



### To the Senior Class, 1961 . . .




#### DR. JOSEPH E. SMITH



• Miss Williams assists Miss Cole in the accounting and payroll departments.




# Librarian

### LA VERNE REILLY



### Presentatation of 1961 Senior Class Gift






#### Alpha Iota

#### Sigma Alpha Epsilon


• On December 5, 1959, Ohio Alpha of Sigma Alpha Epsilon was chartered at Youngstown University. Ohio Alpha developed from Phi Gamma Local, which was founded in 1926, and thus becomes the oldest fraternity on campus.

Sigma Alpha Epsilon was founded on March 9, 1856 at the University of Alabama. The purpose of the founders was to form a bond of brotherhood that would hold its members together throughout their lives.








#### Freshman Day






## Topsy Turvy Day


• May Day was held on May 13, 1960. Because of unfavorable weather, the afternoon festivities were conducted in Strouss Auditorium.

• In his 19th year as head coach of Youngstown U. Dike Beede still holds the rare distinction of being the only football coach in the history of the University.

This year's team, piloted by Beede, managed to crack three University records as they ended the season with an impressive 6-2 mark.

The Penguins set a new all-time season scoring record as they compiled 223 points in just eight games. They also registered 55 markers in the Gustavus Adolphus tilt for a new scoring record for the team in a single effort.

Frank Horvath, a sophomore halfback, shattered the individual rushing mark previously set by Dave Kimmel in 1957. Horvath carried for 1010 yards in 150 carries for 6.7 yards per attempt. He also led the team in scoring with 68 points on 11 touchdowns.

The busiest man on the YU campus during football season is Willard L. Webster. Webster not only handles the duties of Athletic Director, but he is also the team's trainer.

Webster, here since 1938, has served as director of Athletics since 1945 and is an associate professor in the department of Biological Sciences.



A well-liked individual in district circles, Coach Rossilli has been named small-college coach of the year in 1957 and was also selected "Italian Coach of the Year" a year later.


