


It was a great pleasure to learn that you will assist in the selection of candidates for Fulbright and foreign-sponsored awards for 2004-2005.





Have you retired yet? I plan to, in 2 or 3 years. I could go next spring, but for complicated reasons, my pension will be much larger in 2006 than if I go in 2004.

Dear Colleague,

Thank you for your kind letters as well as the reprints of your excellent articles. It is remarkable that somebody as young as you are, has already produced such quantity of scholarly material. I read your work with interest and congratulate you on your accomplishments. It gave me extra pleasure to see so many familiar names in your footnotes, scholars I know by reputation or have met in person.

It is most unfortunate that we were unable to meet last year at Notre Dame. Unfortunately I was in South Bend only for a few hours and had to return home to take care of my sick mother, who has since died. I do hope to meet you someday, either here or in Hungary.

In your last letter you asked for advise on the possibility of a post doctoral fellowship in the United States.

As your probably know, academic institutions in this country, both private as well as state supported, are in considerable economic difficulty. The endowments of institutions such as Princeton or Harvard have lost about $\frac{1}{4}$ of their value as result of the stock market decline. State supported universities such as Michigan, UCLA, Indiana, etc... have had major cutbacks in the funds that state legislatures have provided. The result of all of these factors have had a devastating impact on graduate and post-graduate education.

Post Doctoral fellowships in our discipline were very rare even in the best of times. Their availability now is even more infrequent. I really wish I could be more optimistic but that would be unfair to you.

I would suggest that you contact some of the major research universities directly and inquire about the availability of a fellowship. A letter in to the following might be useful: Princeton, Univ. of Pennsylvania, Johns Hopkins, Univ. of Chicago, U. of Michigan, Indiana U. (Bloomington), U. of Texas (Austin), UCLA, U. Calif. Berkley, Univ. of Washington. Try, you have nothing to loose!

Best of luck on defending your dissertation and receiving your PhD for CEU. Give my warmest greetings to Prof. Bak.

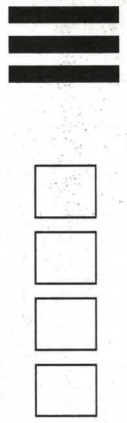
