUS is among the world's best on his instrument. He started playing the trombone at the age of six. His father, a professional trombonist who played with many of the name bands of the 40's, was his first teacher. After graduating from high school he joined the Navy and continued to play his instrument, performing in San Diego and New York City. After his discharge, he settled in New York and began to concentrate on building his career. Bill played with the Kai Winding Septet, Roy Eldridge, Quincy Jones, Woody Herman, Count Basie and was a member of Ten Wheel Drive. He was a staff musician for CBS and a member of the Dick Cavett and Merv Griffin studio orchestras. In the late 70's Watrous moved to California establishing himself as a top-flight studio musician, jazz artist and clinician. Bill has won the **Downbeat** reader's poll seven consecutive years and the magazine's Critics Award twice. One of his big band albums, "Tiger of San Pedro," was nominated for a Grammy Award.

GUEST COMPOSER LARRY SITSKY

Larry Sitsky occupies an important place in Australian contemporary music as a composer, pianist, musicologist, teacher, lecturer and broadcaster. Born in Tianjin (Tientsin), China, in 1934, he began piano studies at a very early age and by the age of 11 had given his first recital and begun his composing career.

Sitsky's output is wide ranging and prolific. He has written six operas, all in collaboration with Gwen Harwood, the outstanding Australian poet. Sitsky has completed numerous commissions including works for The Australian Opera, the Australian Broadcasting Corporation, Musica Viva and many others. He frequently uses titles and references attesting to his interest in ancient mythologies and other esoteric teaching, as well as mainstream literature. Also, Sitsky had a successful career as professional pianist and recording artist, and has written a book on pianist and composer Ferrucio Busoni.

Mr. Sitsky is currently visiting the United States on a Fulbright Scholar-in-Residence Grant at the University of Cincinnati. During his residence at Dana, Sitsky will present lectures on 20th century Australian music, his own music and will meet with student composers.
