## SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

Chair Jenkins reported.
The Board of Trustees has begun a new search for the presidency with the help of an outside hiring firm, Lamalie Associates, from Cleveland, Ohio. At its regular August meeting, The Board also formed a Search Committee to assist in making its decision. This committee of fifteen will consist of four board members, three community members, the two student trustees, two administrators, one representative from the alumni organization and three faculty. Graduate Council was given the prerogative of recommending anywhere from one to three faculty for one of the positions and the Senate could recommend anywhere from two to five faculty for two positions. Because the president of the board, Dr. John Geletka, requested that these recommendations be made by September 20, the Senate Executive Committee, as empowered by the Charter and Bylaws, met to consider the question of representation. The Committee decided unanimously to forward only two faculty names, the chair and vice-chair of the Senate, William D. Jenkins and Peter A. Baldino, respectively. Although these names have already been forwarded to the Board, I would ask today that the Senate ratify that recommendation with a motion of its own.

## Motion to Ratify Faculty Representatives to Presidential Search Committee

C. Pierce moved to ratify the action taken by the Senate Executive Committee to forward the names of William D. Jenkins and Peter A. Baldino to serve as faculty representatives to the presidential search committee.

The Senate needs to be viewed more than ever as the center of collegial governance in academic matters.

Finally, the Senate at its 5 June 1991 meeting ordered the Senate Executive Committee to establish an ad hoc committee to review the charge of the Computer Services Committee. This Ad Hoc Coordinating Committee shall consist of: David Decker, Richard Gaydos, Edward Largent, Philip Munro, Virginia Phillips, Sidney Roberts, Howard Pullman, and Samuel Skarote.

## NEW BUSINESS

## GLOBAL AWARENESS COMMITTEE REPORT

J. Segreto reported.

This is a Presidential Committee; however, for the first time this year, faculty members were appointed by the Executive Committee of the Academic Senate. The committee has been around for a while. We have 18 faculty members and 5 staff members. During the prior two years, members were appointed by the President. Prior to that, a group of concerned individuals met to plan programs, events, etc.

In the 1990-91 academic year, there were six subcommittees. Our charge is "global."
The Curriculum Subcommittee met with department faculty and chairs and offices on campus. Because of these meetings, the English Composition course now includes a cross cultural component in readings. This fall students can do studies in regional issues. There is now a course in world history. Every quarter, a study surveys departments to ascertain courses that have an international component. We publish a directory that includes people who have international expertise. This year, we will do a second edition of the directory which is also listed on FreeNet.

The Study Abroad Committee is attempting to develop more uniform procedures for students who study abroad and to encourage students to study abroad. There are two advisors for students who study abroad--Melissa Smith and Susan Khawaja. We have put together a brochure so students have a much more systematic understanding of study abroad. Last year we also gave input to the Academic Planning Committee.

The International House was established last year as a Learning Center in Bolton Hall. The Center provides an opportunity for international and domestic students to live together. Because of financial problems of the owner, the Center has moved to campus and is now located on the second floor of the Kilcawley House Dorm.

We have an International Sister University Committee to promote faculty exchange and develop a sister university relationship. "Mahoning Valley in the World" is patterned on what happened in Columbus in Mershon Center affiliated with Ohio State University. It will show how the college is
related to the rest of the world. All kinds of areas will be included. We will publish a series of reports in that regard. Two or three members have applied for a research professorship which was not granted, but we will try again.

Work this year will continue along the same lines. The Committee tries to define our charge in the broadest way possible that includes students, community, etc.

## Presidential Search Committee Question

D. Hovey--Has the Senate Executive Committee had a role in determining the process? I am concerned about recommending a provost before we hire a president.

Chair--We have had no input on who served on the committee. A number of respected faculty leaders have been selected. The Board of Trustees plan to select a president by January or February. The other committee will function to begin the process of looking for a provost. In the spring, the new president will have selection power to determine the individual recommended for the provost position.

The Senate Executive Committee will discuss this issue when we meet.
S. Smith--A list of three unranked candidates is to be submitted by March 1, 1992. The president will review this list and make a recommendation. Individuals serving on the committee include: J. Bakos, Chair, D. Sweetkind, H. Hyre, L. Looby, M. Echols, G. Tribble, B. Karpac, W. Barsch, G. Beelen, B. Fry, N. Small
