Mr. John Boland, Chairman said this Committee would probably have something definite to report at the next Senate meeting, but not at this time.

REPORT FROM SENATE COUNCIL BY DR. IRWIN COHEN:

1) Senate Council has appointed a special committee whose purpose will be to investigate the desirability and possibility of installing a Chapter of the National Honorary Fraternity Phi Kappa Phi on this Campus.

2) COMPUTER COMMITTEE:

The computer Committee is organized and has met six times during this Fall Quarter. No business requiring Senate action has been taken. The IBM 360-40 will probably be in operation by the Spring Ouarter.

4) PROGRESS REPORTS FROM VARIOUS COMMITTEES:

The Senate Council has voted to have all Standing Committees give Progress Reports every Quarter to the Senate. They also voted to make it a general requirement that all faculty committees and all joint committees must report on their activities to the Senate at least once each academic year.

5) There will be no Senate meeting the first Friday in January, 1968 due to the opening of the Winter Quarter.

REPORT FROM CURRICULUM COMMITTEE:

Dr. Sidney I. Roberts presented this report in the absence of Dr. Thelma Miner. The Curriculum Committee ordinarily does not present such a large number of offerings for approval or comment at one time. It was necessary this time due to the deadline date for the Catalog, pressure from the printer, and also that the Senate group will not be meeting again before that particular date.

The Curriculum Committee has met every Wednesday since the beginning of the Quarter. Discussion of course loads, should some courses be increased or decreased, and many other matters have been presented to this Committee. Dr. Roberts reported they decided arbitrarily, not on the basis of teacher loads but on the academic merit of each course. Faculty members are invited to come in and discuss these courses with members of the Committee if they wish to do so. In some instances, the Curriculum Committee refused to act on some of the items.

The President discussed the catalog governing graduation requirements. "The requirements for graduation may be those stated in the catalog in effect at the time of the student's entrance into Youngstown State University or those stated in any subsequent catalog; but the student must select one of the pertinent catalogs and complete the requirements as stated therein. (Certain exceptions apply. In School of Education, changes in requirements are governed by the Ohio State Department of Education, etc.). The student is expected to make himself fully aware of all requirements applicable to him and is responsible for completing them." It is necessary for students to watch prerequisites for courses.

There is no point in placing many courses in the catalog if they are not going to be taught. Departments should be careful about the number of courses to be placed in the catalog. It is necessary to have a sufficient number of students in a class in order to offer a certain course.

The Catalog at present is published annually. It may be biannually with just a supplement if this should be feasible and presents a sufficient saving. We do not want to mislead the student with listing many courses in the catalog that are not available.

Many schools state that if a course is not given in a 2-year period it is automatically dropped and must be reintroduced and also a sufficient number be shown who want to take this course in order that it should be given. We should give some study as to what is and what is not appropriate to the Catalog.

Dr, Roberts mentioned the Curriculum Committee spent more time on the Language offerings than on any other.

MOTION: Dr. Roberts moved that the Senate accept the report of the Curriculum Committee, as modified. Seconded. President Pugsley declared the ayes had it. MOTION PASSED.

REGISTRATI REPORT:

Mrs. Mary B. Smith, Registrar reported that as of today approximately 7128 had registered for the Winter Quarter. She explained the use of the Scan Sheet for this registration (A class request form). Saturday, December 9 is the date for final registration for students who have not registered for the Winter Quarter. There will be some changes of registration due to cancellation of classes, etc.

DR. BEHEN'S COMMITTEE (ACADEMIC AFFAIRS):

Dr. Behen's Committee will make a recommendation to the Senate, possibly at the next meeting.

DEAN AURAND'S REPORT:

The Publications Board had several meetings. The matter of the relationship between the Editor of the Jambar and the Faculty Advisor has been resolved.

The President commented the Publications Board had reviewed the procedure and clarification needed to identify the respective role of the Editor and Advisor of the Jambar. We do not have a corps of Journalism students who are trained in Journalism, The Jambar does not have a sufficient number of student reporters. Also, they have relied on extensive articles considerably in depth regarding University problems, etc. The President stated he has confidence in the Publications Board; he has confidence in the Advisor of the Jambar. It is a much better paper this year than last year. We hope it will continue this way.

GRADUATE ROGRAMS:

The Proposed Graduate programs were sent by special messenger to Chancellor Millet in Columbus, Thursday, November 30. They had to be in Columbus by Friday, December 1. Members of the Board of Regents will now study the programs, This will be acted upon December 15, either favorably or unfavorably. **Much** hard work on the part of many faculty members has gone into the make-up of these proposed graduate programs.

Graduate programs must hot detract or drain from undergraduate programs.

An announcement will not come out until next summer as to whether or not we will have a graduate school. We hope to have this information by August, 1968.

INTRODUCT.

1. The following statement was adopted by a Joint Meeting of the Administrative Council and the Senate Council on September 29, 1967, outlining the sources of authority for committees:

STATEMENT OF CLASSIFICATION OF COMMITTEES ACCORDING TO LINES OF AUTHORITY

A. COMMITTEES DERIVING AUTHORITY FROM THE FACULTY:

Actions on routine or procedural matters are effective immediately. Policy matters are subject to approval by the Faculty through the Senate. Appointments to committees are suggested by the Senate Council and decided in a Joint Meeting with the Administrative Council.

B. COMMITTEES DERIVING AUTHORITY JOINTLY FROM THE FACULTY AND ADMINISTRATI

Actions on routine or procedural matters are effective immediately. Policy matters are subject to approval by the appropriate administrative reference and also by the Senate. Appointments to committees are made jointly by the Administrative Council and the Senate Council.

C. COMMITTEES DERIVING AUTHORITY FROM THE ADMINISTRATION:

Actions on routine or procedural matters are effective immediately. Policy matters are subject to approval by the appropriate administrative reference. Appointments to committees are made by the Administration, except as specified in the committee description.

2. The following statement regarding the process of selection for student members to committees was adopted by the Senate Council on October 25, 1967:

On those standing committees of the University which call for student participation, <u>ONE</u>, and <u>ONLY ONE</u>, student representative shall be a member of Student Council, with the remaining student members to be appointed by the Student Council from the student body at large.

APPOINTMENTS TO STANDING COMMITTEES COMT'D.:

- 3. The President of the University is an ex-officio member of all committees, and he should receive a copy of the approved minutes of all committee meetings.
- 4. Each committee should send a copy of its approved minutes to the University Librarian. These minutes will be filed and made available to the faculty and staff.

A. COMMI DERIVING AUTHORITY FROM : ULTY: (1968-69)

A-1. CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS COMMITTEE:

To recommend revisions of the Faculty Constitution and Bylaws to the Senate.

To appoint members of the Committees of the university Senate; and together with such body as the President may name for this purpose, to serve as a committee on committees to appoint the Joint Committees of the University Senate and Administration; to refer matters directed to its attention or initiated by itself to appropriate committees or to new committees it may appoint; to act for the Senate in matters of liaison with the Administration; to prepare the agenda for Senate meetings; to act in behalf of the Senate in matters requiring immediate attention.
