

HISTORICAL OUTLINE OF YOUNGSTOWN STATE UNIVERSITY

- 1868 Beginnings of the Youngstown YMCA
- 1869 Dana Musical Institute founded in Warren (Moved to Youngstown and affiliated with Youngstown College in 1941)
- 1888 First classes begun at YMCA
- 1908 School of Law of the Youngstown Association School, sponsored by the Young Men's Christian Associational School
- 1920 School of Law of the Youngstown Association School empowered by the state of Ohio to grant the degree of Bachelor of Laws.
The Y.M.C. Associational School introduced a four-year course in Business Administration.
- 1921 Name of Y.A. School changed to Youngstown Institute of Technology.
Liberal arts classes offered in the evenings.
- 1927 College of Arts and Sciences, offering daytime classes for the first time, was established.
- 1928 Youngstown Institute of Technology changed its name to Youngstown College.
- 1930 College confers B.A. degree for the first time.
- 1931 Dr. Howard Jones became President of Youngstown College.
Jones Hall (formerly called main building) occupied by Youngstown College.
- 1941 Dana Musical Institute affiliated with Youngstown College (founded in Warren 1869) as Dana Music School.
- 1944 YMCA transferred control to the Corporation of Youngstown College
- 1945 Youngstown College accredited by North Central Association
- 1946 Engineering Department became William Rayen School of Engineering
- 1948 Business Administration Department became School of Business Administration

- 1952 Library building completed
- 1953 Tod Hall completed
- 1955 Youngstown College rechartered as the Youngstown University
- 1959 Science building completed
- 1960 Department of Education became School of Education
- 1966 Albert L. Pugsley became President of Youngstown University
Kilcawley Student Center completed
- 1967 Youngstown University became Youngstown State University
Ward Beecher Hall completed
- 1968 Engineering Science Building opened.
Graduate School established
Technical and Community College (renamed the College of Applied Sciences and Technology in 1976)
- 1972 Beeghly Physical Education Center completed
YSU became member of Northeastern Ohio Universities College of Medicine.
- 1973 Dr. John Coffelt became President of YSU
- 1974 College of Fine and Performing Arts established
- 1976 New library building (Maag library) opened.
C.A.S.T. building opened.
- 1977 (fall) Bliss Hall (Fine and Performing Arts Center) to open.
- 1978 The new Arts and Sciences office and classroom building to open.
