More than a year after the enactment of Ohio's law raising the minimum age to purchase alcoho allowing 18-year-old college students into their establishments once again.

being served alcohol, Rose said he will use color coded wrist bands to indicate the eligibility of his patrons.
Upon entering the bar, those persons who are those wold or over will receive a yellow band, band who are 20 years-old will receive a blue get a hand stamp.
Rose added that no one will be served without wrist band.
