I thank you for taking time from your schedule to meet with representatives of the Williamson College of Business to discuss the lab science issue in the proposed new WCBA core program requirements.

With unanimous support of the faculty and administration of the WCBA, the requirement that business students take a lab science as a part of the undergraduate education has been deleted from the proposed program. Instead, a request was made that an editorial change be made to the proposed program -- that the wording concerning lab sciences be changed from being "required" to being "recommended." In other words, the request was made that the status of the lab science in the proposed WCBA core program be returned to that which exisited under the previous core program.
