- I. Our discussions focused on two major areas of concern.
  - A. Allotment of re-assigned time and its relationship to the grants process.
  - B. Establishment of Research Centers, or Centers for Excellence, on campus.
- II. Discussion on re-assigned time.
  - A. Who makes decisions concerning re-assignments.
    - 1. Dependent on source of funding and how those monies can be used.
    - 2. Questions about role of deans and department chairs.
  - B. Nature of process for application.
    - 1. Pre-application procedures.
    - 2. Role of Eric Lewandowski and Office of Sponsored Programs.
    - 3. Meeting of all involved parties during application process.
    - 4. Use of Dean's re-assigned time.
  - C. Need to accommodate needs of individual colleges.
- III. Discussion of development of Research Centers on campus seeded by University Research Funds.
  - A. Need and Purpose.
    - 1. To develop expertise in specific fields on campus and to provide resources for those in the larger community.
    - 2. Currently a void in this area on campus.
    - 3. To foster research and encourage program development.
  - B. Source of funding (seed monies) is University Research Committee.
    - 1. Two pools of money exist.
      - a. University Research fund.
      - b. Research Assistant fund.
    - 2. Propose to use 1/2 to 1/3 of funds for larger block grants.
  - C. Delegation of funds.
    - 1. Earned in "on-campus" competition.
    - 2. 3 to 5 year allotments to provide critical mass for start up.
    - 3. Feasibility based on center's potential to become self-funding.
  - D. Set Up.
    - 1. Can be departmental or transdisciplinary.
    - 2. Pre-proposal 3-5 pages.
    - 3. Final review by external committee.
    - 4. Chairs to handle administration rather than "productive" faculty member.
    - 5. Training for chairs in administration to be available.
    - 6. Acronym suggested P(residental) A(cademic) C(enter) for E(xcellence) and R(esearch).
  - E. Fits with Y.S.U.'s current agenda.
    - 1. Has commitment of university administration.
    - 2. Compatible with state's agenda to foster economic development and technology.
