September 1, 2010

<u>Call to Order:</u> Senate Chairperson Chet Cooper called the meeting to order at 4:05 p.m.

<u>Nominations for Senate Chairperson:</u> The floor was opened for nominations. Chet Cooper and David Porter were nominated. With no other nominations from the floor, nominations were closed.

<u>Selection of Secretary and Parliamentarian:</u> Bob Hogue was appointed as Secretary, and David Porter was appointed as Parliamentarian.

Welcoming Remarks from President Anderson:

I can't imagine that you want to hear another speech, so I will just some brief updates. Thank you so much for what you've done for us and what you will be doing for us in the future. This year has had a perfect start. Our enrollment stands at 15,276 as of this morning. Previously, some students had been registered without even applying first. That practice has ended. We moved up some deadlines and adhered to them. This is meant for student success and is not to be punitive in any way. Because of this, enrollment is less likely to plummet early in the semester as it sometimes has in the past. For the first time, we were actually calling students to ask if they could hold off moving in because our housing was so full.

I watched our marching band yesterday, and they are enthusiastic. I also attended a Student Government meeting, and everything went very well.

Our Freshman Convocation was successful, as was our Summer Commencement. Reid Schmutz is very student-focused person, and I was so glad to see him receive the honorary degree at Commencement.

I was out on campus welcoming our students on August 23, and they were excited to be back.

We have had a great two months. The Cafaro family donate \$2 million to the WATTS center; we just celebrated the opening of the new building for the Williamson College of Business Administration; we received the Regents' approval of Ph.D. in Materials Science and Engineering.; Governor Strickland was here today and designated Youngstown as a Hub of opportunity. We will be tallying the achievements of our students and alumni.

We have set up a Strategic Planning Committee. It is not the intent for the output of this process to be sitting on a shelf. It is meant to be a roadmap for our future. We are in the process of setting up an Economic Development Office to coordinate the many efforts underway. We are assessing the internal needs of the campus, including repairs and renovations. I have asked Jack Fahey to put together the effort to form a Student Enrollment Center, most likely in Jones Hall where it was at one time. This will then allow for a tremendous expansion of the programs within our CSIS department, and we look forward to that, since that is absolutely the wave of the future.

Thank you again for all of your work.

Report on Strategic Planning:

Vice President for Finance and Administration Gene Grilli reported: As Dr. Anderson mentioned, we are working to set up a blueprint for 2020. The group began with 41 people. We are looking at the vision and mission of the University, and we are setting up timelines. We want this to be a transparent process.

We will also establish indicators for our vision and mission, including priorities and metrics. We will be looking at financial resources and an improved method for dealing with budget matters.

Provost Khawaja: Thank you, and welcome to all of your. One of our challenges are to meet a tight timeline but also make this as transparent and participatory as possible. There will be focus groups by college and an interactive presence on the web. Please take advantage of the forums for providing your input and ideas. We will be trying to post periodic reports on the website as the groups continue their work.

Bege Bowers: We do have the focus group information already posted on <u>http://web.ysu.edu/2020strategicplan</u>. There is a list of questions already there. You can fill out your responses on the website, and they will be consolidated and coordinated during the planning process.

reported:

I will combine the report of the Senate Executive Committee with the Chairs report today. I will be brief.

The Academic Senate's Executive Committee met last week and discussed several items of business.

Following a review of the Senate's budget for the 2010-2011 academic year, the committee approved the assignment of individuals to various Senate committees. A list of those committee memberships has been posted to the Academic Senate web site. As per the Senate's charter, the first person listed alphabetically in each committee shall call the first meeting of the particular committee. I will contact those individuals by email in the near future to apprise them of this duty. The Executive Committee would appreciate each committee having their initial meeting by the end of September and reporting back to Secretary Hogue or myself. I will also be contacting a number of committees once they have met to present action items for consideration.

During the past academic year, a number of actions were taken by the Senate and recorded in the minutes that were duly posted on the Senate's web page. However, for whatever reason, a number of these actions, which have some impact on the academic community, were not efficiently or effectively communicated to individuals needing this information. Hence, in an effort to rapidly provide critical information to the YSU community, Bob Hogue and I will formulate a mechanism to widely distribute a concise summary of significant Senate actions. In addition, we will post to the Senate web page short bulleted summaries of each meeting. If you have other suggestions, please do communicate them to either Bob or myself.

Finally, no significant business is anticipated to transpire before the next scheduled meeting of the Senate. Pending any crucial reason to meet, the Executive Committee has agreed to not have the Senate meet in October. Therefore, the next meeting of the Academic Senate will be on November 3rd at 4:00 PM in this room.

<u>Academic Programs Committee:</u> Jim Schramer reported. A proposal for the Dance Management program is circulating now. Please provide any responses within the 10-day period for review.
