SUBJECT: Absence Penalty - Catalogue Survey of Twenty-Three Colleges and Universities.

1. Twelve apparently make no statement: Ohio State, John Carroll, Case, Ohio, Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan (Sophmores to Seniors with high record not required to attend), Denison, Dayton, Heidelberg, Bluffton, Antioch, Otterbein.
2. Two give the instructor permission to drop or exclude the student who has an excessive number of absences: Akron, Mt. Union.
3. Three - instructor and administrative persons (dean, et. al.) cooperate in determining individual penalty: Hiram, Bowling Green, Findlay.
4. Three give definite credit reduction: Capital, O. Northern, Baldwin-Wallace:

Capital: Must explain 3 unexcused absences to Dean.

10 unexcused absences, 1 hr. lost.

1 tardiness, $\frac{1}{2}$ absences.

O. Northern: Each unexcused absence, loss $\frac{1}{2}$ point.

B.-Wallace: Unexcused absence, 1 hr. reduction for 2 absences.

5. Three use other methods: Ashland, Grove City (Pa.), Bethany (Kas.):

Ashland: Special exam. required - fee \$1.00.

Grove City: Loss of cut allowance for following semester.

Bethany: Student dropped; must reregister - fee, \$1.00.
