A self-contained environment for learning, the \$6.0-million **ARTS AND SCIENCES CLASSROOM AND OFFICE BUILDING** will house the faculty, facilities and programs of the liberal arts disciplines at Youngstown State University.

Eight departments within the College of Arts and Sciences — Economics, English, Foreign Languages, History, Philosophy and Religious Studies, Political and Social Science, Psychology, and Sociology and Anthropology — and the offices of the dean will be located in the six-story structure. Some 104,500 square feet of interior space will provide for 17 classrooms, 16 laboratory and storage areas, two language laboratories, a computer terminal room, 161 faculty offices plus supporting staff offices, five lounge/study areas, and a 210-seat lecture hall with stage.

Scheduled for completion in 1978, the building will occupy a five-acre site bounded by Fifth

Avenue on the west and the campus core on the east. The contours, walk patterns and textures of the central core will be continued in the landscaping. The building will feature concrete frame construction with brick facing and double-glazed glass for energy conservation. The design of the building and the site provides for total accessibility to the handicapped.

Funds for this facility were provided by the State of Ohio.
