At the October 6, 1978 Senate meeting the following motions were passed:

-The Academic Senate will <u>reconsider</u> the June 2, 1978 action to accept, as amended, the Labor Studies Program.

and

-The reconsidered action of June 2, 1978, to accept the Labor Studies Program, as amended, will be returned to the Academic Affairs Committee.

The Executive Committee hopes that this matter receives high priority consideration from your committee and that the matter can be returned to the floor of the Senate as quickly as possible.

In communicating with President Coffelt, we were told that delay in implementing this new program could result in its not being approved by the Board of Regents as a permanent Y.S.U. program.

The Senate Executive Committee would appreciate the opportunity to discuss the deliberations of the Academic Affairs Committee prior to reconsideration on the Senate floor.
