



MEMO TO THE ACADEMIC STANDARDS COMMITTEE:

SUGGESTIONS CONCERNING SUMMER SESSION SCHEDULE FOR DISCUSSION

1. The summer session of 10 weeks is set up in such a way as to be equivalent of a summer session of 12 weeks.
2. Eight semester hours in the summer session is equivalent in work load to 12 semester hours in a semester.
3. Ten semester hours in a summer session is equivalent in work load to 15 semester hours in a semester.
4. The normal work load during the summer session is from 8 to 10 $\frac{2}{3}$ semester hours.
5. Twelve semester hours in the summer session is equivalent to 18 semester hours in a semester.
6. Freshman, sophomore, and junior students will not be permitted to carry more than 12 semester hours in a summer session except by action of the Academic Standards Committee in committee meeting assembled.
7. Seniors who plan to be graduated in August may be permitted to carry up to 15 semester hours in a summer session.

8. The action of the Academic Standards Committee relative to these matters will be effective as of August 21, 1948, and will not be retroactive.
