Three deans launch F&PA scholarship

One current and two former deans of Youngstown State University's College of Fine and Performing Arts have teamed up to start a new scholarship fund to support students in the college.

The Reaching for Tomorrow's Stars scholarship is the first-ever scholarship campaign for the F&PA College at YSU, which houses the Dana School of Music and the departments of Art, Communication and Theater/Dance.

Bryan DePoy, F&PA dean, and two former deans of the college – Joe Edwards and George McCloud – have together pledged \$10,000 to initiate the scholarship campaign. The initial fundraising goal of the campaign is \$100,000 to establish an

endowment that will provide scholarship funding in perpetuity.

"As deans, we have experienced the immense joy of shaking the hands of numerous graduates during commencement ceremonies," said DePoy, who became dean in 2009. "We know that many of those students would not have completed their college careers without financial assistance of some kind. Too, our goal with this scholarship is to ensure that we

have a diverse array of scholarship opportunities to attract the very best students into our distinguished academic programs."

McCloud, F&PA dean from 1997 to 2005, said student scholarships remain critical to attracting and retaining students in the college. "That is why this scholarship fund is so important," he said. "It will allow students to pursue and reach their professional goals and personal dreams."

"The F&PA College strives to be a distinguished, nationally-recognized center for education in the fine and performing arts," said Edwards, who served as F&PA dean from 2005 to 2009. "This scholarship extends the extraordinary tradition of excellence for the future."

The dollar amount and number of scholarships will be determined by the amount of money raised for the endowment. The scholarship is for undergraduate or graduate students pursuing any degree in the College of F&PA and is renewable based on academic standing and by meeting benchmarks indicating progress toward a degree. "This is not a typical scholarship," DePoy said. "Students receiving the scholarship must achieve success benchmarks by successfully progressing through their degrees in steady fashion. Graduate students are also

eligible for the scholarship, which is somewhat unusual."

Paramount exhibit runs through Feb. 3 at McDonough

Visit the Liberty-Paramount Theater as it was in its heyday with photos, memorabilia, moving pictures and storytelling at the Paramount Project Exhibition that runs through Feb. 3 at the McDonough Museum of Art on the campus of Youngstown State University.

Designed by the architect C. Howard Crane and originally titled The Liberty Theater, the facility in downtown Youngstown opened in 1918 as a 1700-seat theater, featuring silent movies and America's finest vaudeville stars. Despite modernization efforts, the renamed Paramount Theater was not able to survive the effects of deindustrialization and suburbanization and has lay dormant and in decay since 1976.

The Paramount Project Exhibition is part of The Paramount Project, a current effort aimed at restoration of the terracotta façade of the building. The remainder of the building is no longer viable for restoration and will be

demolished to make way for an open gathering space. The McDonough exhibit includes a simulation of the vision for the gathering space.

In addition, the exhibit features the Paramount Oral History Project, videos of individuals' memories of the theater. It also features the YSU Students Motivated by the Arts' K-16 educational gallery. The SMARTS Stars of the Paramount Parade Tour was created by Becky Keck, Leslie Cusano, Heather Seno, Joyce Mistovich and features original work by renowned

pop artist Chris Yambar.
