way Prof. Watson summarizes the Mociological Thought" in Alack Sociological Though in America today.
Prof. Watson reminded us that in order for the Black Man in this country to make any significant progress toward "Freedom", it will require a certain social, nolitical white Americans."Before this can happen it will be necessary for white people to become humanitarians, they will have to believe in the concept of liberty justice and equality; they will have to become endowed with compassion and LOVE."
