Report of Senate Executive Committee to the Academic Senate 5 October 1983

Acting on behalf of the Academic Senate, (Charter, Article IV, Section 2, (c), (3),) and pursuant to the adoption by Senate, at its meeting of 13 July 1983, of the unconditional admission proposal, the Senate Executive Committee established an Ad Hoc Committee on Unconditional Admission Policy "to investigate the possible burdens or disparate effects that may be created because of the institution of this /newly adopted/ policy".

Additionally, the Senate Executive Committee charges the Ad Hoc Committee with the responsibility for developing "a designated list of courses" from which students may draw for purposes of overcoming deficiencies; and, with the responsibility of serving as an advisory body to the Director of Admissions as the newly adopted unconditional admission policy comes to be implemented.

The Ad Hoc Committee on Unconditional Admission Policy shall be composed of:

- (a) a Chairman
- (b) one faculty member from each college/school of the university
- (c) one undergraduate student
- (d) one college/school academic advisor
- (e) the Director of Admissions

Appointments to the Ad Hoc Committee will be made by the Senate Executive Committee for the academic year, 1983-84. Such action by the Executive Committee will be subject to confirmation by the Academic Senate at its meeting of 5 October 1983. In the interim period, appointees will enjoy recess appointment.
