ACADEMIC PLANNING COMMITTEE REPORT TO SENATE

The Academic Planning Committee with the assistance of the Budget and Institutional Studies, is continuing the Strategic Planning Process.

All members of the Y.S.U. Administration, Deans and Executive Directors have been asked to individually respond to the Exposure Draft. Specifically to the following questions:

- 1. How should the planning be carried on?
- What is your view of the proposals regarding the College of Applied Science and Technology as presented in the Exposure Draft?
- 3. How should institutional development be carried on?
- 4. What is your view of marketing of the University?
- 5. The Strategic Plan Proposed a consolidation of information resource? Is this desirable? If so, what should be included and what should be the responsibilities and authority of this unit?
- 6. In the area of academic programs, what new or enhanced programs should be developed? Are there programs that should be phased out?
- 7. About one-third of the new students coming to Y.S.U. are underprepared for college level studies. How should the University organize itself to deal with this problem?
- 8. Are there other significant concerns or topic that were not adequately addressed in the exposure draft that you think should be included in the next draft? If so, please provide details.

The Exposure Draft has been divided into 10 content areas and all responses to the Exposure Draft are being organized into those 10 content areas. Every statement is being placed in one of the 10 content areas so no information is lost or dismissed.

The Academic Planning Committee is holding a "working session" on Friday, February 1st with Dr. Mears and Donna Esterly from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

An opportunity for open discussion with the University Community will be held.
