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Call to Order: Tom Shipka, Chair of the Academic Senate, called the meeting to order at 4:08 p.m.

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Senate Executive Committee (SEC) / Report from the Chair / Ohio Faculty Council Report: Tom Shipka, Chair of the Senate, reported:

As is my custom, I will consolidate my several reports into one.

- 1. The Ohio Faculty Council met in Columbus on November 18, 2005, at which time officials from the Ohio Civil Rights Commission reviewed procedures which they follow in processing claims. Paul Sracic represented YSU at this meeting. My absence was due to a scheduled meeting of the campus labor-management panel which met for approximately four hours that same day. The next meeting of the OFC is this Friday, December 9. The agenda for Friday includes campus updates by OFC members and a review of the new labor agreement covering the full-time faculty at the University of Akron. As an aside, I have incorporated information about the salary and insurance provisions in the Akron agreement in my report on these matters on the OFC web page. You can access the OFC web page from the YSU Academic Senate web page. Click on "OFC,", then on "Special Reports."
- 2. You will recall that the Ohio public university presidents approved a resolution affirming that all Ohio public university students should be afforded due process. On November 9 there was a meeting to discuss whether any changes are necessary at YSU to conform to this resolution. The meeting included several administrators, student leaders, and myself. We agreed that that the informal process now frequently used by students should be formalized. This process involves the student meeting with the instructor to discuss the complaint. If the student does not secure a satisfactory resolution at this meeting, then he or she may carry the complaint successively to the appropriate department chair, the dean, and the provost. If the complaint involves a grade for an assignment or a course, only the instructor will have the authority to make a change.

A draft policy to this effect has been prepared and is being circulated to those attending the

meeting for further review. Once it has been approved by this group, it will be sent to an appropriate Senate committee for review and recommendation to the full Senate.

- 3. Provost Robert K. Herbert contacted me recently to ask that an appropriate Senate committee be charged to review the existing summer school practices in respect to the number of summer terms offered and the scheduling blocks for these various terms. I requested the Senate Academic Planning Committee to accept this assignment and that committee, chaired by Dr. Till Meyn, has begun its work and should have recommendations for the full Senate later this school year. The Provost asked the Senate to get involved in summer school issues because it seemed to him that we had too many summer school term options and he learned that there are as many as three distinct and contradictory documents purporting to set scheduling blocks for various summer terms.
- 4. The Professional Conduct Committee continues to investigate an allegation of professional misconduct. It appointed a Case Investigation Subcommittee to gather facts about the case and this subcommittee is taking testimony from several individuals this week.
- 5. The Labor-Management Panel continues its work. We have heard from dozens of witnesses, including trustees, administrators, faculty, staff, and the university's labor consultant and we expect to hear from a dozen or so additional witnesses this month and then write and submit our report. Last Friday we took testimony for over four hours and we will meet again this Friday and twice next week. My strong impression is that a consensus has developed within the panel as to the major findings and recommendations that we will include in our report. To refresh your memory, the members of the panel are Provost Herbert as chair, Eugenia Atkinson, a former trustee, John Pogue, a current trustee, Dennis Haines, a labor attorney, Jim Graham, president of UAW Local 1112, Jim Morrison, professor and chair emeritus and former Senate chair, and myself.
- 6. I want to thank you for reelecting me as Senate chair. It has been an honor to serve in this position and I look forward to continuing my service. My service as chair will end with my retirement from YSU at the end of my current contract year August 15, 2005. Upon my retirement, pursuant to Senate Bylaw 5, Section 1, Dr. Chet Cooper, Vice Chair, will take over then as chair. As Vice Chair Chet has been very helpful to the Senate and to me the past few years and he will do an outstanding job. I have applied to participate in the Extended Teaching Service program. About my retirement, I will say to all of you what I said to my department faculty and staff when I advised them of my decision last week. I ask that there be no official or unofficial event on or off campus acknowledging my service or my retirement. I ask for your cooperation on this, please!

This concludes my report. I am happy to answer any questions except ones about my retirement.

Regarding Item 2 in Dr. Shipka's report, Gabriel Palmer-Fernandez noted that an ad hoc committee headed by Joe Mosca had worked for two years to create a policy on student grievances and wondered if the policy required by the compromise to Senate Bill 24 will supercede that. Dr. Palmer-Fernandez also noted that the ad hoc committee left it up to the student to contact the instructor or the chairperson as the first step. Dr. Shipka responded the proposed policy will be given to an appropriate Senate committee when it is completed, and that comments should be provided to that committee.

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Charter & Bylaws Committee: No report.

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<u>Elections & Balloting Committee:</u> Annette Burden Reported. At-large vacancies in the College of Education are now filled. John George now fills the seat of Rick Testa from the College of Engineering. Please start to get the word out for nominations for Senate for next year, both for departmental and at-large seats. The elections process will begin in Spring Semester.

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<u>Undergraduate Curriculum Committee:</u> <u>Attachment 1</u> and <u>Attachment 2</u> contain the courses that have been approved by the committee and have passed the period for objections.

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<u>Academic Planning Committee</u>: <u>Till Meyn</u> reported. The Committee is discussing the inconsistent form of the summer schedule. They want to speak to each Dean individually to find out why the summer terms are scheduled as they are. The Committee would like to try to determine a better scheduling system for summer classes, hopefully by March. One of the main problems is the presence of two overlapping 8-week sessions.

<u>Student Academic Affairs Committee:</u> Richard Baringer reported. He is serving as chair of the committee this year. The committee will have another meeting in late January or February.

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Unfinished Business: None.

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Adjournment: The Academic Senate adjourned at 4:23 p.m..
