Historical Sketch

In 1967, what was then Youngstown University became a member of the state university system. The State of Ohio then mandated that all state universities use a Quarter calendar. At that time, the new YSU converted from a semester system to a quarter system.

Not long after the mandate was instituted it was rescinded. By that time, however, many institutions did not want to go through the conversion process all over again to return to semesters. But in the years since then, a number of universities did decide to convert back to semesters, and even more institutions began discussing whether they should convert.

At YSU the issue was examined by the Academic Senate several times. In the mid-1980's the Senate explored the issue but voted not to convert to semesters. The issue was examined again in 1991, and the Senate again decided not to recommend a conversion.

In 1995, University President Dr. Leslie Cochran addressed the Senate and stated that he felt that the question of conversion to a semester system was not one of whether, but of when. There had been some interest in beginning a conversion at that time, but the Administration recommended that it be postponed because of the press of other business on the University's agenda, including a review of General Education requirements¹.

The transition was proposed because of changes in state-funding procedures, the expense involved in administering a quarter-based institution, the wish to bring YSU into conformity with institutions in the state and in western Pennsylvania, and the desire to improve access. The conversion will also provide students with more time for an indepth study of course material as well as make enrollment more stable².

In the Summer of 1997, Dr. Cochran appointed an *ad hoc* Semester Conversion Work Group to review the important issues that would have to be dealt with during a conversion and to make appropriate recommendations concerning a conversion process. Addressing the University community at his annual opening address on September 15, Dr. Cochran announced that he would ask the Board of Trustees to approve a conversion to a semester system at its December meeting. In the meantime, colleges and departments were asked to examine semester issues specific to their own units and to begin discussions of how the conversion would affect them.

At its meeting on December 15, 1997, the Board of Trustees approved a conversion to a semester system effective with the start of classes in Fall 2000. Shortly afterward, President Cochran appointed a Semester Conversion Transition Team to oversee the conversion process³, aka The Q2S Transition Team. Memberships were drawn from a collection of members from the Academic Senate, Academic Planning Committee of the Senate, Student Government, Department Chairpersons, Academic Advisors and The Semester Conversion Work Group. The duties of the team were comprised of the following⁵:

- Consult appropriately with Academic Senate leadership in establishing procedures and guidelines for the semester conversion process
- Provide information important for the conversion process to departments, colleges and other appropriate campus units
- Work with appropriate Academic Senate committees to facilitate curricular processes
- Organize workshops to the campus focused on curricular, advisement, and other issues related to the conversion
- Provide assistance to academic and administrative units across the campus during the transition period
- Coordinate conversion of university information systems to the new calendar
- Establish subgroups as necessary to facilitate the transition to semesters
- Report regularly to the President on conversion activities
- Report regularly to the campus community on the conversion process

To help keep the campus informed of the process of converting from Quarters to Semesters, the Q2S Transition team prepared a website (http://cc.ysu.edu/q2s/) and had information guides available. The website offered various topics about the conversion from quarters to semesters such as frequently asked questions, advisor handbook, course conversion tables, and advising plans for each College.

Scope and Content Note

The records were collected by the Quarter to Semester (Q2S) Transition Team and were transferred to the YSU Archives and Special Collections by Interim Associate Provost Nate Ritchey. The records were shelved with Academic Senate Records on 3rd floor Tod Hall. The records are divided into 6 series. Series I involves the correspondences with dates 1991, 1995-1997, and some undated. Series II are the minutes of the ad hoc Semester Conversion Work Group during the summer of 1997. Series III contains a series of reports from the Quarter/Semester Committee of the Academic Senate in 1990/1991, the Semester Conversion Work Group in Fall of 1997, and the Q2S Transition Team report undated circa 1998. The printed materials in Series IV contains an information guide, 1999-2000, and a Q2S Plan Ahead handout which contains frequently asked questions about the quarter to semester conversion. Series V includes examples of other colleges in Ohio making the conversion from quarters to semester and their preparations for the conversion. The final series involves a variety of material about the quarter to semester conversion from 1987, and 1994-1998.
