#### IV. Purchase of Property at 416 Wick Avenue

The Y.M.C.A. has purchased the property located at 416 Wick Avenue for \$40,000., and they have allocated \$10,000. for repairs and alterations and \$4,000. for four new chemistry tables. The chemistry tables are to be located in the main building. According to our present plans, the secretarial school will be housed in the newly purchased building.

#### V. Criticism of Law School

Dean Arant of the Ohio State University Law School recently inspected our Law College for the League of Ohio Law Schools Association. Dean Arant is somewhat critical of evening law colleges, and he criticized our school severely. His comments dealt primarily with our lack of library facilities, inadequacy of catalog statements, need for review of courses of study, high grading of faculty, and necessity for more comprehensive examinations. Our college is not on probation, but Dean Arant's report recommended that we be warned by the League. All evening law schools which are members of the League were also warned concerning violations of certain standards of the Association.

We are having a law school faculty meeting this evening to discuss methods for improving instruction and examination. The library has already been checked over by an expert whose recommendations we are following. Mr. J. C. Argetsinger has contacted Professor Wilson of Cornell Law School, who likewise has made several criticisms of our law school. We expect to be able to correct the major deficiencies pointed out by these two men. However, there are certain weaknesses which they called to our attention which are characteristic of night law schools and which cannot be changed. I refer specifically to lack of full time instructors, salary scale, and improper housing of law school.

#### VI. Inaugural Exercises

Youngstown College has been represented at the inaugurations of the new presidents of Mount Union College, Kent State University, and Dayton University this fall. Invitations from colleges located at considerable distances from Youngstown have been received, but no representatives have been sent.

#### VII. Publicity

The Youngstown Vindicator has given valuable assistance to Youngstown College in publicizing our football games. It is therefore recommended that a resolution be passed by the Board of Governors of Youngstown College commending their efforts.
