BUSINESS SCHOOL DIPLOMAS - ONE YEAR COURSE

Mr. Mang, Chairman of the Building Committee, reported that Myron W. Goodwin had been retained as architect in connection with remodeling of Rayen School Building to be used by the William Rayen Technical Institute of Youngstown College; that plans and specifications would be completed soon and the committee would be ready to accept bids in about two weeks; also that an agreement had been had with the Board of Education on the use of the drive and the use of the corridor connecting the two buildings on the premises.

Mr. Goodwin then explained the plans in general; stated that the unofficial approval of representatives of the War Production Board had been obtained and that official approval was expected; that the general drawings had been completed and would be in the hands of the contractors within a week; that bids would be received on sixteen different alternates and that the ultimate cost would depend upon the materials used and that he would attempt to hold the cost to a figure between \$70,000.00 and \$80,000.00. The time of completion of the work would depend upon the availability of materials.

It was pointed out that the building would be fully used when completed and Dr. Jones stated that eventually another wing may be necessary. It was suggested that such wing would be necessary if plans for conducting a research laboratory were developed.
